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

Remarkable Recent Discovery — Early Issue of Ukrainian/Russian/Polish/Hungarian/Moldovan Interest

In the late 9th-early 10 Century, the Varangian prince Oleg of Kyiv, supreme ruler of Rus', extended his sway over the territory known as Ponozie, 'the lowlands'. Ponozie would later become part of the Rus' principalities of Volhynia, Kyiv and Galicia, then fell under the rule of the Mongols. In 1362/3, Prince Algirdas (Olgerd) of the Grand Duchy of Lithuania launched a campaign into Tatar lands which were still in turmoil following the death of Berdi Beg a few years earlier. He defeated the three Golden Horde begs of Podolia at the Battle of Blue Waters (Sinie Vody) at the site of present-day Torhovytsia, then known as Yabgu. With his decisive victory, Algirdas annexed Podolia into his own territories.

In 1366, the Gediminid George Koriatovich (known also as Jurg Korjat and Jerzy Koriatowicz) and his brother Alexander assumed rule over Podolia as vassals of Poland. The Koriatovichs had cooperated closely with King Casimir III, who had occupied parts of Galicia-Volhynia during his succession conflict with Lithuania, against their kinsmen. In 1374, George Koriatovich was made Voivode of Moldava, but his Vlach subjects murdered him in either 1375 or 1377. The other Koriatovich brothers kept control of Podolia, which became a fiefdom of Hungary after King Louis' raid on the Ruthenian lands in 1377. After Louis' death, the Koriatovich brothers actively participated in the election of Jogaila (Wladyslaw II Jagiello) to the Polish throne. Podolia, though, stayed as a Hungarian fiefdom.

Following Podolia's conquest by Vytautus the Great in 1394, part of Podolia was given by King Jogaila to the Voivode of Krakow, Spytko II of Melsztyn as a fief. After Spytko died heroically in 1399 fighting the Tatars at the Battle of Vorskla River, his Podolian fiefdom was given to Vytautus' brother Skirgaila. In 1403, the Koriatovich brothers surrendered all claims to Podolia, and following the death of Vytautus in 1430, Podolia was incorporated into the Podolian Voivodeship of the Polish Crown.

Son of Tsar Peter and his first wife Eudoxia Lopukhina, Grand Duke Alexei Petrovich was bought up by his mother who was disdainful of Peter. Because of the animosity between his parents (who divorced in 1698), Alexei came to feel little affection for his father and grew to despise him, repeatedly thwarting his father's plans to raise him as a successor to the throne. Alexei married Charlotte Christine of Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel, who was connected by marriage to many of the greatest families in Europe, in Torgau, in October 1711. As part of the marriage contract any forthcoming children would be raised in the Orthodox faith, but Charlotte was allowed to keep her Protestant faith — an agreement opposed by Alexei's followers.

The first six months of marriage were happy, but spiraled downward in the next six months. Alexei was frequently drunk, pronounced his wife "too-thin" and "pockmarked", ignored her in public and insisted on separate apartments. Nonetheless, the couple had two children, Natalia, born July 21, 1714 and Peter, born October 23, 1715 (the future Peter II). Charlotte died giving birth to Peter. On the day of her funeral, Tsar Peter sent Alexei a stern missive, threatening to cut him off if he did not take an interest in affairs of the state. Alexei replied by offering to renounce his succession in favor of his infant son Peter. Tsar Peter agreed to this but on condition that Alexei remove himself as a dynastic threat and become a monk. In August, 1716, Peter requested Alexei join him and his army if he wanted to remain tsarevich. Rather than give in to his father's demands, Alexei fled to Vienna, placing himself under the protection of his brother-in-law, Emperor Charles VI, who ensconced Alexei first in a Tyrolean fort and then Castello Sant'Elmo in Naples. The Tsar was insulted, considering the flight of the tsarevich to a foreign power as a reproach and a scandal. He believed it imperative that Alexei return.

Alexei would only consent to return if his father solemnly swore to not punish him in any way, to cherish him as a son and to allow him to live quietly on his estates with his Finnish mistress Afrosinia. On the 31st of January 1718, Alexei reached Moscow. But concerned about reactionaries and in a bout of paranoia and hatred, Peter embarked on an inquisition and campaign of terror against Alexei and anyone connected to him. A 'confession' regarding his flight to Vienna was extorted from Alexei which implicated most of his friends. Alexei's mother, the ex-Tsarina Eudoxia was dragged from her monastery and publically tried for alleged adultery. Any who had befriended Alexei where impaled or broken on the wheel while being savagely tortured. Alexei's servants were beheaded or had their tongues cut out. On June 19, 1718, a weak and ailing Alexei received 25 strokes of the knout, then another 15 a few days later. On June 24, through more coerced and extorted 'confessions', Alexei was found guilty of treason by the Senate and court magistrates and sentenced to death. Alexei died two days later in the Fortress of Peter and Paul in St. Petersburg.

