In this way he beco mes owner of the island and giving his name to the island. He gave his wife's name to o ne of the largest cities on the island. Lebos has developed throughout history and has b ecome a wealthy city, largely thanks to maritime trade. In addition, the city is the birthpla ce of poets such as Arion, Alkaios, Terpandros and important philosophers such as Hell anicus. A Sappho girls' school was established on Lesvos, which offered a rich and cult ural life. The island had its heyday in the Archaic period. During this period, many cities i n the Troas region were ruled by Lesbos. The reverse of this coin features a stylized grif fin head depicting the head of Apollo wearing a laurel wreath. The main iconographic fe atures of the figure, the open mouth and the tongue stuck out, are reflected on the coin. The pointed ears of the griffin reflect, among other things, the traces of oriental influence es that were transferred to Hellenic art during the period of orientalisation. The depiction of the griffin with Apollo is linked to the cult of Apollo on the island in terms of the charac ter's religious relationship. According to tradition, griffins are Apollo's guardiandogs. Stra bo relates that the cult of Apollo Hekatos (archer hitting the target with his arrow) was wi despread in the region (Strabo, XIII 2,5). The Griffin, which is a symbol of the city and a ccepted as Apollo's guardian dog, and Apollo, which is worshiped as a cult in the region, were brought together on the island's coins. 

The city was founded by colonists from Argos, but later immigrants from Miletus settled in the city. It is believed that the city got its name from lasos, the leader of the colonists of Argos. The main gods of the city are Apollo and Artemis. Therefore, it is common to find Apollo and Artemis on city coins. Another figure that has become a symbol of the city is the figure of Hermias swimming on the back of a dolphin. According to a mythological Legend: Hermias, who was friends with a dolphin went swimming, one day he fell off the dolphin's back and drowned. The dolphin, after carrying the lifeless body of Hermias to Land, lay down next to Hermias and died there (Hicsks 1887, 93-95; Stark 1958, 31). This tragic story gained such a reputation that Hermias became a symbol of the city, taking its place with the dolphin on the coins of lasos. Described by Pactolus Numismatic Acad emy (PNA).

The dolphin, after carrying the lifeless body of Hermias to land, lay down next to Hermias and died there (Hicsks 1887, 93-95; Stark 1958, 31). Elagabalus, w hose real name was Varius Avitus Bassianus, owed his name to the priesthood of the s un god El-Gabal in Emesa. During his reign he focused on bringing sun worship to the Roman Empire. He made al-Gabal the supreme god of the Roman pantheon. By marryi ng the Vestal virgin Aquilia Severa, he disregarded the most sacred laws of Rome. Beca use of all these religious reforms, he attracted the reactions of the Roman people. Here, too, the behavior of the emperor, which was recognized as feminine for Roman society, began to receive reactions from the public. As a result of the backlash, Elagabalus was killed by the Praetorian Guard in 222 and his successor, Severus Alexander, became e mperor. After his death, damnatio memoriae was published for Severus Alexander Elag abalus, capitalizing on his notoriety. The fact that the damage on the face of this coin fo cuses only on the emperor's facial features suggests that it was a damnatio memoriae t o obscure his identity. 10

The needy who received such a tesserae, no doubt those who w ere registered in the registers of the donor, had the possibility of exchanging it, on the s cheduled day, for a food ration, an entrance to the baths or even for a coin. Philothea's List of Precedences, published in 899, tells us that, during certain religious festivals, the emperor invited the poor or monks to the palace to share the imperial meal or to give th em a gold coin. To be able to benefit from this imperial largesse, they had to hand over t he tesserae (sphraghidhion) that they had previously received for this purpose. The use of tesserae for charitable distributions spread more systematically in the 10th century an d gained momentum especially among the Byzantine aristocracy of the 11th century. Thi s very rare tesserae bears a well known biblical proverb (19:17) that very well emphasiz es Byzantine philanthropy. For only known similar, see A. D. 
