Historical sources give the date of Akragas' founding as the 50th Olympiad (585-580 BC), placing it among the last Greek colonies established in Sicily. The settlers probably came from Rhodes and Gela, under the command of the ecists Aristonoo and Pistilos, who located a site not far from the sea on the Akragas River, after which the city was named. During the tyranny of Phalaris (570-555 BC) the city built walls and began an expansionist campaign, later continued by Theron (488-473), who won an important battle victory over the Carthaginians at Himera, gaining a vast territory. From that time Akragas experienced enormous political, economic and cultural development, culminating in the period of democratic rule, which was established after the death of Theron. In 406 BC the city was besieged by the Carthaginians, who finally sacked and burned it several times, without however, favoring the establishment of a Punic colony. With Timoleon's victory over Carthage in 339, the city was rebuilt on the same site, then taken back by the Carthaginians and remained under their influence until 210, when it passed into Roman hands at the end of the Second Punic War. The eagle depicted on the obverse of this coin, and on most of the issues of Akragas, is surely to be related to Zeus, to whom the inhabitants dedicated the most important temple in the city. The crab, on the other hand, which appears on all the reverses, is associated with Poseidon, demonstrating the city's great connection with the sea from the time of its founding, which was important for its economy related to maritime trade. On some silver coins, such as this one, a human face appears on the carapace of the crab, most likely depicting the river god Akragas in an original way Condition: Very fine. Weight: 8.83 g. Lilybaion was located at the site of today's Marsala on the western tip of Sicily. The name, literally 'facing Libya' is a direct reference to the geographical location. The city was founded in 397 BC by refugees who survived the destruction of Motya by Dionysius I, who created an important centre thanks to its strategic position and impregnable stronghold, which was later reinforced by the Carthaginians. The fortress was able to resist Pyrrhus in 276 BC and the almost ten-year siege by the Romans during the First Punic War. Following the Roman victory against the Carthaginians and the Treaty of Eryx, the city passed to the Romans and took the name Lilybaeum, continuing to play an important military and commercial role in the Republican period. Its naval base was used by Scipio to finally destroy Carthage. It was also an important base for Julius Caesar during his civil war against Pompey. The abundance, style and coin types minted by Lilybaion testify to the wealth and importance achieved by the city in the Punic period. Condition: Good very fine. Weight: 17.40 g. Diameter: 26 mm.

They also duelled with the brothers Ida and Lynceus, after kidnapping their women Phoebe and Ilaira. Only Pollux survived the duel, who chose to share with Castor the fate of spending alternately a day among the dead and a day among the immortals. Only Pollux survived the duel, who chose to share with Castor the fate of spending alternately a day among the dead and a day among the immortals. Hadrian was born in Italica or Rome in 76 AD to an influential family; his grandfather had been a member of the senate. Having soon been orphaned, Hadrian was entrusted to his cousin Trajan, who acted as his tutor and granted him in marriage one of his great-granddaughters, Sabina, in 100 AD. It was therefore quite natural that on Trajan's death Hadrian should succeed him, although he had never adopted him. In fact at the prince's death the senate received letters from Trajan mentioning Hadrian's adoption, but according to Cassius Dio they were signed by his widow Plotina. Probably Lucius Licinius Sura, his future and greatest general, also made great efforts for Trajan to consider Hadrian's candidacy. Hadrian is remembered as a literate monarch, a lover of Greek letters and neosophistic philosophy. The new emperor had a very different political conception from that of his predecessor, beginning with the renouncing of the expansionism so much desired by Trajan in order to focus more on the defense of imperial borders, as evidenced by the construction of Hadrian's Wall. His reign was also marked by the travels he embarked on between 121 and 132, a way of learning about and expressing respect for every corner of the empire. Indeed, he visited numerous regions and garrisons, reserving special interest for the armies and the discipline of the soldiers. Despite his efforts to avoid any armed conflict, Hadrian had to deal with a Jewish revolt that erupted because he had renamed Jerusalem as the Colonia Aelia Capitolina, after his family name, for having a temple dedicated to Jupiter Capitolinus erected there and for forbidding circumcision, a custom he perceived as barbaric, despite not being hostile to Judaism. The revolt was very bloody and led by Simon bar Kochba, who lost his life in the last battle. In internal politics Hadrian gave his best, eliminating unnecessary expenses and undertaking magnificent public works, not only in Rome. He also asked his jurists to collect all edicts that would ensure greater justice for the weaker, but went to the disadvantage of the Senate, which responded with conspiracies. Hadrian managed to escape these attempts and sent all the conspirators to death, earning himself a very bad reputation. For this he publicly apologized and engaged in a series of food concessions to the

