

3 Middle Danube Tribes "Kugelwange" type. AR Drachm (15mm, 2,17g.) Imitating the types of Philip II of Macedon. 3rd. Century BC. ized laureate head of Zeus right within wreath. Rev. Celticized horse prancing left; pellet-in-annulet above, cross below. Lanz 507. Nicely toned, good very fine. Interesting portrait stylization of Zeus.



4 Middle Danube Tribes, AR Obol (8mm, 0,50g.). 'Kapostaler' type 2nd.-1st. Century. Celticized head of laureate Zeus to right. Rev. Horse galloping to left. Göbl, OTA pl 39, 506. Lanz 835. About good very fine. Scarce with excellent metal grade, nicely toned.



5 Central European Tribes, Boii. 1st. Century BC. AR Obol (9,5 mm, 0,77 g.) Athena-Alkis-series. Celticized male head to right. Rev. Stylized Athena Alkis standing front, head to left, holding spear in her right hand and shield in her left. Dembski -. Flesche -. Lanz -. LT 9484. OTA -. Paulsen 182. Rarely seen in this grade of preservation with very clear image, some insignificant scratches, otherwise, good very fine.

6 Calabria, Tarentum, circa. 302-280 BC. AR Diobol (11mm, 1.08g.). Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. Herakles wrestling the Nemean Lion. HN Italy 976; Vlasto 1315. With a nice old cabinet tone. Very Fine. Lovely scene displaying the first labor of Herakles.

7 Calabria, Tarentum, circa 325-280 BC. AR Litra (7mm, 0,31g.). Shell seen from above. Rev. Dophin. Historia Numorum Italy 979. Good Very Fine with a nice iridescent old cabinet tone and very well centered and defined image of the shell.

8 Lucania, Thurium, circa 443-400 BC, AR Diobol (12mm, 0,97 g.) Head of Athena right, wearing wreathed Attic helmet. Rev. ΘΟΥΡΙΩΝ Bull walking right in exelgue fish to right. SNG Munich 1179. Very Fine.

9 Cimmerian Bosporos, Pantikapaion, circa 480-470 BC. AR Obol (8 mm, 0,47 g.). Head of lion facing. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 7, 40. MacDonald 1/7. Very fine with an old cabinet tone.

10 Kings of Skythia, Kanites, Circa 210-195 BC. AE (14mm, 2,63g.). Laureate head of bearded Zeus right. Rev. Cornucopiae; BA Σ IA [E $\Omega\Sigma$] to right, [KANITOY] to left, [BAK] below. SNG Stancomb 307; Draganov 2010, 23; Draganov 2015, 102; HGC 3.2, Good very fine. Rare.

11 Thracian Tribe, Odrysai. 2nd Century BC. (18 mm, 4,28 g.). Head of youthful Herakles to right, wearing lion's skin headdess. Rev. $O\Delta PY\Sigma\Omega N$ Bull standing left on club left, head turned slightly facing. HGC 3, 1667 corr. Peykov A 5050. Lovely light green patina. Good very fine. Very fine near to the classical greek portrait of Herakles unusual for this type. Scarce.

12 Kings of Thrace, Kersebleptes, circa 359-340 BC. (11mm, 1,91g.). Kypsela. Female head right, wearing sphendone. K-E-P; two-handled cup, grain-ear below. SNG Copenhagen 1070-1. Unusually well centered with all letters perfectly readable, about good very fine.



13 Thrace, Maroneia, circa 398/7 - 386/5 BC. AR Triobol (14mm, 2,70g.). Forepart of horse to right, $MO\Lambda-\Pi-O$ in the fields. Rev. MA EIII Grape bunch on vine; all within dotted linear square in shallow incuse square. Schönert-Geiss, Maroneia 303ff. Good very fine, an attractive example with a nice old cabinet tone nicely contrasting to the interesting motives.



14 Thrace, Maroneia, circa 189/8-49/5 BC. AE (25 mm, 20,0g.). Head of youthful Dionysos to right wearing tainia and wreath of ivy and fruit. Rev. ΔΙΟΝΥΣΟΥ - ΣΩΤΗΡΟΣ / ΜΑΡΩΝΙΤΩΝ Dionysos standing front, head to left, holding grapes in his right hand and narthex stalks in his left; in inner left field, monogram. Schönert-Geiss 1354-1405. SNG Copenhagen 643. Good very fine.



15 Thrace, Dikaia, circa 480-450 BC. AR Trihemiobol (9 mm, 0,74 g.). Rooster moving to right. Rev. Head of bearded Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress; all in shallow incuse square. Jameson 1056. May, Dikaia-By-Abdera, 37. Schönert-Geiss, Bisanthe, 55. Nice late Archaic- early classical style. The head of Herakles on the reverse off center, only face well visible, otherwise, very fine. Scarce.



