3 CARTHAGE. Circa 400-350 BC. Ae (bronze, $2.31 \mathrm{~g}, 15 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Wreathed head of Tanit left. Rev. Horse standing right; palm tree in background; pellet to upper left. SNG Cop 109-119. Nearly very fine.


4 IONIA. Ephesos. Circa 390-320/00 BC. Ae (bronze, $2.71 \mathrm{~g}, 15$ mm ), uncertain magistrate. [E-Ф] Bee. Rev. [magistrate] to left, Stag kneeling left, head to right; above, astragalos. Nearly very fine.


5 IONIA. Ephesos. Circa 2nd-1st centuries BC. Ae (bronze, 6.21 g, 20 mm ), uncertain magistrate. Bee. Rev. Stag standing right; palm tree behind; monogram to right. Nearly very fine.


6 IONIA. Ephesos. Circa 1st century AD. Ae Tessera (bronze, $3.66 \mathrm{~g}, 20 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). ПРОС ПA^YPIN KHPINIC WDE Bee. Rev. E - Ф / CKWПI Stag crouching left, head right. SNG Aulock 1875; SNG Copenhagen 355 . Nearly very fine.


7 LYCAONIA. Laranda. 4th century BC. Obol (silver, $0.57 \mathrm{~g}, 10$ mm ). Baal seated left, torso facing, holding grain ear and grape bunch in extended right hand, scepter in left Rev. Forepart of wolf right; inverted crescent above; all within dotted square border. Nearly very fine.

8 PISIDIA. Antioch. Pseudo-autonomous issue, 138-161. Ae (bronze, $1.61 \mathrm{~g}, 12 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). ANTIOCHIA Draped bust of Mercury/Hermes left. Rev. COLONIA Cock standing left. Nearly very fine.


9 PISIDIA. Isinda. 2nd-1st centuries BC. Ae (bronze, $4.79 \mathrm{~g}, 18$ mm ). Laureate head of Zeus left. Rev. IEIN Warrior, holding spear, galloping on horse right. Very fine.


10 PISIDIA. Selge. Circa 250-190 BC. Obol (silver, $0.80 \mathrm{~g}, 10$ mm ). Facing gorgoneion Rev. Helmeted head of Athena right; astragalos to left. Fine.

11 PISIDIA. Selge. 2nd-1st century BC. Ae (bronze, $1.55 \mathrm{~g}, 13$ mm ). Head of Herakles right, club behind shoulder. Rev. Winged thunderbolt and bow. SNG BN 1979. Very fine.


12 PISIDIA. Selge. Circa 2nd-1st centuries BC. Ae (bronze, 1.61 $\mathrm{g}, 13 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Bearded head of Herakles facing, turned slightly right, wreathed with styrax, club in left field. Rev. $\Sigma \mathrm{E}-\wedge$ Stag forepart right, head reverted. Nearly very fine.


13 CARIA. Uncertain. 5th century BC. Diobol (silver, $2.15 \mathrm{~g}, 12$ mm ). Confronted foreparts of two bulls. Rev. Head and neck of a bull to right within incuse square. Good fine.


14 CARIA. Uncertain. 5th century BC. Diobol (silver, $2.05 \mathrm{~g}, 13$ mm ). Confronted foreparts of two bulls. Rev. Head and neck of a bull to right within incuse square. Good fine.


17 ISLANDS off CARIA. Rhodos, circa 180-84 BC. Ae (bronze, $1.49 \mathrm{~g}, 11 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Radiate head of Helios right. Rev. Rose with bud. Very fine.


18 BITHYNIA. Apameia. 4th-3rd Centuries BC. Ae (bronze, 6.45 g, 18 mm ). Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. Bull standing right, head facing; monogram above. Cf. CNG 180, lot 37. Nearly very fine. Rare.


19 MYSIA. Pergamon. Circa 133-67 BC. Cistophoric Tetradrachm (silver, $11.17 \mathrm{~g}, 28 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Serpent emerging from cista mystica; all within ivy wreath. Rev. Bow-case with two serpents; monogram above, civic monogram to left, serpent-entwined thyrsos to right. Nearly very fine.


20 CILICIA. Tarsos. Time of Pharnabazos or Datames, circa 379-374/378-372. Obol (silver, $0.75 \mathrm{~g}, 9 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Female head (Arethusa?) facing slightly left. Rev. Helmeted and bearded male head (Ares?) right. SNG Paris 309. Good very fine.


21 CILICIA. Tarsos. Time of Pharnabazos or Datames, circa 379$374 / 378-372$. Obol (silver, $0.71 \mathrm{~g}, 8 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Female head (Arethusa?) facing slightly left. Rev. Helmeted and bearded male head (Ares?) left. Very fine.


