It was a new cult, distinct from the Theoi Adelphoi ('sibling gods') cult, which by 272/1 had been established for Ar since and her husband. The first honorary coinage for Arsince II and her new cult appe ars to have been silver decadrachms, which were issued soon after her death. Starting i n about 261/0, the same types were employed for gold coins that must have been as im pressive then as they are today. The largest of these was an octodrachm or mnaieion (o ne-mina piece) that appears to have been worth 100 silver drachms, and was struck un der successive Ptolemaic kings for about 150 years or more. Arsinoe's portrait is careful ly composed to show her royal pedigree and her divinity. Her status as a queen is attest ed by the jewelled diadem at her forehead, and her divinity by the lotus sceptre at her s houlder and the ram's horn at her ear. While the obverse is devoted solely to the queen, the reverse is dedicated to her sibling relationship with Ptolemy II. The inscription APΣI NOHΣ ΦΙΛΑΔΕΛΦΟΥ ("[coin] of Arsinoe, brother-lover") is paired with a double cornuco piae, which presumably represents brother and sister. As a symbol of bounty and fertilit y, the double-cornucopiae laden with grain and fruit and bound by a fillet is thought to h ave been a personal badge of Arsinoe II. Upon her death in July of 270 BC, Arsinoe II, t he sister-wife of King Ptolemy II, was deified and a cult was established in her honour a s Thea Philadelphus ('brother-loving goddess').
