The hero-horse connection, which is especially emphasized for Hector in the Homeric epic, has been reflected on the iconography of the helmet here. This type refers to the lines in the sixth chapter of Iliad, where Hector says farewell to his wife and son. A sphinx on top of the helmet, animal ears, flying horsehair crest and manes! With this image, Hector has the appearance that he can scare both his enemies and his son. The coin engraver depicted Hector with the perception of his son Astyanax. The parents' laughter at his reaction in a sad scene shows that they saw the helmet through his eyes - as the Ophrynians would later imagine - and that they were enjoying the humorous moment. It is understood that the Ophrynians knew the role of the helmet in farewell scene and referred to Homer's lines in the image of their prominent hero. This unique image of Hector also explains the epithet of korythaiolos, the meaning of which is arguable. The head on Ophrynion coins represents "(quick moving like) the stormy (wind) helmeted Hector (кориӨаíодоs "Ектшр)" who is likened to the galloping horses with their manes flying. S. In many examples where the Archepolis can be seen on the obverse of the coin, it can be seen that he is seen with a himation and a beard. These coins were often supported by legends in which his name was mentioned clearly or abbreviated. Figures carrying laurel branches are usually identified as Apollo. The fact that the figure's body on this coin is completely covered with a himation and also a beard prevents him from being Apollo and brings him closer to the possibility of being Archepolis. Apollo appears as a particularly beardless and young figure and often wears a short tunic. This iconography of Apollo can also be found on all Magnesia coins. Furthermore, this coin differs from other examples, which are already very rare, in that there is no legend on the coin and that this coin is a period counterfeit. The Greek general Themistocles settled in Magnesia in collaboration with the Persians, lived and ruled here and also died here, as we learn from Pausanias, in 459 BC. in Magnesia. During his dominion here, he minted many coins in his name, including the Persian straps. After his death, his son Archepolis continued to mint coins. The fact that Archepolis continued to mint coins after the death of Themistocles is an indication that the Persian regime allowed the children of the families that dominated the cities to continue to rule the cities in return for their loyalty. So we see that Themistocles passed his rule to his son by inheritance. Although they owed all their power to the favor of the Persian king, these rulers were free to mint their own currency.
