They are daemons with tails, horse hooves and donkey ears. They are usually old, fat, disgusting-looking, and almost always prey to a restless sexual desire. The sight of these halfhuman, half-horses with full manhood arouses fear among the Nymphs who share with them the wild surroundings of the mountains. Silenus and Satyrs are known for their prominent phalluses. These are mostly the personalities of forest and wild environments.
