Destrooper pl. 10, 6 var. (lion and ram's head to left); Tziambazis 129 var. (same, attributed to Salamis, Evagoras II); BMC 69-73 var. (same); SNG Copenhagen 56 (Salamis, Evagoras II). Fine.



ACHAEMENID EMPIRE. Time of Xerxes II to Artaxerxes III, circa 420-350. Siglos (silver, 5.29 g, 17 mm), Sardeis. King/hero kneeling-running right, holding spear and bow. Rev. Incuse punch. Very fine.



**5** LYCIAN LEAGUE. Cragus (?), c. 30-27 BC. Ae (bronze, 1.50 g, 11 mm). Laureate head of Artemis right. Rev. Crossed bow and quiver within incuse square and dotted border. Good fine.



**6** IONIA. Miletos. Late 6th-early 5th centuries BC Obol (silver, 0.98 g, 10 mm). Forepart of lion left. Rev. Stellate floral design within incuse square. Nearly very fine.

PHRYGIA. Apameia. Circa 88-40 BC. Ae (bronze, 7.15 g, 24 mm), Kokos, magistrate. Helmeted bust of Athena right. Rev. AΠΑΜΕΩΝ / ΚΩΚΟΥ Eagle alighting right on maeander pattern; piloi of the dioskouroi to left and right, star above. SNG Copenhagen 161-2; HGC 7, 670. Very fine.



PAMPHYLIA. Perge. Circa 200-0 BC. Ae (bronze, 4.20 g, 20 mm). Head of Artemis to right, quiver over shoulder. Rev. APTEMIΔΟΣ ΠΕΡΓΑΙΑΣ Nike standing to left, holding wreath. SNG von Aulock 4662; SNG Copenhagen 305. Nearly very fine.



THRACE. Byzantion. Before 336 BC. Ae (bronze, 1.51 g, 13 mm). Bull's head facing slightly left. Rev. Ethnic surrounded by three dolphins. BMC 29. Good fine.



**11** CAPPADOCIA. Tyana. Pseudo-autonomous issue, 100-50 BC. Ae (bronze, 3.08 g, 15 mm). Bull standing right. Rev. TVAN $\varepsilon$ ωN Zeus seated left on throne, holding sceptre and patera. SNG Copenhagen 315; Lindgren I 1734 var. (bull left). Very fine.



CAPPADOCIA. Caesarea (as Eusebeia). Time of Archelaus, 36 BC - AD 17. Ae (bronze, 10.52 g, 24 mm). Helmeted bust of Athena right, wearing aegis. Rec. EYΣΕ - BΕΙΑΣ Nike advancing right, holding wreath and palm. Sydenham, Caesarea 16. Nearly very fine. Very Rare.



**13** MACEDONIAN KINGDOM. Alexander III the Great, 336-323 BC. Drachm (silver, 3.64 g, 18 mm). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ Zeus Aëtophoros seated left, monogram below. Nearly very fine.
