AKARNANIA. Argos Amphilochicon. Circa 330-300 BC. Ae (bronze, 3.39 g, 16 mm). Head of Hermes right, petasos hanging from neck. Rev. Hound recumbent right, head left. Repatinated, fine.



ASIAN MINOR (?). Hemiobol (silver, 0.34 g, 9 mm). Head of horse right. Rev. Head of horse right. Good fine.



4 SYRIA. Bambyke-Manbog (?). Circa 4th century BC. Obol (silver, 0.56 g, 9 mm). Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. Uncertain figure standing left. Nearly very fine.



PHOENICIA. Arados. Uncertain king. Circa 400-384 BC. 1/16 Shekel (silver, 0.73 g, 9 mm). Laureate head of Ba'al-Arwad right. Rev. Galley right, above waves; Aramaic letters above. HGC 10, 46. Nearly very fine.



6 PHOENICIA. Arados. Circa 400-380 BC. Diobol (silver, 2.66 g, 14 mm). Half-length bust of marine deity (Ba'al Arwad) facing, head right, fish in each hand. Rev. Prow of galley right, winged hippocampus right below. HGC 10, 44. Test cut, good fine.

31 KINGS of MACEDON. Alexander III the Great, 336-323 BC. Drachm (silver, 4.03 g, 16 mm), Lampsakos. Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ Zeus seated left on low throne, right leg drawn back, holding long scepter in his left hand and, in his right, eagle standing right with closed wings; in left field, forepart of Pegasos left; below throne, Artemis with torch, advancing left. Very fine.



32 KINGS of MACEDON. Alexander III the Great, 336-323 BC. Drachm (silver, 3.82 g, 16 mm). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ Zeus Aëtophoros seated left, holding long scepter in his left hand and eagle in his right. Nearly very fine.
