Tylis (Greek: Τύλις) or Tyle was a capital of a short-lived Balkan stat e mentioned by Polybius that was founded by Celts led by Comontorius in the 3rd century BC. Following their invasion of Thrace and Greece in 279 BC, the Gauls were defeat ed by the Macedonian king Antigonus II Gonatas in the Battle of Lysimacheia in 277 BC, after which they turned inland to Thrace and founded their kingdom at Tylis. It was located near the eastern edge of the Haemus (Balkan) Mountains in what is now western Bulgaria. Some bands of Celts, namely the Tectosages, Tolistobogii and Trocmi, did not settle in Thrace, but crossed into Asia Minor to become known as the Galatians. The las t king of Tylis was Kavaros who maintained good relations with the city of Byzantium. Hi s capital was destroyed by the Thracians in 212 BC. and this was also the end of his kin gdom. The modern Bulgarian village of Tulovo in Stara Zagora Province now occupies the site.



The god is often envoked as a protector of the sailors in the face of numerous storms a nd contrary winds in the straits (for Propontic Priapos, see Franck PRETEUX, Priapos Bébrykès dans la Propontide et les Détroits: succès d'un mythe local. Revue des Etude s Grecques, 2005, 118, pp. 246-65). Priapos, which is a rare case of absolute homony my between the name of a god and the name of the city, is located in Mysia, in a bay of the plain of Adrasteia to the east of Parion. It was also a production center related to ma rine resources in ancient times. It is known that the staggering amount of 2 million and 6 00,000 cephalopods fished in one year in Karabiga (ancient Priapos) in the early twenti eth century with rudimentary techniques (K. Deveciyan, Pêche et pêcheries en Turquie, 2006, table C, n. 31). With this very rare coin, the polis once again emphasized the go d's connection with maritime, by depicting both its most important commercial resource, the crayfish, and Priapos.

The cicada (τέττιξ), a creature known for its regenerative properties and r elationship to the earth is a potent symbol of autochthony in the Classical World. After b eing conceived in the soil, the cicada emerges from the earth, literally born from it and p erhaps reminding Athenians of their own earthborn ancestor, Erichthonios (cf. Suda Enc yclopedia, tau.378). Cicadas embodied a multiplicity of meanings and symbols: they we re said to be immortal and given to ecstasy, were often eaten as a medicinal diet, and w ere symbolic of song (H. Hoffmann, 1997. Sotades: Symbols of Immortality on Greek Va ses, Oxford, 116). Krobylos is the name of a famous ancient Ionian hairstyle worn by a grown man and accompanied by a 'golden cicada pin'. Thucydides mentions these gold en cicada hairpins in his depiction of the sumptuous Ionic garb as an integral part of the 'luxury lifestyle' practiced by the Archaic Athenian elite (1.6.3). Ancient Athenians wore g olden cicadas in their hair because cicadas were musical and sacred to Apollo (Aristoph anes, Clouds, 984). Anatolian religious traditions remained embedded in the major cults of Ionia and the 'natives' seem to have made some contributions to Greek music. It is u nderstood that the cicada depicted on Phocaean coins refers to the autochthony and lux ury lifestyle as well as the famous Ionian music and the cult of Apollo. The latter 'is said t o have resulted from the disgust felt by some of the ruling class at the excessive despoti sm of the oligarchs. This has the look of an archaic event. The [former] is a reference to an oligarchy overthrown by the people, the $\delta \tilde{\eta} \mu o \varsigma$. This looks much more like a fourth-c entury revolution'(S. Hornblower, Mausolus, Oxford, 1982, 117–8). The ΔΑΜΟΚΡΑΤΙΑΣ bronzes are usually associated with Alexander's presumed restoration of democracy to Knidos after 333. 


