According to Thucydides, it was founded by Trojan exiles and Eryx, the son of Aphrodite and the Sican king Butes, mythological figures reflecting the fusion of local Sican elements with refugees from the East, which originated the Elymian people. The city housed a very important temple of Aphrodite and attracted great economic interest, so much so that in the 6th century the Carthaginians successfully attempted to take over from the Elymians and provided it with an impressive city wall. Eryx remained in Punic hands until the end of the First Punic War, then in 248 BC it passed together with all of western Sicily into Roman hands. From that moment on, the city lost its strategic and military importance, but the temple of Aphrodite continued to represent an important religious pole, at the head of a federation of 17 Sicilian cities that paid a large tribute to the sanctuary. The fortress was able to resist Pyrrhus in 276 BC and the almost ten-year siege by the Romans during the First Punic War. Following the Roman victory against the Carthaginians and the Treaty of Eryx, the city passed to the Romans and took the name Lilybaeum, continuing to play an important military and commercial role in the Republican period. This is the monster sent by Posidon to punish the pride of Cassiopeia, killed by Perseus and assumed in the Cetus (whale) constellation. When Cassiopeia, wife of the Ethiopian king Cepheus, said in public that she and her daughter Andromeda could claim a beauty superior to their own, they were outraged and asked Poseidon, their lord and protector, to teach their vanity a lesson. The god produced a tsunami that swept over the country and sent the monster Cetus against them. Cepheus asked the oracle of Ammon how to placate the divine wrath and was told that the beautiful Andromeda should be displayed chained on a cliff as a sacrifice to the monster. Perseus, who was flying over those areas, was made aware of the facts and agreed with Cassiopeia to deliver him from the monster in exchange for Andromeda, who was to become his bride. Daughters of Zeus and Eurynome, the Charites embodied the values of grace and beauty and were often placed side by side with Aphrodite. Eurynome was a very ancient deity, dating back to the Pelasgian creation myth; she was in fact the first goddess to emerge from Chaos, the origin of all things. In the myth, the world is formed as the effect of a cosmic dance by the goddess, from which her spouse, the serpent Ophion, was also formed, with whom she generated all forms of existence, before exiling him because he had claimed all the merits of creation. Eurynome herself was banished from Olympus when Kronos and Rhea came to power. Later in myth she took on the connotations of a sea goddess, daughter of Ocean and Thetis, often depicted with a serpent's tail. In this form she was worshipped as the mother of all voluptuousness, and it is this version of Eurynome that generates with Zeus the Charites. They held the first cup at every banquet, embodied the joy of life and all pleasures, from music to art, from the delights of the senses to amorous sentiment. Their femininity was opposed to the virile impetuosity of Zeus. She married around 63 Gaius Saloninus Matidius Patricius, a very wealthy man, praetor and member of the religious college of the Arvales. From him Ulpia had a daughter Salonina Matidia. After Saloninus' death, Marciana did not remarry, although she had many pretenders due to her prestigious relationship with the emperor and her beauty. However, Trajan respected her wishes and never forced her to remarry. Her daughter Matidia instead married first a Matidius, then Lucius Vibius Sabinus, from a consular family, and from this marriage was born Vibia Sabina, future wife of Hadrian. When Vibius Sabinus died in 84 or 87, Ulpia Marciana with her daughter and granddaughters went to live in the family home of Trajan and his wife Plotina, and later in the palace. After 105 she was elevated to the rank of Augusta by her brother, the first sister of an emperor to receive this title. Although she was initially reticent, she was finally convinced by Plotina and first appeared on coins and depicted by statues. Her portrait is known for its complicated hairstyle with a high diadem. Marciana often travelled with Trajan, who considered her a trusted advisor and often asked her opinion on decisions. He also dedicated two cities to her, Colonia Marciana in Africa, and Marcianopolis in Moesia. She died between 112 and 114, when she was deified at the behest of Trajan, along with their father Marcus Ulpius Trajan

