Married Laodice, daughter of Mithridates II of Pontus. Appointed commander of all Asia west of Mount Taurus in 223 BC and then recovered Seleucid territories from Attalus I of Pergamum. The fourth Syrian war and the preoccupation of Antiochus and his army with Ptolemy IV and Molon provided Achaeus the opportunity to declare himself king in Phrygia in the autumn of 220, thus finally severing the ties with Antiochus III. In 218 BC Attalus regained control over the Greek cities of northern Ionia, Aeolis and Troas and the Mysian lands as far east as the Megistos river, which occupied Achaeus during the fourth Syrian war. He held power only until Antiochus had reached a peace with Ptolemy, and issued bronze coinage in his name; Antiochus then allied with Attalus to retake the territory Achaeus had claimed. Achaeus withstood a seige in the citadel of Sardis for two years. After sustaining a siege of two years, the citadel at last fell into the hands of Antiochus in 213 BC, through the treachery of Bolis (who had been employed by Sosibius, minister to Ptolemy). Bolis pledged to deliver Achaeus to safety, but turned him over to Antiochus, who immediately put him to death.

The Greek general Themistokles was perhaps the most important, and certainly one of the most powerful, political figures in early fifth century Athens. He is settled in Magnesia in collaboration with the Persians, lived and ruled here and also died here, as we learn from Pausanias, in 459 BC in Magnesia. During his dominion here, he minted many coins in his name, including the Persian satraps. After his death, his son Archepolis continued to mint coins. These coins are part of the primary evidence of his otherwise littleknown reign. The fact that Archepolis continued to mint coins after the death of Themistokles is an indication that the Persian regime allowed the children of the families that dominated the cities to continue to rule the cities in return for their loyalty. Although they owed all their power to the favor of the Persian king, these rulers were free to mint their own currency.

The most significant development in religious imagery and legends following Ezana's conversion to Christianity in the mid-4th century was undoubtedly seen in the Axumite bronze coinage. This coinage, initially issued during Ezana's reign and continued by his successors, stands out for incorporating the cross as a central design feature. The cross, representing Christ as the divine King of Kings, contrasts with the king's portrait on the front of the coin, who serves as Christ's earthly representative. The inscription on the reverse, 'TOYTO APECH TH X PA', means 'May this please the country', clearly indicating the state's commitment to promoting the new religion among the Axumite people, likely accompanied by a rise in the use of currency.



These 'nice things' are designed to destroy enemies and to sting like a scorpion or bee, and the message of those with the image of a scorpion can be understood as: "nice things sting like a scorpion."