22 CILICIA. Tarsos. Circa 164-27 BC. Ae (bronze, $3.75 \mathrm{~g}, 17$ mm ). Club tied with fillets, all within oak wreath. Rev. TAP $\sum E \Omega N$ Zeus seated left holding crowning Nike and scepter, star in crescent to lower left. Nearly very fine.


23 CILICIA. Tarsos. Circa 164-27 BC. Ae (bronze, 8.86 g, 21 mm ). Draped, veiled and turreted bust of Tyche right. Rev. Sandan standing right on horned, winged animal, within a pyramidal monument surmounted by an eagle; to left, two monograms. Very fine.

24 CILICIA. Aigeai. 130-70 BC. Ae (bronze, $5.00 \mathrm{~g}, 18 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. AIFEAI $\Omega$ N Goat standing left, monogram to left. Nearly very fine.


26 CILICIA Soloi. Circa 1st century BC. Ae (bronze, $3.08 \mathrm{~g}, 14$ mm ). Helmeted head of Athena to right. Rev. $\Sigma O \wedge E \Omega N$ Grape bunch. Nearly very fine.

27 CILICIA. Zephyrion. 1st century BC. Ae (bronze, $7.14 \mathrm{~g}, 21$ mm ). Turreted and veiled head of Tyche right. Rev. ZEФVP $\Omega$ T $\Omega \mathrm{N}$ Crossed torches; two monograms below; all within wreath. Levante, Zephyrion 42. Nearly very fine.


28 Uncertain. Ae (bronze, $0.66 \mathrm{~g}, 12 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Goat or sheep to right Rev. Club within wreath. Nearly very fine.


29 PONTOS. Amisos. Mithradates VI Eupator, circa 120-63 BC. Ae (bronze, $7.46 \mathrm{~g}, 20 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Head of Dionysos right, wearing wreath of ivy and fruit. Rev. AMIIOY Panther skin and thyrsos on cista mystica; to left, monogram. HGC 7, 243; SNG BM Black Sea 1207. Very fine.


30 PONTOS. Amisos. Mithradates VI Eupator, circa 120-63 BC. Ae (bronze, $7.89 \mathrm{~g}, 19 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Laureate head of Zeus right. Rev. AMIEOY Eagle with open wings standing left on thunderbolt, head turned right, monogram in left field. Very fine.


31 PONTOS. Amisos. Mithradates VI Eupator, circa 120-63 BC. Ae (bronze, $6.97 \mathrm{~g}, 20 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Aegis with Gorgoneion in centre Rev. AMI-乏OY Nike advancing right, holding palm; monograms to left and right. Nearly very fine.


32 GREEK. Obol (silver, $0.63 \mathrm{~g}, 9 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Head right. Rev. Female figure (?) seated left. Nearly very fine.

33 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT. Ptolemy II Philadelphos, 285246 BC. Ae Drachm (bronze, $72.34 \mathrm{~g}, 41 \mathrm{~mm}$ ), Alexandreia. Head of Zeus-Ammon right, wearing tainia. Rev. Two eagles with closed wings, standing left on thunderbolt. Nearly very fine.

35 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT. Ptolemy VI Philometor, 180-164 BC. Ae obol (bronze, $7.67 \mathrm{~g}, 21 \mathrm{~mm}$ ), uncertain mint on Cyprus. Diademed head of Zeus Ammon to right, with ram's horn in his hair and over the diadem. Rev. BAEIAE $\Sigma \Sigma \Pi T O \wedge E M A I O Y$ Eagle with closed wings standing left on thunderbolt; to left, lotus flower; between the eagle's legs, EY^. Svoronos 1401; SNG Cop 295. Nearly very fine.


36 PTOLEMAIC KINGS of EGYPT. Ptolemy VI Philometor, first reign, 180-164 BC. Obol (bronze, $11.04 \mathrm{~g}, 22 \mathrm{~mm}$ ), uncertain mint on Cyprus. Diademed head of Zeus Ammon to right, with ram's horn in his hair and over the diadem. Rev. BAEIAE $\Sigma \Sigma$ ПTO^EMAIOY Eagle, with closed wings, standing left on thunderbolt; scepter over shoulder; to left, lotus flower; between eagle's legs, EY^. Svoronos 1401; SNG Cop 295. Repatinated, nearly very fine.


37 KINGS of MACEDON. Alexander III the Great, 336-323 BC. Tetradrachm (silver, $16.50 \mathrm{~g}, 27 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. $A \wedge E \equiv A N \triangle P O Y$ Zeus Aëtophoros seated left. Nearly very fine.


38 KINGS of MACEDON. Alexander III the Great, 336-323 BC. Drachm (silver, $3.96 \mathrm{~g}, 17 \mathrm{~mm}$ ). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress.
