In 333/332 the city entered into an alliance with Alexander the Molossian and became his main base of action. The first gold fractions, bearing the head of Hera on the obverse, are dated to this period, followed by issues with a frontal female head. On the reverse is the barley ear, which was the city emblem and appeared on all issues. Finally, there are two issues with the type of Leukippos on the obverse, identified by the legend. Strabo reports one version of the colonization of Metapontion, according to which Leukippos was sent by the Achaeans. The head is similar to that appearing on silver Distaters and Staters attributed to the period of Alexander the Molossian. The two sets of Tetrobols are similar in type, but vary essentially in weight: while the former conforms to the Attic standard (2.85g), known specimens of the latter weigh c. 3.20-3.30g, weights that do not seem to fit well into any system of the period. The double barley-ear was probably intended to indicate the use of a different weight system, the same expedient in fact being used later as a value indicator for silver and bronze of the Hannibalic period. Specimens of both of these issues were found in the Bernalda hoard, suggesting contemporary circulation. The use of different weight systems is an open question. Indeed, the city had at first adopted the Achaean standard for gold, then minted the issue with Leukippos on Attic standard, like the gold coins of Tarentum. This change may be connected with a period when, as the gold coinage of Philip II of Macedon had become more widespread, the city decided to mint fine metal coinage on Attic standard, because it was accepted by mercenaries who had to be paid. Historical sources give the date of Akragas' founding as the 50th Olympiad (585-580 BC), placing it among the last Greek colonies established in Sicily. The settlers probably came from Rhodes and Gela, under the command of the ecists Aristonoo and Pistilos, who located a site not far from the sea on the Akragas River, after which the city was named. During the tyranny of Phalaris (570-555 BC) the city built walls and began an expansionist campaign, later continued by Theron (488-473), who won an important battle victory over the Carthaginians at Himera, gaining a vast territory. From that time Akragas experienced enormous political, economic and cultural development, culminating in the period of democratic rule, which was established after the death of Theron. In 406 BC the city was besieged by the Carthaginians, who finally sacked and burned it several times, without however, favoring the establishment of a Punic colony. With Timoleon's victory over Carthage in 339, the city was rebuilt on the same site, then taken back by the Carthaginians and remained under their influence until 210, when it passed into Roman hands at the end of the Second Punic War. The eagle depicted on the obverse of this coin, and on most of the issues of Akragas, is surely to be related to Zeus, to whom the inhabitants dedicated the most important temple in the city. The crab, on the other hand, which appears on all the reverses, is associated with Poseidon, demonstrating the city's great connection with the sea from the time of its founding, which was important for its economy related to maritime trade. On some silver coins, such as this one, a human face appears on the carapace of the crab, most likely depicting the river god Akragas in an original way. Condition: Extremely fine. Weight: 8.11 g. In 20 BC Augustus succeeded in resolving the conflict with the Parthians through diplomacy, obtaining the return by King Phraates IV of the insignia lost by Crassus at the Battle of Carrhae in 53 BC. The emperor refused the Triumph that the Senate wanted to award him, but he received a series of triumphal ornaments, such as corona aurea, toga picta and tunica palmata. 





Marcus Didius Severus Julianus was born in Mediolanum in AD 133 and grew up in the house of Marcus Aurelius, brought up by his mother, Domitia Lucilla, thanks to whom he was elected to the vigintivirate. Didius Julianus then distinguished himself in Germania against the Chauci and was awarded the consulship in 175. When Pertinax was assassinated, Didius Julianus proposed himself as his successor in a manner that, according to the historian Cassius Dione, was scandalous and infamous. Julian is said to have offered to the praetorians a large sum of money in exchange for the empire. Similarly, however, Sulpicianus, father-in-law of the late Pertinax, behaved in a sort of auction to buy the throne. Didius Julianus prevailed, winning power with 30,000 sesterces paid to each praetorian, but also promising to rehabilitate the memory of Commodus. His first action as emperor was in fact to bring down the head of the praetorian prefect Quintus Aemilius Leto, who had taken part in the conspiracy with Cassius Dion in 192 and was guilty of the murder of Commodu Didius Julian's power was short-lived, however, because of Septimius Severus, governor of Pannonia Superior, who accused him of murdering Pertinaces and was supported by the people. Faced with the advance of Septimius Severus, Didius Severus was abandoned by the legionaries of the Danube and also by the Praetorians, without whom it was impossible to maintain power in Rome. Despite humble origins he became a jurist in Rome and seems to have been an expert bureaucrat. In 212 he became praetorian prefect, and in 216, by then Caracalla's right-hand man, he followed the prince on his expedition against the Parthians. On that occasion Caracalla was assassinated by the centurion Martialis, who was caught and killed by the soldiers, but the instigator of the conspiracy seems to have been Macrinus himself, who was acclaimed as the new emperor. He was the first non-senatorial emperor and immediately thought to seek the approval of the Senate, which, detesting Caracalla, granted him the title. However, the rumor that it was he who had hatched the conspiracy and granted the kingdom of Armenia to Tiridates II, losing Roman control over such an important territory, made the soldiers hostile to him. It was to no avail to give his son Diadumenian the name Antoninus, nor to show respect to Caracalla's body, which was brought to Rome with a pompous public funeral to receive deification. The defeat in Mesopotamia against the Parthians, which led to the payment of a heavy compensation, caused the army to lose confidence for good. Moreover, Macrinus' lavish standard of living began to irritate the Senate as well, and the coup was not long in coming, organized by Julia Maesa, sister of Julia Domna. Being able to count on vast resources and Macrinus' hard times, Maesa had her nephew Varius Avitus Bassianus (Elagabalus) elected emperor by the army, spreading the rumor that he was the son of Caracalla. Macrinus was in Antioch with a small garrison, was defeated at Nisibis and forced to flee, then arrested and executed on the road to Antioch. His son Diadumenian also followed the same fate. 

