Under Antoninus Pius we find two depictions of the port: this one, with Poseidon in the middle and no figure under the pillars of the left temple, and a second one, depicted in Price/Trell, with Isis Pharia in the middle of the port and Poseidon in the temple on the left. Since Pausanias says there was a statue of Poseidon in Kenchreai and the temples of Aphrodite, Asclepius and Isis, Price/Trell identified their port with Kenchreai, since two of these four deities appear on the coin. Our piece, previously identified as Kenchreai by Imhoof-Blumer and Gardner, and following him, Edwards, is probably a parallel issue for Lechaion, especially because Pausanias explicitly mentions a sanctuary of Poseidon and a bronze statue of the god there. The port facilities of the two coins, however, look similar; the only difference is the central statue.
