Furtwangler published a gold ring from southern Russia in the Hermitage in 1900 with a similar representation of a youth over a tunny, which he described as a "squatting slave boy"; interestingly with a reference to Cyzicus. In 1966 Gerassimov published a Kyzikene stater, the only analogy of our coin type and described the figure as a slave boy. See, T. Gerassimov, A Cyzicus Stater with the Representation of a Statue, Mélanges offerts à Kazimierz Michalowski (Warschau 1966), p. 429. Physical features such as forehead, nose and lips of our unique figure, which is very similar to the posture of this figure, indicate that it may be a silenoi. The Aydinid principality was founded by a Germiyanid commander, Mubariz al-Din Ghazi Bey, in the area around Tire, Ayasluk (Selcuk), and Birgi in 1308 C.E. The Aydinids began expanding their borders at the expense of Byzantium and took control of Izmir in 1328. They also captured territory and islands along the Aegean coast. The Aydinid realm fell under Ottoman domination in 1390 but regained its independence in 1402. The Byzantine charity tesserae provide material evidence of the organization of charitable food sharing on an ad hoc basis. Round, two-sided, struck on brass or bronze, these small monuments are often engraved with the name of the benefactor. The needy who received such a tesserae, no doubt those who were registered in the registers of the donor, had the possibility of exchanging it, on the scheduled day, for a food ration, an entrance to the baths or even for a coin. Philothea's List of Precedences, published in 899, tells us that, during certain religious festivals, the emperor invited the poor or monks to the palace to share the imperial meal or to give them a gold coin. To be able to benefit from this imperial largesse, they had to hand over the tesserae (sphragidhion) that they had previously received for this purpose. The use of tesserae for charitable distributions spread more systematically in the 10th century and gained momentum especially among the Byzantine aristocracy of the 11th century.