A Collection of Russian Coinage for East Prussia

Involving all of Europe's powers at the time and fought on a global stage, the Seven Years War (1756-1763) was arguably the first world war. Friedrich the Great's emergent Prussia, with one of Europe's best armies, and Great Britain, with Europe's largest navy, joined with a coalition of smaller German states to battle an alliance of France, Austria, Russia, Sweden and Saxony. On the eastern front, the Russian army under Field Marshal Stepan Feodorovich Apraxin defeated the Prussians on August 30, 1757 at Gross-Jagersdorf. The gates of East Prussia were wide open, but Apraxin inexplicably did not take advantage of his victory and went into winter quarters. An irate Elizabeth Petrovna transferred command of her military forces to General Villim Fermor. On January 16, 1758, Fermor with a Russian army of some 30,000 troops marched from Memel into East Prussia and the area was quickly occupied and annexed. At the outset of the occupation, the Russian army found itself suffering great financial losses. Coins of a number of German States were circulating in East Prussia, and these coins were quite often of low-grade silver with varying weights. To compound the situation, counterfeit coins flooded the marketplace. Thus the Russian army found itself taking in debased coinage and paying out in good silver.

To alleviate the situation, a special Russian coinage utilizing the Taler system was approved for East Prussia. Designs for this new coinage were created by A.T. Bolotov and dies cut by Wolf, the engraver at the Königsberg mint. Production was done both at the mints of Königsberg and Moscow and coins were produced from 1759 to 1762. For the last year, only 6 Groschen from the Krasny mint are known (Krasny mint records show the striking of 64,000 one-third Taler pieces, but no examples are known). Despite a mintage of 120,000 pieces, these 6 Groschen are very rare, a rarity explained by the year's events. With the death of the childless Empress Elizabeth, her chosen heir and nephew Peter of Holstein-Gottorp gained the throne. In context to the Seven Years War, Elizabeth's death is often called the "Miracle of the House of Brandenburg." A great admirer of Prussia's King Friedrich II, Peter withdrew Russia from its wartime alliance, returned to Prussia the territories previously annexed and ceased production of the special Russian coinage for East Prussia. Agents for King Friedrich II were sent to systematically search out and buy up all the offensive Russo-Prussian coinage wherever it could be found. Not surprisingly, the agents were also instructed to seek out and purchase any medal for the Russian victory over the Prussians at the Battle of Kunersdorf (Friedrich's most devastating defeat).



Medals of Alexander III



One of Russia's first historical societies, the Imperial Odessa Society of History and Antiquities was founded March 25, 1839. Greatly instrumental in its creation was Mikhail Semyonovich Vorontsov, Governor of New Russia and Bessarabia. A fervent enthusiast of history, science and technology, Prince Vorontsov also had the authority to make his interests realities. In 1825, he helped open Odessa's Archaeology Museum, which would house important discoveries of Greek artifacts unearthed in the 1827-1829 dig by noted French-born archaeologist-geographer Jean Moret de Blaremberg – an expedition which was personally supported by Vorontsov. While in 1830, he opened Odessa's first public library.

Among the organizers of the Society were the Warden of the Odessa Educational District Dmitry Maksimovich Knyazhevich, Prince Aleksandr Skarlatovich Sturdza, Andrey Yakovlevich Fabr, Mikhail Mikhaylovich Kir'yakov, and Professor of the Richelieu Lyceum Nikolay Nikiforovich Murzakevich. On November 14, 1839, by decree of Emperor Nicholas I, Grand Prince and heir Alexander Nikolayevich was made August Patron of the Society, and the Society was given an annual allotment of 5,000 Roubles in paper money from the State Treasury for its needs.

Over the years, the Society's journal "Transactions" became a prominent and well-respected source of scientific and scholarly information, while the Society's membership was a Who's Who of eminent scholars and noted numismatists and archaeologists.

