





Artemis, with a reverse depicting her brother Apollo standing atop a meander pattern. These coins carried the names of a series of magistrates (or, as suggested by Nicholas F. Jones, wealthy civic patrons who financed the coinage), including probably the same Euphemus and Pausanius named on this gold stater, allowing us to date this remarkable piece to the same era as the stephanophoric tetradrachms, circa 155-145 BC. While Artemis graces the obverse, the reverse depiction of Nike driving a biga is otherwise unknown on any coinage of Magnesia and suggests that the issuance of our stater was in honor of a military victory of some kind, or perhaps the anniversary of a great victory. Since Magnesia was not itself a military powerhouse, the occasion must remain an open question, although the 40th anniversary of the Battle of Magnesia, which fell in December 150 BC, is a possibility. 

Any relationship between the Phokas and Botaneiates families has not yet been traced. Cedrenus names "Romanus Sclerus, Burtza, Botaneiates, Basilii Argyrii filii" among the supporters of Isaakios Komnenos, in 1057. Skylitzes records that "magister Basilius Apocapes et magister Nicephorus Botaniates" campaigned against the Pechenegs in Bulgaria and were captured, dated to [1059/60]. He was military commander in the Danube area in 1064. Governor of Antioch in 1065. Although he enjoyed good relations with Romanos Diogenes, on the latter's accession as Emperor Romanos IV the relationship cooled. After Emperor Michael VII succeeded in 1071, Nikeforos Botaneiates returned to favour and was appointed kouropalates and strategos of the theme of Anatolikon. He rebelled against Emperor Michael VII, was acclaimed emperor 7 Jan 1078, gained the support of Suleiman Seljuk Sultan, and marched on Constantinople where a revolt broke out in his support against the unpopular government of the emperor. He entered Constantinople 24 Mar 1078, and was crowned Emperor NIKEPHOROS III the same day by the Patriarch. He married the wife of his predecessor, who had retired to a monastery, to gain legitimacy. He was faced by the rebellion of Nikeforos Bryennios, governor of Durazzo, and of Basilacius in Thessaly. The Turkish garrison of Nikaia also rose in revolt. He was excommunicated by Pope Gregory, and Robert "Guiscard" Duke of Apulia landed at Avlona and marched towards Durazzo. This was followed by the revolt of Nikeforos Melissenos, whose alliance with Sultan Suleiman enabled the latter to capture Bythinia and establish himself as Sultan at Nikaia. 

The etymology of his name is still unclear: it may go back to the Egyptian words 'abrak' and 'sax', translating as 'the honorable and hallowed word', but it is noteworthy that the letters of his name, in Greek isopsephy, add up to 365, the amount of days in a solar year: A = 1, B = 2, P = 100, A = 1, Σ = 200, A = 1, Ξ = 60, thus: 1+2+100+1+200+1+60 = 365. Basilides' followers believed, among other things, that Abrasax sent Christ as a ghost to the world, which lead to sharp refutations by Early Church Fathers such as Hippolytus of Rome, Clement of Alexandria and Eusebius of Caesarea. The popularity of Basilidianism was mostly restrained to Egypt, where a vivid Gnostic sect is attested in the 2nd-4th centuries, but its legacy still lives on today, as one compelling theory proclaims, in the famous magic word 'abracadabra!'. 





914 Ancient Rome Bronze Statue of Hermaphroditus, AD 1-200 Hermaphroditus is largely remembered as a tragic figure in European culture. This ancient Greek deity is best known from the Roman poet Ovid's work, Metamorphoses, as the handsome male protagonist of a story with a female water nymph called Salmacis. Hermaphroditus was the child of Hermes, the messenger of the gods, and Aphrodite, the goddess of beauty, sexuality and love, and was also considered a god of love and fertility in ancient Greece. This deity holds an important place in our history as the origin of the word hermaphrodite, though we now consider this an archaic, inaccurate term, suitable for botany and zoology, but no longer acceptable to describe intersex people. The quantity of sculptures found in Roman and Greek art, like this example in the Ashmolean, shows that there was a great deal of Classical interest in Hermaphroditus too. However, a change in the social status and sex of this deity over time can be seen in the many examples of Classical, Hellenistic and Roman art. I believe that Greco-Roman myths, like that of Hermaphroditus, have led to a misunderstanding of the biology of intersex people and contributed to discrimination lasting even to the present day. Ovid tells us that when Salmacis fell in love with Hermaphroditus, she begged the gods to join them together and subsequently he became both male and female whilst bathing in her pool. Hermaphroditus and his female form, Hermaphrodite, were therefore depicted in ancient Greek and Roman sculptures with both breasts and a penis [1]. These intersex characteristics were revered as divine in some ancient Greek territories and portrayed in what are known as Anasyromenos statues (meaning the gesture of lifting up the skirt or kilt), with the figures exposing their genitalia. For the ancient Greeks, these depictions were considered apotropaic (good for scaring away evil influences) and good luck symbols. In some places, like Cyprus, Hermaphroditus was also worshipped in another form called Aphroditus [2], an androgynous version of Aphrodite, a goddess with a female body as well as a penis. Aphroditus' cult was linked to the moon, and one of union and marriage. Intersex deities, like Hermaphroditus and the goddesses Agdistis and Cybele, were imported from ancient Greece into the Roman Empire at a time of desperation during the Second Punic War (218-201 BC) [3]. They were popular after Rome's victory, with Cybele becoming absorbed into the Romans' Magna Mater ('Great Mother') goddess, for example. She was portrayed wearing a mural crown representing the city and as the Protectoress of Rome with Hermaphroditus alongside her. However, despite this, Rome gradually began to question the Greek culture that inspired it so much, and even to consider Greek culture and men effeminate. The writer Varro (Sat 311) described them as "long haired, smooth chinned gown trailers". The androgyny of Hermaphroditus and intersex people was then identified as a foreign disorder [4]. Intersexuality was seen as a danger that could infect Roman babies and men with the disease of femininity, and androgyny was used as a visual symbol of their enemies to the East. Rome came to view Greece with extreme ambivalence. Customs, fashion and even food were at one and the same time adopted and despised. At the other extreme, for example, Pliny the Elder (7.34) tells us that intersex people were considered marvels and "deliciae" ('objects of delight') during the reigns of Pompey (106-48 BC) and Claudius (10 BC-54 AD).