16 Islands off Thrace, Thasos. ca. 550-478 BC. AR Drachm (15 mm. 3,64 g.). Ithyphallic satyr advancing right, carrying off protesting nymph, her hand showing thumb and one finger. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider 3; HGC 6, 332; SNG Cop. 1014-1016. Good Very Fine, well center and very attractive archaic style.

17 Islands off Thrace, Thasos. ca. 550-478 BC. AR Drachm (16 mm. 3,83 g.). Ithyphallic satyr advancing right, carrying off protesting nymph, her hand showing thumb and one finger. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider 3; HGC 6, 332; SNG Cop. 1014-1016. Very Fine. An early issue of a nice archaic style.

18 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, 500-480 BC. AR Trihemiobol (13mm, 1,26 g.). Archaic ithyphallic satyr running right, masturbating. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Rosen 145; SNG Copenhagen 192 (Lete) earlier attributed to Lete (Macedon). Good very fine, the upper part of the head is off center, otherwise, very well defined attractive masculine body of the satyr with typical archaic 'knee run' in erotic posture.



19 Island off Thrace, Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Trihemiobol (11 mm, 0,79 g.). Bald satyr kneeling left, holding kantharos in his right hand and resting his left on his hip. Rev. $\Theta A\Sigma$ -I ΩN Large amphora with high handles; all within shallow incuse square. HGC 6, 351. Le Rider, Thasiennes, 27. Klein 112. SNG Copenhagen 1029. Good very fine.



20 Islands off Thrace, Thasos. Circa 500-480 BC. AR Obol (8 mm. 0,32 g). Two dolphins swimming in opposite directions, pellets around. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 9; HGC 6, 337; BMC 18-22. Very fine, small and insignificant part of the field below is missing (presumably broken in antiquity) but the image is clear and intact, nicely defined.



21 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 435-411 BC. AR Hemiobol (7 mm. 0,30 g). Dolphin swimming right, pellets around. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 6, 338. BMC 23. HGC 6, 338. Le Rider, Thasiennes 10. About good very fine. Unusually well centered and nicely toned.

22 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Tritartemorion (8 mm. 0,41 g). Bald and bearded head of satyr to right. Rev. $\Theta A \Sigma$ Two dolphins, one above the other, swimming left and right; all within shallow incuse. HGC 6, 340. Le Rider, Thasiennes 12. SNG Cop 1033-1034. Lightly toned. Very fine.

23 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Hemiobol (7 mm, 0.22 g.). Head of nymph to left. Rev. $\Theta A\Sigma$ Dolphin swimming to left. HGC 6, 341. Le Rider, Thasiennes 13. SNG Copenhagen 1035. Good very fine with a nice old cabinet tone. Rare type.

24 Islands off Thrace, Thasos. Ca. 168/7-148 BC. AR Tetradrachm (29 mm, 16,42 g.). Head of youthful Dionysos to right, wreathed with ivy. Rev. HPAK Λ EOY Σ $\Sigma\Omega$ THPO Σ Θ A Σ I Ω N, Herakles standing left, resting right hand on club set on ground and holding lion's skin draped over left arm; H to inner left. SNG Oxford 3699; ANS 1944.100.16781 Nice yellowish mint hues, very clear, defined image, excellent grade of the silver. Struck in high relief, Extremely Fine.

25 Macedon, Philippi (as Thasian Epeiros, Krenides). Circa 360-356 BC. AE (10mm, 1,31g.). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. Club and bow; $\Theta A\Sigma ION$ above, H $\Pi EIPO$ below. Le Rider, Thasiennes 30; Bellinger, Philippi 2; Le Rider, Thasiennes 29; AMNG II/2, 1; SNG ANS 646; HGC 3.1, 626. Good very fine, unusually well defined with a nice black patina. Rare.

26 Islands off Thasos, Thasos, circa 2nd. - 1st. Century BC. AE (21 mm, 8,56 g.). Diademed and draped bust of Artemis to right, bow and quiver over shoulder. Rev. $\Theta A \Sigma I \Omega N$ Herakles nude, but lionskin tied around neck and falling over his shoulders, advancing to right, drawing bow about to shoot an arrow. BMC Thrace pg. 225, 105 var. SNG Cop. 1057-59 var. Le Rider 60 var. Lovely details, beautiful olive green patina, about good very fine.

