A large complex Temple was built for Augustus. Descendants of Augustus in different times have helped or built various buildings. One of them is Caracalla. Caracalla has ordered that the citizens of the city should have a Roman Bath. In those days, reasonably Roman "colonialists" lived in Ankyra. One of the rich citizens Tiberius lulius lustinianus has invested money at the Emperor's request. Roman baths have been built for Asklepio's "god of medicine". Possibly this coin is struct after one of the Caracallas victory in the war. Caracalla is one of the first severans person where he can be seen in coins as a fighter. It was, in fact, a way of propaganda and message to Roman citizens. When Caracalla left Roma 213 he never returned. He was very inspired by Alexander the Great. In Troy, he ran around Achilles' tomb quite like Alexander the Great. He rode on the horse until he died during the war.
