1 North Africa. CARTHAGE. Circa 300-264 BC. Ae (bronze, 5.22 g, 19 mm), Carthage or Sardinian mint. Head of Tanit to left, wearing wreath of grain ears, triple-pendant earring and elaborate necklace. Rev. Head of horse to right. Nearly very fine.

2 North Africa. Uncertain. 1st century BC-1st century AD. Ae (bronze, 4.96 g, 17 mm). Crude diademed head of Ptolemy I(?) right. Rev. Ram standing left; star before, uncertain letter or symbol (?) above. Unpublished in the standard references, but cf. CNG Electronic Auction 351, Lot 418. Nearly very fine. Very rare.

3 UNCERTAIN EAST. Imitating Athens. Circa 4th century BC. Tetradrachm (silver plated bronze, 13.10 g, 20 mm) Helmeted head of Athena right, with frontal eye. Rev. Owl standing right, head facing, closed tail feathers; olive sprig and crescent to left; all within incuse square. Good fine.

4 PERSIA, Alexandrine Empire. Uncertain satraps of Babylon, circa 328-311 BC. Obol (silver, 0.37 g, 8 mm), Babylon. Baaltars seated left, holding scepter in his right hand and placing his left hand on throne. Rev. Lion walking left; above, spearhead to left. Cf. BMC 4 (tetradrachm); Cf. Nicolet-Pierre 2 (same). Nearly very fine.

5 PERSIA, Alexandrine Empire. Uncertain satraps of Babylon, circa 328-311 BC. Obol (silver, 0.40 g, 7 mm), Babylon. Baaltars seated left, holding scepter in his right hand and placing his left hand on throne. Rev. Lion walking left; [above, spearhead to left] (?). Cf. BMC 4 (tetradrachm); Cf. Nicolet-Pierre 2 (same). Nearly very fine.

Persian king or hero, wearing kidaris and kandys, quiver over shoulder, in kneeling-running stance right, holding spear and bow. Rev. Head of Satrap right, wearing bashlyk. Corfù pl. 4, 3; BMC 25 (Mallos); Babelon, Perses 191 (Tarsos); Brindley 84 (Ionia or Caria); Sunrise 92. Nearly very fine.

7 LYCIAN LEAGUE. Tlos, circa 100 BC. Ae Half Unit (bronze, 1.40 g, 10 mm). Laureate head of Apollo right. Rev. ΛΥΚΙΩΝ Quiver and bow in saltire, T-Λ across fields; all within incuse square. Troxell, Lycian League, 67. Nearly very fine. Very rare.
