66 Ionia. Magnesia ad Maeander circa 350-200 BC. Bronze Æ (12mm, 1.3 g). Warrior riding horse right, holding lance / ΜΑΓΝ, bull butting left, maeander pattern border. **1**

80 Phrygia. Laodikeia ad Lycum after 133 BC. Bronze Æ (20mm, 8.2 g). Head of Laodice or Aphrodite right, wearing stephane / ΛΑΟΔΙΚΕΩΝ, double cornucopiae left, fillet hanging down on left. **1**



81 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT. Ptolemy VI Philometor. First sole reign, 180-170 B C. Æ Obol (22mm, 11.9 g). Cyprus mint. Diademed head of Zeus-Ammon right / Eagle with closed wings standing left on thunderbolt; lotus flower in left field, EYΛ between legs.

96 SELEUKID EMPIRE. Antiochos III 'the Great'. 222-187 BC. Æ (18mm, 7.3 g). Sardes or Antioch mint. Laureate head of Apollo right / Tripod. **1**



97 Pisidia, Selge Æ (14mm, 2.5 g). Circa 2nd-1st centuries BC. Head of Herakles facing slightly to right, wreathed with styrax; lion skin tied around neck, club over shoulder / Forepart of stag to right, head reverted, lance head to right; ΣΕΛ across fields. **1**
