



Conditions of Sale

The auction sales are in Swiss Francs with the addition of buyer's premium of 22.5% on the hammer price. There is no additional fee for bids made through an internet live-bidding platform. For all lots delivered in Switzerland there is an additional Swiss VAT of 8.1% due on the hammer price and on the buyer's premium for silver and bronze coins, and for medals. The purchaser is responsible for all taxes and fees due for delivery of lots outside of Switzerland. Payment is due immediately following conclusion of the sale. Full title to purchases is only obtained upon full payment. A charge of 1% per month will be assessed for delayed payments. Written bids take preference over room bids.

Buyers are personally responsible for their own purchases and cannot claim to act on the account or instructions of a third party. Adjudication occurs on the fall of the hammer and commits the bidder to acceptance of the lot.

The lot descriptions, including the degree of preservation, are opinions and made in good faith. The authenticity of all coins is guaranteed. Justified complaints can only be considered if made within eight days of receipt of the pieces. Third party grading services certification (e.g. NGC, PCGS, ANACS, etc.) is not sufficient cause for any return of purchased items. The opinion of the International Bureau for the Suppression of Counterfeit Coins (IBSCC) of the International Association of Professional Numismatists (IAPN) will be deemed definitive for issues of authenticity. Upon receipt of full payment, shipment of lots will be arranged for the purchaser at his expense and risk. In general, the usual conditions applied to auctions held in Zürich apply here.

Shipping to the Russian Federation will only be made at the recipient's own risk.

Exclusive jurisdiction for any legal proceedings shall be Zürich I. Although the Conditions of Sale are provided in English, French and German, only the German text is legally valid. The bidder accepts these conditions of sale by the submission of a bid, whether verbal or written.



Foreword.

Welcome to Nomos Auction 31! This auction contains El-Greco Collection of Modern Greek Rarities, which we are proud to present in association with our colleagues in Thessalonica, the well-known auction firm of A. Karamitsos. Built up over the last three decades of the 20th Century, the El-Greco Collection is specialised in the coins and patterns of Modern Greece, including the Ionian Islands and Crete. This collection is, without exaggeration, the most important to appear in a public sale, since that of the late Dimitri Loulakakis, which was sold in Spink Auction 5 back in 1979.

The El-Greco collector was one of those old-school collectors who valued completeness more than just condition. He didn't mind that his common IO Lepta of I833 (lot 39) wasn't in mint condition, because he had the great rarities that no one else had, such as 5 Drachmai of I845 (lot 95), the unique gold 20 Drachmai of I852 (lot I26), or the unique Gold Pattern of the I Drachma of I9I5 (lot I99) and so many others. Driven by his burning passion for Greek history, El-Greco patiently built his collection for almost 30 years, always keeping a low profile, away from the lights of publicity. He had almost never personally attended an auction, but had agents bidding for him in such a discrete way that most collectors were unaware of him, and his collection's, existence.

Nomos 3I contains 267 lots, with starting prices that range from a mere 20 CHF to a stratospheric 500,0000 CHF (for our cover piece, lot 126, the illustrious 20 Drachmai of 1852). The collection's content list is as follows:

We would like to dedicate this catalogue to our very good friend, George, who has unfortunately and unexpectedly left us far too early. George, another El-Greco in his own way, and a connoisseur, among others, of modern Greek coins, acquired, many, many winters ago, his very first coin from the El-Greco collector. It was a small gazzetta of the Ionian islands as the one here in lot 239. Since then, he always told his friends, while they enjoyed, together, the pleasures of life - he was a famous and always generous host-that this particular moment was the turning point that inspired him with his love for history and for him to become a collector with his own beautiful collection.

We hope that this catalogue, which offers coins for every collector, will offer beginners the inspiration to start their numismatic journey, and give the most advanced connoisseurs the opportunity to acquire incredible coins, which haven't been on the market in a generation.



Ioannis Kapodistrias, a prominent figure in Greek history, played a pivotal role in the early 19th century as the first head of the independent Greek state. The 5 Drachmai dated to 1833 with owl mint mark, were actually struck in Athens in 1843, as a limited issue of only 435 pieces. It is thought that they were made because King Otho wanted to create the belief that 5 Drachmai coins had already been minted in the Kingdom of Greece at the very beginning of its modern numismatic history.

The 20 Drachmai of 1833 stands as the inaugural gold coin struck to circulate in modern Greece following its liberation from the Ottoman yoke. While Kapodistrias had contemplated issuing gold pieces, his plans were never realized. While we know that King Otho had plans to issue other gold coins for general circulation - dies exist for them - they were, in fact, never issued.



