- 28** Pisidia, Isinda AE 16mm. 2nd-1st centuries BC. Dated year 3. (16mm, 4.2 g) Laureate head of Zeus to right, sceptre behind / Warrior on horse galloping to right, holding coiled lance; below, coiled serpent to right and ΙΣΙΝΔΕ, Γ (date) to left. **5**

- 32** PONTOS. Zela. Time of Mithradates VI Eupator, circa 85-65 BC. AE (21mm, 8.11 g). Head of Mên or Mithras to right, wearing Phrygian cap. Rev. ZHΛITΩN Rooster with crescent on neck standing right; to upper left, E; to lower right, monogram of APE. **5**



- 33** Phrygia. Apameia. HPAKΛEI (Herakle-) and EΓΛO (Eglo-), magistrates circa 88-40 BC. Bronze AE (22mm, 7.10 g) Laureate head of Zeus right / APAMEΩN HPAKΛEI EΓΛO, cult-statue of Artemis Anaitis seen from front. **5**
