Just who this Axiochus was remains a mys tery. The name is known in the Greek world (a dialogue of the same name ascribed to $P$ lato is known), and several Romanized Axiochi are attested in inscriptions and graffiti (c f. CIL VI.13.19-Sex. Pompeius Axiochus). Axiochus was likely one of the numerous eu ergetai, or benefactors of the Roman Empire: wealthy individuals who supported public projects, or liturgies, in their hometowns. They alleviated the burden of the imperial trea sury, while at the same time improving their standing.
