**17** ISLANDS off CARIA, Rhodos. Rhodes. Circa 205-190 BC. AR Tetradrachm (30mm, 17.3 g). In the name and types of Alexander III of Macedon. Teisylos, magistrate. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; in left field, ΤΕΙΣΥΛΩ Σ above rose; PO below throne. **3**



**18** IONIA, Miletos. Circa 210-190/70 BC. AR Tetradrachm (29mm, 17 g) In the name and types of Alexander III of Macedon. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; in left field, star above lion standing left, head right, above civic monogram; monograms below throne and to outer right **3**



**19** THRACE, Kings of. Lysimachos. 323-281 BC. AR Tetradrachm (33mm, 16.9 g ). By zantion mint. Circa Late 3rd Century BC. Head of deified Alexander right / Athena Nikephoros seated left, holding Nike in right hand, left elbow resting on shield, spear behind; monogram to inner left, BY on throne, trident in exergue. **3**



**20** MACEDONIAN KINGDOM: Alexander III the Great. Silver tetradrachm (26mm, 17 g). Babylon, during second satrapy of Seleucus, 311-305 BC. **25** KINGS of MACEDON. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. Drachm (17mm, 4 g), Miletos, c. 295-275. Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ Zeus seated left on low throne, holding long scepter in his left hand and, in his right, eagle standing right with closed wings; in left field, monogram; below throne, double-axe. **3**

**28** CILICIA. Uncertain. (Circa 350 BC). AR Hemiobol. (7mm, 0.3 g) Obv: Janiform head wearing taenia. Rev: Male headed bird-deity with two wings and a tail. **3**



**29** PAMPHYLIA, Aspendos. Circa 420-360 BC. AR Obol (11mm, 1 g). Facing gorgoneion / Helmeted head of Athena right within incuse square. **3**



**30** Kings of Persia (Achaemenids). AR Siglos (14mm, 5.2 g), c. 450-400 BC. Obv. The Great King, bearded, in "Knielauf" to right, holding bow and spear. Rev. Irregular incuse. **3**



**31** KINGS of MACEDON. Philip III Arrhidaios. 323-317 BC. AR Drachm (18mm, 4.2 g). In the name and types of Alexander III. Kolophon mint. Struck under Menander or Kleitos, circa 322-319 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; lyre in left field, A below throne. **3**



**32** KINGS OF MACEDON. Alexander III 'the Great' (336-323 BC). Drachm. (17mm, 3.3 g) Erythrai. Obv: Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin. Rev: ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ. Zeus seated left on throne, holding eagle and sceptre. Controls: In left field, monogram within wreath and vertical club; monogram below throne. **3**

R/ Vologases seated l. on throne, Tyche standing r. before him, presenting a diadem and holding sceptre. **3**



**47** Kings of Parthia, Gotarzes II (c. AD 44-51). BI Tetradrachm (24mm, 8.7 g). Seleukeia on the Tigris, year 358 (AD 46). Diademed bust l. R/ Gotarzes seated r., receiving wreath from Tyche standing l., holding cornucopia. **3**



**48** Pamphylia, Aspendus; Stater, 420-400 BC, (22mm, 10.9 g). Obv: Two wrestlers fully engaged standing knee to knee. Rx: Slinger standing wearing short chiton, discharging sling to r.; in field, triskeles of human legs; the whole in dotted square within incuse square. **3**

Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; ME monogram in left field, ivy leaf below throne. **3**



**79** Kings of Macedon. Sardeis. Philip III Arrhidaeus 323-317 BC. In the name and types of Alexander III. Struck under Menander or Kleitos, circa 322-319/8 BC Drachm AR (17mm, 4 g) Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress, paws tied beneath chin / [ΑΛ]ΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus seated left on low-backed throne, right leg drawn back, his feet resting on a low foot rest, holding long scepter in his left hand and, in his right, eagle standing right with closed wings, torch in left field, A below throne. **3**



**80** CARIAN ISLANDS. Rhodes. Ca. 188-170 BC. AR drachm (15mm, 2.7 g). Plinthophoric standard, uncertain magistrate. Radiate head of Helios right / Rose with bud to right; P-O across fields, serpent coiled around omphalos in left field; all within incuse square. **3**



**81** Kingdom of Lydia, Kroisos AR 1/6 Stater. (10mm, 1.73 g) Sardes, circa 561-546 BC. Confronted foreparts of lion to right and bull to left / Two incuse square punches of equal size. **3**



**82** Dynasts of Lycia. Uncertain mint. Kuprilli or Kubernis 470-440 BC. Hemiobol AR (9mm, 0.5 g). Bull butting to left / KO-Π-P, triskeles; all within incuse square. **3**



**83** PISIDIA. Selge. Ca. 4th century BC. AR obol (9mm, 0.8 g). Ca. 300-190 BC. Head of gorgoneion facing / Head of Athena right, wearing crested, winged Attic helmet; spear over right shoulder, astragalus under spear. **3**



**84** MYSIA, Kyzikos. Circa 450-400 BC. AR Obol (10mm, 1.24 g). Forepart of boar left, tunny to right / Head of lion left within incuse square. **3**



**85** Pisidia, Selge AR Obol. (10mm, 0.87 g) 350-300 BC. Facing gorgoneion / Helmeted head of Athena right. **3**



**86** ISLANDS of IONIA, Chios. Circa 400-380 BC. AR Hemidrachm (11mm, 1.65 g). Sphinx seated left; to left, grape bunch above amphora; all set on circular convex field / Quadrupartite incuse square with granulated quarters. **3**



**87** Islands off Ionia. Samos after circa 512 BC. Hemidrachm AR (11mm, 1.54 g) Lion's head facing left within dotted square / Head of bull facing left within dotted double-line square. **3**



**88** KINGS of MACEDON. Philip III Arrhidaios. 323-317 BC. AR Hemidrachm (12mm, 1.9 g). In the name of Alexander III. Babylon mint. Struck under Archon, Dokimos, or Seleukos I, circa 323-318/7 BC. Head of Heracles right, wearing lion skin / Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; M in left field, ΛΥ below throne. **3**



**89** CARIA, Stratonikeia. 166-88 BC. AR Hemidrachm (13mm, 1.23 g). Laureate head of Zeus / Eagle within shallow incuse square. Thunderbolt right. C T. **3**