In the year 1836 the Athens Mint introduced three new denominations into circulation—namely, the 10, 5 and 2 Lepta. Notably, the 2 and 5 Lepta were produced in significantly lower mintages, rendering them, for numismatists, respectively rare and extremely rare. It is important to note that the 10 Lepta pieces bearing the same date was, in contrast, struck in substantial quantities during this period.

During the excavation of a 19th century level in the vicinity of the Church of The Holy Apostles in the Athenian Agora, a hoard of 118 small silver coins (115 Greek, all of King Otho - 5 1 drachmi, 109 1/2 drachmi and 1 1/4 drachmi - 2 French 1/2 francs, and 1 Spanish Reale minted in Mexico) were unearthed "among the stones of an 19th century house wall". Given the fact that the two latest coins of the hoard were two extremely rare 1/2 drachmi of 1842 (the first the regular issue by Voigt and the second the pattern/essai by Heyer), the hoard could be dated to 1843 and its deposit was related by Walker to the Revolution of 1843. The surprising appearance in this hoard of the 1842 Heyer 1/2 drachmi Pattern/Essai, is proof that a few examples of this coin actually entered circulation, despite the fact that the design was eventually rejected, and the coins withdrawn. This is clear because the majority of the examples that have survived until today, despite their official withdrawal, are worn to a greater or lesser extent, thus proving that people used them.



In the year 1847 a notable modification occurred in the design of King Otho's copper coins: a new design, by Lange was approved for all the bronze coins, the coat of arms on the obverse was reduced in size and the wreath on the reverse became more elaborate.

The present coin is the sole known pattern testifying to Kurt Lange's unsuccessful endeavor to renovate King Otho's bronze coinage. Eventually the dies were not approved (note the cancellation mark on the reverse) but nevertheless in 1849 a limited number of coins were struck from the same master dies (with the alteration of the date) and escaped into circulation (see, below, lot 114).

As already mentioned in the note to lot 104 (above), in 1847 the design of the copper coins was altered to reduce the size of the coat of arms. 

King George I of Greece, born Prince William of Denmark in 1845, ascended the Greek throne in 1863, marking the beginning of a significant era in Greek history. His reign, which extended until his assassination in 1913, played a crucial role in shaping the modern Greek state.

Selected by the major European powers to assume the Greek throne, King George I faced the daunting task of guiding a nation emerging from political turbulence and territorial conflicts. Despite the challenges, he worked diligently to stabilize the country, promote economic development, and strengthen diplomatic ties.

George I was known for his commitment to constitutional monarchy and sought to establish a stable political framework. His reign witnessed the introduction of numerous reforms, modernization initiatives, and the development of infrastructure. His efforts aimed at fostering national unity and identity laid the foundation for the Greece we recognize today.

Internationally, George I was well-regarded for his diplomatic skills, maintaining a delicate balance amid the complex geopolitical dynamics of the time. His marriage to Grand Duchess Olga Constantinovna of Russia further solidified diplomatic relations between Greece and other European powers.

Tragically, George I's life was cut short when he was assassinated in Thessaloniki in 1913. Despite the untimely end of his reign, King George I is remembered as a pivotal figure in the early years of modern Greece, contributing significantly to the nation's political stability and progress, having a major role in the nation's numismatic history. Under his reign, significant changes occurred in Greece's monetary landscape. George I oversaw the introduction of a new currency system, aligning Greece with the Latin Monetary Union.

During his rule, which spanned 50 years from 1863 to 1913, various coin denominations were issued to reflect the evolving economic and political climate. Notably, the Latin Monetary Union, established in 1865, aimed to standardize coinage across its member countries, including Greece. This alignment with the union had a profound impact on Greek numismatics, influencing the design, composition, and denominations of the coins issued during this period.

King George I's numismatic legacy is evident from the coins minted during his reign, reflecting the ideals of the emerging Greek state within the context of broader European economic integration. His efforts to modernize the currency system and align Greece with international monetary standards left a lasting mark on the country's numismatic heritage.



This is an extremely rare coin and, in the opinion of the cataloguer, one of the most beautiful of all the pattern 5 Drachmai produced for Georgios I. It the first fully complete pattern 5 drachmai made by Barre - the uniface pattern of the proceeding lot should be related with this issue, and is the only 5 Drachmai pattern that bears the youthful head of Georgios I. It should be noted, that the obverse die was not formed by the same master die, which was used for the obverses of the silver coins minted between 1868 and 1873. It is, rather, a completely new die made by Barre which not only shows the king's portrait in a slightly more mature way, but also rendered in a much more medallic engraving style. In addition, the proportions of the engravers signature differs from the way it appears on the other 5 Drachmai coins. In any case, this pattern was not approved. In 1875 another one was commissioned (see lot 153), bearing the more mature head of the king that was eventually approved.



