Of further interest is the small eagle inset in an oval behind the head on the obverse, which shows that this denarius was at one time in the collection of the Gonzaga family of Mantua in Italy. The collection was first formed under the guidance of Isabella d'Este (1474-1539), a humanist and trendsetter of the tim es who was deeply committed to the arts and had been educated in the classics - and, very interestingly, has recently been identified as a plausible candidate for Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa (see Frank Zöllner, Leonardo da Vinci - Sämtliche Werke, 2007, p. 24 1) - and was further built upon by her descendants. The mark was applied to all of the c oins in the collection by the early 17th century, usually in silver for gold coins, and in gol d for silver and bronze. Although some or all of the coin collection may have been sold t o pay off family debts, whatever remained was certainly looted in 1630 during the sack of Mantua by imperial Landsknecht forces who pillaged the city over the course of three days. Afterwards, coins from the collection appeared in all of the major coin cabinets of Europe. Although they are rare, coins with the Gonzaga mark still occasionally come up for sale on the coin markets of today, and conveniently provide proof of a pedigree to th e early 1600s at the latest if not to the original collection formed by Isabella d'Este herse If. 

Bold portrait, of lovely style. Good Extremely Fine. When Antonininus Pi us was selected by Hadrian as his successor in 138 it was due to his maturity, experienc e and fine personal qualities. The author of Pius' biography in the Historia Augusta paint s the picture of a model citizen and idyllic leader, who was universally praised for his dut ifulness, clemency, intelligence and purity. These were just the qualities Hadrian sought in someone who would act as steward not only for the nation, but also for Marcus Aureli us and Lucius Verus, Hadrian's heirs of choice who at the time of Hadrian's demise wer e too young to assume the burdens of office. With this 'dynastic' arrangement in place, t he birth of twins - a boy and a girl - in 149 to the elder of the heirs, Marcus Aurelius, an d his wife Faustina Junior, was a major event. Reconstructing the history of the dozen or more children born to Faustina – more than half of whom died during infancy or childhoo d - is a difficult task. With this well-known coin type of Pius' twelfth tribunician, however, the twins usually are identified as Aurelius Antoninus and the future empress Lucilla. Au relius Antoninus either was the firstborn son of the imperial couple or the second, for it i s possible that T. Aelius Aurelius had been born first, only to die in infancy. The birth of Aurelius Antoninus and Lucilla is celebrated on this crossed-cornucopias type, a design familiar on ancient coinage. The design was carefully considered: the grape clusters, gr ain ears and busts of the children that issue forth from the cornucopias celebrate the fec undity of the imperial line. Thus, when news arrived of the boy's death within his first ye ar it was a terrible blow to the imperial family and to a nation that had invested so much hope in a boy who one day might have become emperor. When Antonininus Pius was s elected by Hadrian as his successor in 138 it was due to his maturity, experience and fin e personal qualities. The author of Pius' biography in the Historia Augusta paints the pict ure of a model citizen and idyllic leader, who was universally praised for his dutifulness, clemency, intelligence and purity. These were just the qualities Hadrian sought in someo ne who would act as steward not only for the nation, but also for Marcus Aurelius and L ucius Verus, Hadrian's heirs of choice who at the time of Hadrian's demise were too you ng to assume the burdens of office. With this 'dynastic' arrangement in place, the birth of twins - a boy and a girl - in 149 to the elder of the heirs, Marcus Aurelius, and his wife Faustina Junior, was a major event. Reconstructing the history of the dozen or more chil dren born to Faustina - more than half of whom died during infancy or childhood - is a d ifficult task. With this well-known coin type of Pius' twelfth tribunician, however, the twins usually are identified as Aurelius Antoninus and the future empress Lucilla. Aurelius Ant oninus either was the firstborn son of the imperial couple or the second, for it is possible that T. Aelius Aurelius had been born first, only to die in infancy. The birth of Aurelius An toninus and Lucilla is celebrated on this crossed-cornucopias type, a design familiar on ancient coinage. The design was carefully considered: the grape clusters, grain ears an d busts of the children that issue forth from the cornucopias celebrate the fecundity of th e imperial line.
