The Athamanes were most powerful under their king Amynander (about 200 BC), who took a prominent part in the wars of the Romans with Philip and Antiochos. (Dict. of Biogr. art. Amynander.) They were subsequently subdued by the Macedonians, and in the time of Strabo had ceased to exist as a separate people (ix. p. 429). Pliny (4.2) erroneously reckons Athamania as part of Aetolia.