ORDER OF ST. ANDREW FIRST CALLED



1601 Presentation Snuff Box to Count Alexander Ivanovich Ostermann-Tolstoy in honor of his being awarded the Order of St. Andrew, July 3 1835. Silver, light gilt. 58.7 mm around. 67.1 gm. Dated July 3, 1835. (In 1835, there were only four recipients of the Order of St. Andrew, only Ostermann-Tolstoy received his on July 3.) The lid decorated with a high-relief, laureate, draped and cuirassed bust of Peter the Great r., a crown, with furled ribbons, above his head, spray below. Around the box is the garlanded Motto of the Order of St. Andrew along with a depiction of the Order, the date in high-relief on a branch interwoven with ribbons below. Hallmarked on the bottom: "84", "M.K/1835", "JC" (ligate). An *Extremely rare* and important presentation box of fine workmanship.

Condition: Minor contact marks on bottom, otherwise well-preserved and Choice \$25,000

В 1806 году произведён в генераллейтенанты. 27 января (8 февраля) 1807 года участвовал в сражении при Прейсиш-Эйлау. Командуя 2-ой дивизией и всем левым флангом русской армии, он сумел сдержать удар на его позиции корпуса Даву и стал по сути спасителем всей армии. Вернулся в строй с началом Отечественной войны 1812 года.



Во время войны он командовал 4-м пехотным корпусом в 1-й Западной армии Барклая-де-Толли, отличился под Островно и при Бородино. В Бородинском сражении Остерман-Толстой участвовал в боях на батарее Раевского, был контужен, но через несколько дней вернулся в строй.

В кампанию 1813 года Остерман-Толстой прославил свое имя 17 августа в блестящем бою под Кульмом, где потерял левую руку, оторванную ядром. Король Пруссии наградил Остермана Большим прусским Железным крестом, наградой, которая за всю свою историю вручалась только семь раз. Остерман вернулся в Петербург в начале 1814 года и сразу же был назначен генерал-адъютантом Александра И. В этом качестве находился до самой смерти императора. В 1816 году назначен командиром Гренадерского корпуса. В августе 1817 года получает чин генерала-от-инфантерии.

3 Июля 1835 года Высочайше пожалован Орденом Святого апостола Андрея Первозванного.





Received his first award – the order of Red Banner of RSFSR #3552, decree of January 20, 1920 - from legendary commander of the no less legendary 1st Cavalry army S.M. Budenny in person.

Received his second award – the order of Lenin #3301 – by decree of August 16, 1936, in the same decree and together with such prominent military figures as Zhukov, Rokossovsky, Romanovsky, Podlas, Kreizer, Lizukov, etc.

As a deputy commander of 5th Mechanized Corps, took active part in 1939 West Ukraine campaign, as well as in the 1940 campaigns for joining ex. Baltic states into the USSR.

Major-General in 1940. By the beginning of war with Nazi Germany, commander of 18th Tank Division, 7th Mechanized Corps, Moscow Military District.

Distinguished himself in famous Smolensk, Orsha, Mozhaisk, Klin, Volokolamsk, Lama river, and Gzhatsk battles. By 1944, was serving in a position of commander of all armed and mechanized troops of 2nd Baltic front. During Leningrad-Novgorod, Baltic, Moravia-Ostrov and Prague offensives, positioned as deputy commander of armed and mechanized troops of 4th Ukrainian front.

After the war, served as a commander of armed and mechanized troops of Carpathian Military District, following a position of a commander of armed and mechanized troops of South-Ural Military District. Retired in 1947. Died in 1974

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
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1. APPLICATION AND CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP

1.1. By making a bid, a Bidder acknowledges his acceptance of these Conditions and will be bound by them.

1.2. Ira & Larry Goldberg Coins & Collectibles Inc. ("Auctioneer"), Dmitry Markov Coins & Medals, M&M Numismatics Ltd., and Sovereign Rarities Ltd. act as Auction Agent for the Seller for the sale of a Lot to the Buyer unless any of these entities is in fact the owner of the Lot. As such, Auction Agent is not responsible for any default by the Seller or the Buyer.

1.3. The contract for the sale of a Lot is between the Seller and the Buyer and is subject to these Conditions and the Seller's Conditions.

2. PRE-SALE AND DESCRIPTIONS

2.1. 4. AUCTION SALE

4.1. This sale is a public auction sale conducted by licensed and bonded auctioneers.

4.2. Before the Auction, all potential Bidders must notify their name and address to the Auctioneer and, if required, provide proof of identity to our satisfaction and bank or other credit references. Bidders unknown to Auctioneer are requested to establish credit or deposit 25% of their bids before the sale. We cannot accept bids from minors.
