



- 1 MYSIA, Kyzikos. 5th-4th centuries BC. EL Hemihekte – Twelfth Stater (8mm, 1.5 g). Nike, holding [aphlaston] in extended right hand, kneeling left on tunny left / Quadripartite incuse square. 4



- 2 Ionia, Phokaia EL Hekte. (10mm, 2.8 g) Circa 480 BC. Forepart of man-headed bull left, collar with row of pearls; behind, seal swimming upward / Irregular quadripartite incuse square punch. 4



- 3 LESBOS, Mytilene. Circa 377-326 BC. EL Hekte – Sixth Stater (10mm, 2.6 g). Laureate head of Apollo right / Head of female right within linear square. 4

ΒΑΣΙΛΕΩΣ - ΠΡΟΥΣΙΟΥ Zeus standing left, holding wreath and sceptre; in inner left field, eagle standing left on thunderbolt / monogram. BMC 2 var. Waddington Recueil pl. XXX, 2. - 12** ASIA MINOR, Uncertain mint. 2nd century BC. AR Tetradrachm (17 Gr. 36mm). In the name and types of Alexander III of Macedon. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / Rev. Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; trident head left in left field. **4**



- 13** PAMPHYLIA, Side. Circa 200-190 BC. AR Tetradrachm (16.8 Gr. 33mm.) Head of Athena right, wearing crested Corinthian helmet. Rev. Nike advancing left, holding wreath; pomegranate above DEI (magistrate) in left field. SNG France 674; SNG von Aulock 4786. **4**



- 14** KINGS of THRACE. Lysimachos. 305-281 BC. AR Tetradrachm (17 Gr. 41mm). Byzantion mint. Struck circa 110-101 BC. Head of deified Alexander right, with horn of Ammon / Rev. Athena seated left, holding Nike, left elbow resting on her shield, spear behind; monogram above knee, BY on throne, trident in exergue. **4**



- 15** Antigonos II Gonatas, 277 – 239. Tetradrachm, Amphipolis 271-265, AR (17.1 Gr. 31mm.) Macedonian shield decorated in centre with head of Pan I., with pedum over shoulder. Rev. Athena standing I., hurling thunderbolt and holding shield decorated with gorgoneion; at her sides, in lower field, Macedonian helmet – monogram. Dewing 1203. **4**



- 16** PAMPHYLIA, Side. Circa 200-190 BC. AR Tetradrachm (16.7 Gr. 34mm). Head of Athena right, wearing crested Corinthian helmet. Rev. Nike advancing left, holding wreath; pomegranate above DEI (magistrate) in left field. **4**