In 218, thanks to the clever machinations of his grandmother Julia Maesa and the large sums of money she paid to the soldiers, Bassianus was appointed emperor under the name Marcus Aurelius Antoninus, the same as Caracalla. This was not a random choice, for the late prince was very dear to the hearts of his soldiers and, more generally, the Antonine name was well liked by the Romans. Of course, Bassianus would have had no right to bear it if the wily Mesa had not spread the false rumor that he was Caracalla's son. According to the senatorial literature, ill-disposed toward authoritarian rulers, Bassianus was the worst emperor Rome had ever had. His biography, written by Aelius Lampridius, which describes him as the most vicious and perverse emperor ever, is certainly exaggerated. Bassianus, however, was unable to integrate himself into Rome and imposed his lifestyle and absolutist conception of power. As high priest of the god El-Gabal, he tried to impose his cult on Rome, claiming to put him in the place of Jupiter and going so far as to celebrate the divine wedding between the god and Minerva. El-Gabal was represented as a black cone, most likely a meteorite. Rome was forced to accommodate that cult and build for El-Gabal a sumptuous temple on the Palatine, the Elagabalium. It was because of this inconvenient cult that Bassianus was called "Elagabalus" by all. According to the historian Herodian, during the festival in honor of El-Gabal, the emperor as a priest had the statue of the god placed on a chariot of gold and precious stones and, with the help of white horses, led it forward on foot and holding the reins, as if the god himself were driving the chariot. 



They came from a wealthy family of the equestrian order related to several senators. The name Gordian suggests an Anatolian origin, from the city of Gordius. It seems that Gordian accepted the empire in old age only on the condition that his son would be associated with it, in order to succeed him. In AD 237 Gordian II was in Africa as legate under his father's command. After a rebellion in Africa in 238, mainly because of the exorbitant taxes imposed by Maximinus, Gordian I accepted the imperium offered by the army and also the title of Africanus. He entered Carthage acclaimed by the crowd and politicians, while in Rome the prefect of the Praetorians was assassinated. The Senate, happy to deprive Maximinus, accepted the new emperor, and most of the Provinces sided with him. However, Capelius, governor of Numidia and supporter of Maximinus Thrax, invaded the province of Africa with the Legio III Augusta, composed of veterans. Gordian II, who had no trained or well-prepared soldiers, was defeated and killed in the battle of Carthage. Thanks to this in the famous battle of Mursa, Constantius succeeded in defeating the usurper who, together with his brother and Augustus of the West Decentius, committed suicide shortly afterwards. Constantius Gallus was considered by the sources to be an able commander but made himself hated for his despotic ways; he also promoted a pro-poor monetary policy, in contrast to that of Constantine I and Constantius II himself, who favored gold coinage and the wealthy classes. He was thus assassinated by the aristocracy of Antioch and struck with damnatio memoriae. In his place Constantius' cousin Julian was appointed Caesar. Constantius II is remembered for attempting to bring Rome back to prominence by granting tax privileges to the Church and donating important monuments, giving the impression that he preferred the "Urbe" at the expense of his father's chosen capital. He was nevertheless forced to return to Constantinople to face the Persians, but was betrayed by Julian, who refused to march to his aid and was acclaimed Augustus by the soldiers in Paris. Flavius Valentinianus, originally from Pannonia, was a tribune of the cavalry in Gaul under Constantius II, then tribune of the 'scrutarii' (shielded soldiers) at the time of Jovian. In 364 he was chosen as emperor of the West, while in the East his brother Valens was elected, following the division of the Empire that was now necessary, all attempts at reunification having failed. The problems facing the Empire required more than one emperor. For Valentinian the main difficulty was the barbarians: first the Alamanni in Mogontiacum, then the Saxons and Picts in Britain. The various expeditions to Germany constituted a constant and costly expense to keep up the military apparatus. Valentinian also favoured the status of soldiers at the expense of civilians and especially the poor. The emperor faced the attempted usurpation of Firmus in 374-5, then was involved in settling a matter of religious disputes. Valentinian was a Christian, but he did not condemn the pagan faith. In fact, with the help of Pope Damasus, he promulgated an edict of universal tolerance by which anyone could worship the god they preferred. But when it came to preserving the stability of his dynasty, Valentinian did not hesitate to execute several members of the pagan aristocracy who were hostile to him, replacing them with trusted Christians. Valentinian I died in 375 in Pannonia, while negotiating difficult conditions with local leaders. 

