2 PHLIASIA. Phlious. Ca. 400-350 BC. Chalkous (bronze, 0.90 g, 12 mm). Bull butting left, head facing. Rev. Large Φ flanked by pellets. Fine. **10**



3 CRETE. Praisos (?). Circa 300-270 BC. Ae (bronze, 1.80 g, 14 mm). Facing head of Medusa. Rev. Bee; E- Σ above. Unpublished in the standard references, cf. Naumann 56, lot 127; Roma E-Auction 3, lot 149. Very fine. Extremely rare. **10**



4 KINGS of THRACE. Lysimachos 305-281 BC. Ae (bronze, 5.40 g, 19 mm), Uncertain mint. Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. [BA]ΣΙΛΕΩ[Σ] [ΛΥΣ]ΙΜΑ[ΧΟΥ] Lion jumping right, monogram and spearhead below. SNG Cop 1143. Nearly very fine. **10**



5 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT. Berenike II, wife of Ptolemy III, circa 244/3-221 BC. Ae (bronze, 3.81 g, 17 mm), uncertain mint on the north Syrian coast. Diademed and draped bust right of Berenike II to right. Rev. ΒΑΣΙΛΙΣΣΗΣ - ΒΕΡΕΝΙΚΗΣ Eagle standing right with wings spread. SNG Copenhagen. Svoronos 1056. Good fine. **10**



6 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT. Berenike II, wife of Ptolemy III, circa 244/3-221 BC. Chalkous (bronze, 1.81 g, 13 mm), Gaza or Ioppa. [ΒΑΣΙΛ ΒΕΡΕΝ] Diademed and draped bust to right. Rev. ΠΤΟΛ [ΒΑΣΙΛ] Eagle with closed wings standing to left on thunder bolt; [ΕΥ to left]. Svoronos 1057; SNG Copenhagen -. Nearly very fine. Very rare. **10**

**50** PISIDIA. Selge. 2nd-1st century BC. Ae (bronze, 3.67 g, 14 mm). Laureate bust of Herakles to right, club over left shoulder. Rev. Σ-E-[Λ] Thunderbolt and arc terminating in head of stag right. SNG Paris 1979-83. Very fine. **7**



**51** PISIDIA. Selge. Ca. 2nd-1st centuries BC. Ae (bronze, 2.86 g, 12 mm). Bearded head of Herakles facing, turned slightly right, wreathed with styx, club in left field. Rev. Σ E-Λ, stag forepart right, head reverted; sword to right. SNG France 3, 1973-1976. Good fine. **7**
