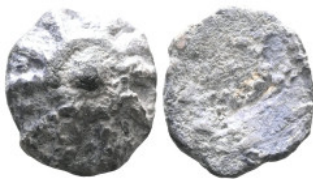

Britannicus, the son of Emperor Claudius and Valeria Messalina, was born in AD 41 and received his name from the Senate after his father declined the title following Britain's conquest. When Messalina married Gaius Silius in AD 48, who planned to adopt Britannicus and usurp Claudius, the emperor had her executed. Claudius later married his niece Agrippina, Nero's mother, who pushed for Nero's favor over Britannicus. Despite being named co-heir, Britannicus was overshadowed by Nero's influence. Agrippina, fearing Britannicus' potential as he approached adulthood, arranged his poisoning during a banquet in AD 54, falsely attributed to epilepsy by Nero. The obverse of this coin can be associated with a number of reverses on the issues of Antiochos IV Epiphanes, King of Commagene from 38 to 72 (as RPC 3855, 3861 and 3862). The reverse design of a hand holding scales seems, however, to be a copy of the type found on the quadrantes of Claudius that were minted in 41-43 (RIC 85, 89 and 91). Why this type was chosen is entirely unclear, since the Claudian type almost certainly relates to an obscure monetary reform carried out early during his reign; what its significance can be for Armenia Minor - or for Aristobulus - can only be guessed. The Romans' first experience with elephants was during the Pyrrhic Wars (280-275 BC) against the combined forces of Tarentum and those of Pyrrhus of Epirus. Other than the initial shock and confusion elephants caused to the opposing forces experiencing them for the first time during battle, their military value was largely negligent. In fact, according to numerous ancient sources, they often proved dangerous to the side having them; elephants could be turned by archers and peltasts, as once feeling the sting of dozens of arrows and sling bullets the animals would turn and run amok, rampaging through their own lines causing more harm to their own troops than they ever did to the enemy. This coin whose reverse depicts an armored elephant majestically marching in procession commemorates the benevolence of the emperor, whose role as provider of public spectacles (munera) is captured by the reverse legend, MVNIFICENTIA AVG. While the year this coin was struck, AD 148-149, could have been celebrated as a Roman centenary in which the primary events would have been the centennial games, or ludes saeculares, it seems that Pius did not host them. Instead, he celebrated his decennialia, his tenth year anniversary on the throne. Presumably, the armored elephant depicted here formed part of the military parade through the streets of Rome that would have occurred during Pius' decannalian celebrations. Publius Helvius Pertinax (1 August 126-28 March 193) was Roman emperor for the first three months of 193. Pertinax, born Publius Helvius Pertinax on August 1, AD 126, in Alba Pompeia (modern-day Alba, Italy), was a Roman emperor who ruled for a brief but significant period in AD 193. His reign came during a time of extreme instability and is most remembered for his attempts to restore discipline and order to the Roman Empire after the chaotic and decadent rule of Emperor Commodus. Pertinax came from a humble background, the son of a freedman, which was relatively uncommon for someone who would eventually become emperor. Despite his modest origins, Pertinax pursued a military career and steadily rose through the ranks due to his competence and dedication. He served in various provinces across the Roman Empire, earning respect as a capable soldier and administrator. His career included important posts such as governor of several key provinces and a consulship, which was a mark of high prestige. When Commodus was assassinated on December 31, AD 192, Pertinax was chosen by the conspirators to succeed him, largely because of his reputation for integrity and his experience in governance. He was proclaimed emperor on January 1, AD 193. Pertinax immediately set about trying to reverse the excesses of Commodus's reign. He initiated reforms to restore discipline in the Roman military, reduce the excessive spending that had drained the imperial treasury, and bring stability to the empire. However, these efforts were met with resistance, particularly from the Praetorian Guard, the elite soldiers responsible for the emperor's protection. The Guard, which had become accustomed to the lax discipline and financial indulgences under Commodus, resented Pertinax's strict measures and attempts to curb their power. Additionally, Pertinax's refusal to pay them the large sums of money they had expected as a reward for his elevation to emperor only increased their hostility. On March 28, AD 193, just 86 days into his reign, members of the Praetorian Guard stormed the imperial palace. Despite attempts to negotiate with them, Pertinax was assassinated. His death plunged the empire into further chaos, leading to what is known as the Year of the Five Emperors, a period marked by civil war and rapid changes in leadership. Pertinax's brief reign is often seen as a tragic attempt to restore moral and fiscal discipline to an empire that had been deeply corrupted. His death demonstrated the overwhelming power of the Praetorian Guard, which could make or break

The "Thermae of Caracalla," also known as the Baths of Caracalla, was a massive public bathing complex built in ancient Rome during the reign of Emperor Caracalla. Construction of the Baths of Caracalla began around AD 212 and was completed in AD 217, shortly after Caracalla's death. The sudden death of Britannicus shortly before his fourteenth birthday is reported by all extant sources as being the result of poisoning on Nero's orders; as Claudius' biological son, he represented a threat to Nero's claim to the throne. 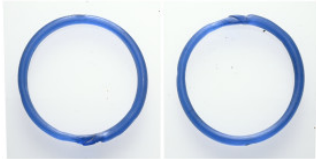

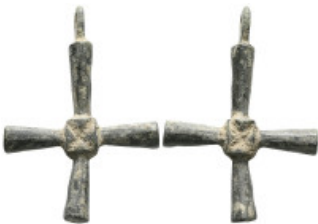
