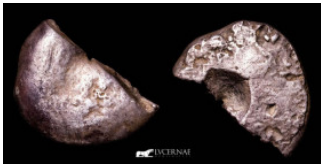

During this time, he became a close friend of Octavian, thirteen years his senior. In 25 BC, Octavian, now Rome's first emperor under the name of Augustus, granted his friend Juba the North African Kingdom of Mauretania, which had been annexed by the Romans following the death of Bocchus III in 33. About five years later, Juba II married the 20 year old Cleopatra Selene, daughter of Mark Antony and Queen Cleopatra VII of Egypt, who had been brought up by the emperor's sister, Octavia, following her parents' suicide in Alexandria in 30 BC. Their rule over Mauretania was benevolent, and quite prosperous, though there was constant border security problems. Juba survived to an advanced age and was eventually succeeded by Ptolemy, his son by Cleopatra Selene, in AD 24.

Though Latin and Greek were the languages that appeared on Juba's coinage, neither were the colloquial tongues of everyday life in his kingdom. The main language of the common population was Berber, which, despite nearly twenty centuries of rule by Latin and Arabic speakers, has survived to the present day. The second language of the kingdom was Punic, a Semitic tongue that was a remnant of six-hundred years of Carthaginian rule and still enjoyed a large number of speakers in the first century AD.