After serving as protector domesticus (personal guard) of Julian II and Jovian, he immediately became emperor of the East in 364 thanks to his brother who was already Augustus of the West, although the two differed in faith. Valens in fact was an Arian, while Valentinian was a Nicene Christian. The first problem was presented by the usurper Procopius, comes of Antioch, who proclaimed himself Augustus of the East in 365. Valens defeated him, sentenced him to death and struck with damnatio memoriae. He later faced the Visigoths and a second conspiracy, hatched by Theodore of Antioch. In 374 Valens celebrated the decennalia and became Maximus Augustus in 375 on the death of his brother, after which he organized an expedition against the Persians that proved unsuccessful, forcing him to sign an unfavorable peace. Another problem was the confluence of Ostrogoths and Visigoths into Roman territory across the Danube because of the advance of the Huns. The Romans were forced to accept them, but this integration was not easy; the Visigoths felt oppressed and exploited as a labor-power, resulting in an insurrection. Valens, considered a general of little ability by his contemporaries, was thus induced to recruit Goth mercenaries, with the risk that they would end up allied with his enemies. In fact, a large contingent of Visigoths, Ostrogoths, Huns, and Alamanni joined forces to fight the Romans and achieved a decisive victory at Hadrianopolis (Thrace) in 378. The tremendous defeat was caused by Gratian, who was meanwhile on the Western throne and did not arrive in time with his troops. Valens died in the battle but the Goths failed to conquer Constantinople. Flavius Valentinianus, of Augusta Treverorum (Treveri), son of Justina, ascended the throne when he was only four years old. He was elected augustus in 375 by the soldiers, because they refused to let the sole legions of Germania, who had nominated Valentinian's elder half-brother Gratian, choose the emperor. However young, Valentinian faced complicated situations with his mother and Gratian, such as the usurpation of Magnus Maximus in Britain, which was remedied by Theodosius I, who managed to prevent Valentinian from being attacked by the insurgent's legions. More complicated was the matter of the removal of the Altar of Victory from the Senate of Rome, which represented the city's glorious pagan tradition. Its removal was supported by Gratian, on the advice of charismatic figures such as Mediolanum bishop Ambrose, which led him to confront a group headed by senator Quintus Aurelius Simmachus. As much as Justina and her son were of the Arian faith and close to Simmachus, the altar was nevertheless removed to the great scandal of the court of Rome. When his mother and brother faced such situations, because of his young age Valentinian often remained in the background; moreover, he fell under the spell of a dangerous character: the Frank leader and able warrior Arbogastes, his magister equitum. Soon, however, their relationship became conflictual, partly because of the Altar of Victory, which Arbogaste wanted to see restored. Valentinian was found hanged from a tree in 392 at Vienne in Gaul. Sources disagree on the cause of death, some mentioning suicide, others leaning toward murder by Arbogaste. The emperor was probably the victim of a palace conspiracy, as Arbogaste had led to the elevation of Flavius Eugenius to augustus. The damnatio memoriae documented by some eroded inscriptions may support this hypothesis. His funeral was held in Mediolanum, at the behest of Theodosius I, by Bishop Ambrose, who also wrote a consolatory piece on the young emperor's death for the occasion. Condition: Near mint state. Son of Constantine IV and Anastasia, Justinian II became emperor at the age of sixteen and was the last of the Heraclian dynasty. He initially renewed the peace with the Arabs, also at the behest of the new caliph, 'Abd al-Malik ibn Marwan, who agreed to very advantageous terms, and also sent ten thousand Mardaites who were integrated into the Byzantine army. Justinian was thus able to concentrate on the Balkans, sending troops to subdue Bulgarians and Slavs, and achieved an important victory, after which he deported thousands of Slavs to Asia Minor, important for the strengthening of the army and the economic system linked to the working of thematic land. However, probably for religious reasons, there was soon a return to war with the Arabs (691-692), who refused to depict Christ on the coins they minted to pay tribute to Byzantium. The decisive battle took place at Sebastopolis in Armenia, where the army of deported Slavs were corrupted by the caliph's gold. The defeat was a heavy one and Armenia submitted to the Arabs. Justinian II was also hated by the people for his fierce tax policy and by the aristocracy for his concessions to small landowners. Inevitably he was overthrown after ten years of his reign, with the revolt of Leontius in 695. The emperor was imprisoned and had his nose amputated, hence the nickname 'Rhinotmetus' = 'the Slit-Nosed'. Finally he was sent into exile in Crimea. However, he did not give up. He escaped more than one assassination attempt and married the daughter of the Khazars leader, who converted to Christianity and took the name Theodora. He allied himself with the Bulgarians, granting the title of Caesar to Khan Tervel in exchange for military support. He then succeeded in retaking Constantinople in 705 and had Leontius and Tiberius II executed. His second reign was marked by his thirst for revenge against those who had made attempts on his life, especially in the city of Cherson. Hence the revolt that dethroned him the second time, led by Bardanes who, after taking the name Philippicus, cut off Justinian's head and put an end to his dynasty. Condition: Extremely fine.