Born to a daughter of Gordian I, sister of Gordian II, because of the young age at which he came to occupy the throne (13), Gordian did not rule directly, but the Senate did so for him. Gordian had become prince because the Senate needed to placate an uprising of the traditionalist urban plebs, bound to the dynastic ideal, and in order to take advantage of his family's wealth. Moreover, the praetorians had acclaimed him emperor just to show the Senate that they were the ones who decided who to put on the throne. Among the first moves was the dismissal of the legion in Africa because it had supported Capellianus and led to the deaths of Gordian I and II, who were deified. During his relatively long tenure there were several problems to deal with. In 240 Sabinianus, elected caesar in Carthage, prepared to make war on him, but was stopped by the governor of Mauretania. In the north the barbarians were making constant raids and sacking villages and towns. Gordian was too young to face these problems, but fortunately for him he could count on the diplomatic and military skill of Timesitheus, who had become prefect of the praetorium and granted him his daughter, Tranquillina, in marriage in 241. Rome succeeded in repelling the Persians of Shapur I in 243 thanks to Timesitheus, but on his death he was replaced as prefect of the praetorium by Marcus Julius Philip known as 'the Arab'. The latter, however, was not satisfied with this title but aimed at the throne, and he convinced the army that they needed an adult prince and not a boy. Gordian showed maturity and offered to cede the throne to Philip and become his caesar, but he was killed in 244. The Senate was informed that he had died of wounds sustained in a battle against the Persians. His body was sent to Rome where he was deified Condition: Good very fine. Weight: 5.15 g. Almost nothing is known about Johannes Primicerius except that he died in Aquileia in 425 and was the chief of the congregation of notaries, the civil officials of the Western Empire. When Emperor Honorius died in 423, Theodosius' nephew, Theodosius II, delayed choosing a successor, perhaps thinking of reuniting the two empires under his own command. Castinus, an esteemed victorious general against the Visigoths, obtained from the Senate the proclamation of Johannes and the appointment of consul for himself. With this gesture, however, Castinus made himself an enemy Theodosius and of Galla Placidia, who probably wanted to have Valentinian, who was then four years old, elected and become his mentor. Johannes' brief reign was marked by tolerance for all non-Christian confessions, unlike the previous emperors of the lineage of Theodosius. Praised by Procopius of Caesarea for his temperance and intelligence. But rebellions were not long in coming: the military garrison of Arles rose up and assassinated the prefect of the praetorium, while Bonifatius rebelled in Africa, blocking grain supplies directed to Rome. Johannes then attempted to make peace with Theodosius, who instead confirmed the appointment of Valentinian III and Galla Placidia and began the conflict. Johannes in 424 sent his collaborator Flavius Aetius to seek military support from the Huns, and closed in on Ravenna. The Eastern army, however, easily descended into Italy and besieged the city, which fell thanks to the corruption of the garrison. Johannes was captured and deposed, then sent to Aquileia where he was beheaded. A few days later Aetius arrived with a large Hunnic contingent, but he came to an agreement with Galla Placidia: the Huns were paid off and sent back home, while Aetius became magister militum. When Justinian II returned to the throne of Constantinople in 711, he decided to punish Cherson, the place of his exile. The city reacted with a revolt headed by Bardanes, who was acclaimed basileus under the name of Philippicus. He marched to Constantinople and deposed the emperor. However, his empire was not very successful and was short-lived. Philippicus was an ardent monothelite and immediately declared monothelism to be the only orthodox doctrine. He also had paintings of the Sixth Ecumenical Council destroyed, replacing them with his own effigy and that of Patriarch Sergius, the father of monothelism. Pope Constantine I reacted harshly and proclaimed a sort of 'damnatio memoriae' of the emperor, forbidding the use of his name in official acts. Philippicus was in effect the first iconoclast in Byzantine history, although this was not yet a true condemnation of icons. The biggest problem, however, was the Bulgarians pressing in from the north and the Arabs from the south. At that point the Opsikion 'thema,' a military district in Anatolia, rebelled against him and had him captured, also because of the emperor's faith. Philippicus was blinded and died in prison. Artemius was an imperial secretary during the reign of Philippicus before overthrowing him in 713, ascending the throne as Anastasius II. He immediately took an oath of orthodoxy to move away from the religious views of his predecessor, of monothete faith, in order to realign with tradition. Foreign policy posed a greater danger, as the Arabs were expanding into Asia Minor in the absence of a solid Byzantine dynasty. Anastasius thus organised a great naval expedition to Rhodes, but an internal betrayal led to his defeat and the rebels appointed a new emperor, a tax collector named Theodosius. Anastasius then faced a civil war, which ended after six months when the rebels prevailed with the help of the Ostrogoths. 
