Female head facing slightly left, hair in ampy x , wearing single-pendant earrings and necklace / Bearded head left, wearing crested A ttic helmet, drapery around neck.

48 LYDIA, Uncertain. 4th century BC. AE (1.6 Gr. 11mm.) Wreathed head of Dionysos I eft Rev. Kantharos; and S (in Lydian) flanking.


49 Mysia, Pergamon. 200-113 B.C. AE (7.2Gr. 20mm.) Laureate head of Asklepios (or Zeus) right Rev. Serpent-entwined staff of Asklepios.

50 Kings of Macedon. Sardeis. Philip III Arrhidaeus 323-317 BC. AE (3.96 Gr. 14mm.) Shield with kerykeion in central boss Rev. B-A, Macedonian helmet, kerykeion to left, ro se to right, TI below.

51 PISIDIA. Isinda. 1st century BC. AE (1.95 Gr. 13mm.) Laureate head of Apollo right. Rev. ILIN. Legend within wreath.

52 LYCIA. Phaselis. AE (Circa 190-167 BC). (2.86 Gr. 18mm.) Prow of galley right; ab ove, Nike flying right, holding wreath. Rev. $\Phi$ - A. Athena standing right, holding spear a nd shield.

53 SELEUKID KINGS of SYRIA. Antiochus IV Epiphanes, 175-164 BC. AE (3.64 Gr. 1 6 mm .) Veiled and diademed bust right of Laodike IV; monogram to left. Rev. Horned ele phant's head left

54 MYSIA. Pergamon. Mid-late 2nd century BC. AE (1.97 Gr. 15mm.) Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. Owl standing slightly right, head facing; all within wreath.

69 PONTOS. Uncertain, possibly Amisos. Ae. (12mm, 1.6 g ) Struck under Mithradates VI (Circa 119-100 BC). Obv: Eight-pointed star; above, head of horse right. Rev: Sevenpointed star, with palm frond as additional point (or comet with tail?)


70 AEOLIS. Elaia. Ae ( $15 \mathrm{~mm}, 4.0 \mathrm{~g}$ ) (2nd-1st centuries BC). Obv: Head of Demeter rig ht, wearing grain wreath. Rev: E^-AI / T- $\Omega$ N. Torch within grain wreath.
