May he baptize you with water. The Holy Spirit ' Mark 8 In seals from this period, he is usually depicted with his arms open and fingers together at shoulder height. This depiction on the seal suggests that he prayed to God to purify people from their sins after baptizing them. It is thought that the seal was sent to a person, a group or a city for people to be baptized. God help the people of Arkadion (Crete or Pisidia) to baptize. The fact that it starts with BAPTE for the first time on a seal makes the work unique. The word baptism comes from the ancient Greek word Bap'tizo, meaning to immerse in water or liquid. The last prophet of the Old Testament and the first saint of the New Testament, he is known by the name of John the Baptist.
