Tylis (Greek: Τύλις) or Tyle was a capital of a short-lived Balkan stat e mentioned by Polybius that was founded by Celts led by Comontorius in the 3rd centu ry BC. Following their invasion of Thrace and Greece in 279 BC, the Gauls were defeat ed by the Macedonian king Antigonus II Gonatas in the Battle of Lysimacheia in 277 B C, after which they turned inland to Thrace and founded their kingdom at Tylis. It was lo cated near the eastern edge of the Haemus (Balkan) Mountains in what is now western Bulgaria. Some bands of Celts, namely the Tectosages, Tolistobogii and Trocmi, did not settle in Thrace, but crossed into Asia Minor to become known as the Galatians. The las t king of Tylis was Kavaros who maintained good relations with the city of Byzantium. Hi s capital was destroyed by the Thracians in 212 BC. and this was also the end of his kin gdom. The modern Bulgarian village of Tulovo in Stara Zagora Province now occupies t he site. 10

Various archaeological finds such as Akk adian, Old Babylonian, Neo-Assyrian, Persian, Urartian and Hittite cylinder seals, relief s, sculptures and medallions from the 9th and 8th centuries BC have cultic scenes as th eir theme, in which a mighty lion strides with a goddess on its back. They all clearly poin t to the origin of the depiction that also adorns this medallion. As in Mesopotamian icono graphy, a figure standing in front of the lion testifies to her devotion to the goddess. In h er outstretched hand the goddess sometimes holds a wreath. Also, the role of the Virgin as the most powerful intercessor was closely associat ed with the tribunal character of the ekklesiekdikoi. Her image as an intercessor on beh alf of criminals and penitents was an established iconographic type in manuscript illumin ation and wall paintings. An actual icon ofthe Virgin was kept in the inner narthex of Hag ia Sophia, that is, in proximity to the seat of the tribunal. The iconography found on the Ekklesiekdikoi seals remained relatively constant from the eleventh through the fifteenth century. This group of seals consists of standing figures of the Virgin and Justinian I sup porting a model of a church identified as Hagia Sophia.
