Rev. Rider on horseback to left, wearing helmet with large crest. Göbl, OTA pl. 13, type 140. Struck from a somewhat worn obverse die, otherwise with a pleasant and well visible reverse. Some scratches, otherwise, about very fine. Interesting symbol in front of the rider.



3 Central European Celtic Tribes, Carpathia region, imitating Philip II of Macedon. "Schnabelpferd" type. 2nd. Century BC. Billon (Silver plated) Tetradrachm (23mm, 8,38g.). Stylised head of Zeus to right. Rev. Heavily stylised horse to left. Göbl, OTA pl. 28, 326/1. Good very fine.

With a nice old cabinet tone, about good very fine. Very fine. More likely to be a Thracian-Odrysian imitation, instead of the Celtik imitation like is officially known also according the types related to the Thracian king Saratokos. The Celtic invasion is also later according to the minting this type.