King Constantine I of Greece, born in 1868, ascended to the throne in 1913 during the tumultuous period marked by the two Balkan Wars and, then, World War I. His reign was characterized by political instability and territorial changes. Constantine I faced internal conflicts, notably during the National Schism, the deep division over Greece's involvement in World War I.

An an advocate for Greek neutrality during the war, Constantine I's stance led to tensions with the political factions supporting the Allied Powers. The ensuing conflict and political unrest ultimately compelled him to abdicate in 1917.

Constantine I returned to the throne in 1920 but faced further challenges, including the Greco-Turkish War and the Asia Minor Catastrophe. The military defeat and its ensuing political unrest led to his second abdication in 1922.



Although these coins bear the date 1921, they were actually struck in 1922. After the devaluation of the Drachma, as a result of the defeat and withdrawal of the Greek forces from Asia Minor, the metal value of these coins was higher than their face value, therefore they were never released for circulation. The majority of them were melted down in 1926 to provide the metal for the 2 Drachmas coins of 1926. Only few coins have survived, probably a total of less than 50 for both the Heaton and King's Norton mints.

This is a surprising discovery for the modern Greek coin series! All previously known examples of the 1921 50 lepta, regardless the mint, were struck with the dies in coin alignment (6h, as, for instance, lot 201 above). Surprisingly, this coins was struck in medal alignment (12h); this variety has never been recorded in any previous catalogue or auction. This coin is, thus, a new variety and as far as we know the only existing example; but it is, of course, possible that there are other examples of this variety, but no one has ever noticed them! Additionally, it is worth mentioning that the King's Norton 1921 50 lepta is, in general, much rarer than the already rare Heaton ones.

Presentation patterns for the coins of the second Greek republic are immensely rare and are, additionally, difficult to identify since they share "almost" the same types found on the circulation issues. Apart from the fact that it is the only pattern in Gold that we are aware of, the lack of the denomination numeral is an indication that this coin could be a pattern for both of the gold coins, which were eventually issued: i.e., including the 100 Drachmai. The fact that it was struck in Gold and lacks the denomination, leads to the assumption that it was struck to be offered for approval to the King of the Greeks himself.

The fifth anniversary of the restoration of monarchy was to be celebrated on 25 November 1940. However, less than a month before, on the 28th October 1940, Mussolini declared war and the Italians began their disastrously incompetent attempt to invade Greece through the mountains of Epirus. In this turbulent period the Greek State's original order for the production of 750 these coins was reduced to only 200 pieces.

The fifth anniversary of the restoration of monarchy was to be celebrated on 25 November 1940. However, less than a month before, on the 28th October 1940, Mussolini declared war and the Italians began their disastrously incompetent attempt to invade Greece through the mountains of Epirus. In this turbulent period the Greek State's original order for the production of 300 these coins was reduced to only 140 pieces. Nevertheless, it is intriguing that even for this very limited issue there were two different reverse dies.

The mint of the Septinsular Republic was officially created on 5 September 1801, following the billingual decree issued by the president of the Senate of the Ionian Republic, Count Spyridon Georgios Theotokis. That decree announced the coins' denominations and the iconography, as well as the measures taken to assure the new currency's acceptance. However, the decree didn't specify the exact exchange rate of the Gazetta to the foreign silver and gold coins, which circulated in the region. The mint was located in Garitsa, a southern suburb of Corfu, very close to the future Mon Repos.

Due to the extreme rarity of these coins, it has been suggested that they never circulated, and all the surviving examples are in fact patterns. Count Markos Theotokis, in his study published in 1884, maintained that the decree to release the coins into circulation was never actually published, and, in fact, even doubted the 1801 decree's authenticity.

In any case, the way the coins were minted is certainly related to Russian mint practices, especially given the presence of the anti-forgery incuse edge pattern that all these coins have (and has never been mentioned in the past). This is very unusual in modern Greek coins, with the only parallel being the edge decoration of the 20 Lepta of 1831, issued by the Governor Iohannes Kapodistrias, (once minister of foreign affairs of the Russian empire).

Great Britain took over the Ionian Islands in 1809 and the usual island problems of the export of good silver soon began. Spanish Dollars were imported for military use, but almost immediately went out again for supplies, thus leaving only poor quality minors for the inhabitants. In 1813 the government imported large numbers of Sicilian silver fractions and countermarked them with Para values on a fixed exchange ratio. Needless to say, these initial countermarks, being only a numeral within a square frame, were immediately forged. The coins were then recalled and countermarked with the head of George III above the value within an oval indent. Despite the execrable artistic quality of these countermarks, the coins continued in circulation until 1821 when they were finally withdrawn in favor of the new denomination system.