Under Nero she earned the honorary title Martia Victrix ('victorious, blessed by Mars') after her successful campaign against Siluri and Ordovici, when she contributed to the defeat of Queen Boudicca at the Battle of Manduessedum. In 193 AD, during the power struggles that followed the assassination of Pertinax, Legio XIV was one of the first to proclaim Septimius Severus emperor, at that time governor of Pannonia, accompanying him after the proclamation at Carnuntum on his descent into Italy. It then took part in his march on Rome against Didius Julianus and later fought in Cilicia against the other pretender to the throne, Pescennius Niger. Behind the figure of Vaballatus stands the more prominent one of his mother Zenobia, who ruled the kingdom of Palmyra and decided to secede from the Roman Empire, declaring herself independent. Zenobia, who claimed to be descended from Cleopatra, first appears in sources in 258 as the second wife of Septimius Odaenathus, ruler of Palmyra. Since the heir to the throne was to be Herodianus, Odaenathus' first-born son, Zenobia instigated Meonius to kill first her husband and then her stepson. She later had Meonius executed as well and assumed the regency on behalf of her son Vaballatus, who was still an infant at the time. Given the political instability in Rome, Zenobia began to plan an autonomous kingdom that would unite different eastern populations. She conquered Arabia and Judea in a short time, then even managed to take over Egypt by taking advantage of the death of Claudius Gothicus. In 270 the queen assumed the title of Augusta and began minting coins in the name of her son Vaballatus. The new emperor Aurelian finally decided to intervene and headed east, achieving two important victories at Immae and Emesa, then laying siege to Palmyra. Zenobia relied too much on the city's food and water reserves and on the help that never arrived from the Persian king Shapur. Flavius Valentinianus, originally from Pannonia, was a tribune of the cavalry in Gaul under Constantius II, then tribune of the 'scrutarii' (shielded soldiers) at the time of Jovian. In 364 he was chosen as emperor of the West, while in the East his brother Valens was elected, following the division of the Empire that was now necessary, all attempts at reunification having failed. The problems facing the Empire required more than one emperor. For Valentinian the main difficulty was the barbarians: first the Alamanni in Mogontiacum, then the Saxons and Picts in Britain. The various expeditions to Germany constituted a constant and costly expense to keep up the military apparatus. Valentinian also favoured the status of soldiers at the expense of civilians and especially the poor. The emperor faced the attempted usurpation of Firmus in 374-5, then was involved in settling a matter of religious disputes. Valentinian was a Christian, but he did not condemn the pagan faith. In fact, with the help of Pope Damasus, he promulgated an edict of universal tolerance by which anyone could worship the god they preferred. But when it came to preserving the stability of his dynasty, Valentinian did not hesitate to execute several members of the pagan aristocracy who were hostile to him, replacing them with trusted Christians. Valentinian I died in 375 in Pannonia, while negotiating difficult conditions with local leaders. In 1077 Michael VII Ducas faced the revolt of John of Durrës, brother of Nicephorus Bryennios, who was not happy with his style of government. The emperor then appointed Nicephorus Basilas as duke of Durrës, who set off for Epirus with a strong army to arrest the rebel Nicephorus Brienus, who was initially undecided on what to do. He then joined his brother in Hadrianopolis and together they met up with Basilacius' army near Thessalonica. After a few skirmishes, the two made peace and decided not to obstruct each other and to go their separate ways. Nicephorus Bryennios then attempted to take Constantinople without success and, although the new emperor Nicephorus III Botaniates offered him a complete amnesty, the former duke of Durrës refused. Nicephorus III then appealed to Alexius Comnenus, who, with the help of a contingent of Turks, defeated and captured Brienus in Thessaly in 1078. Nicephorus Basilacius was then acclaimed emperor by the men who had previously remained loyal to Nicephorus Bryennios and took command of operations in the rebel camp. After recruiting an army composed of Albanians, Bulgarians and Normans from southern Italy, Basilacius turned in the direction of the capital, receiving the support of several Thessalian and Macedonian cities along the way. Nicephorus III turned again to Alexius Comnenus, who repaid him by defeating Basilacius' army near Thessalonica and forcing the usurper to take refuge within the city walls. Not having enough men to conduct a siege, Alexius agreed with the local nobles to hand over the rebel and managed to deliver him over to the emperor.