27 Macedon, Neapolis, circa 500-480 BC. AR Stater (19 mm, 9,61 g.). Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. AMNG III.2, 1. HGC 3.1, 582. SNG ANS 400. SNG Copenhagen 222. Fourée and as a such unusually heavy, almost like the standart of the classical stater, very well centered. A few minor areas of corrosion on the silver surface.



28 Macedon. Neapolis. Circa 424-350 BC. AR Hemidrachm (16 mm, 1,66 g.). Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue. Rev. N-E / O- Π Head of the nymph of Neapolis to right, her hair coiled around her head and with a bun at the back, wearing a plain necklace with a pendant. SNG ANS 430-454. Struck on unusually broad flan, perfectly centered, some natural edge splits, otherwise, good very fine.



29 Thraco-Macedonian Region. Berge (previously Lete or Siris). Circa 525-480 BC. Hemihekte or 1/12 Stater (9 mm, 1.13 g.). Satyr crouching to right; in the field, three pellets. Rev. Irregular incuse square. HGC 3, I, 534. Psoma, Lete Reconsidered, 9. Toned and unusually nice, with a fine, archaic style of the satyr struck in high relief. Good very fine.



30 Thraco-Macedonian Region. Berge (previously Lete or Siris). Circa 525-480 BC. AR Trihemiobol or 1/8 Stater (13 mm, 0,98 g.). Satyr crouching to right; in fields, pellets. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square divided diagonally. HGC 3, 536. Peykov A0110. Smith Group 7. Good very fine and perfectly centered.



31 Thraco-Macedonian Tribes. Mygdones or Krestones. Circa 485-480 BC. 1/8 Stater (11 mm, 0,87 g.). Goat kneeling right, his head turned back to left; above and below dotts. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Lorber, Goats, Issue 6. SNG ANS 59ff var. Earlier known as Aigai. Good fery fine, unusually well centered.

32 Macedon. Eion. Circa 480-470 BC. AR Diobol (9 mm, 0,78 g.). Goose standing to right, head turned to left. Rev. Rough incuse square. SNG ANS 272. Nicely toned, good very fine. Very well struck on a thick flan in high relief and lovely Archaic style.



33 Macedon. Eion. Circa 460-400 BC. AR Trihemiobol (14 mm, 0,87 g.). Goose standing to right, head turned back to left; above, lizard to left. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 3.1, 521. SNG ANS 278-84. Perfectly struck on very broad flan in high relief, extremely fine.



34 Macedon, Tragilos. Circa 420-400 BC. AE (10mm, 1,22g.). Head of Hermes to right, wearing petasos. Rev. [T-P-A-I] in quarters of quadripartite division. AMNG III/2, 4 var. (arrangement of legend); SNG ANS 905-6 var.; HGC 3.1, 750 var. Very fine.



35 Macedon, Akanthos. Circa 430-390 BC. AR Tetrobol (15mm, 2,09 g.). Forepart of bull to left, head reverted. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square with granulated recesses. AMNG III/2, 33; SNG ANS 33-4; HGC 3.1, 392. Good Very fine with perfectly clear details, rare for this difficult type and lovely old cabinet tone.



36 Thraco-Macedonian Region, Ennea Hodoi (?). Circa 500-480 BC. AR Stater (15 mm, 8,43 g.). Cow standing right, head turned back to left; below, calf kneeling right; above cow, pellet. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square, divided diagonally. SNG ANS 924. Very fine. Very rare and darkly toned.



37 Macedon, Amphipolis. Circa 357-353 BC. AE Dichalkon (11 mm, 1,53 g.), struck under Philip II. Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. A-M / Φ -I Lighted race torch, within linear square. SNG Copenhagen 48; HGC 3.1, 438. A flan defect, otherwise, about very fine.

41 Macedon, Uranopolis. Circa 300 BC. AE (17 mm, 2,24 g.). Eight-pointed star and crescent. Rev. OYPANI $\Delta\Omega$ - $\PiO\Lambda$ E $\Omega\Sigma$ Zeus-Ouranios seated slightly to left on globe, holding scepter in his right hand. AMNG III, 3. SNG ANS 914-918. SNG Copenhagen 458. Very Fine.



42 Macedon, Orthagoreia, circa. 350 BC. AE (14 mm, 2,18 g.). Laureate head of Apollo right. Rev. OPΘAΓ-OPEIΩN, Macedonian helmet. SNG ANS 569; BMC 6. Nice green patina, very fine. Scarce



43 Macedon, Olynthos. Circa 460-432 BC. AR Tetrobol (16mm, 2,28 g.). Bridled horse standing right; Ionic column in background. Rev. OΛ YN Eagle, holding serpent in beak, upright within incuse square. AMNG III/2, 1; HGC 3, 597. Very fine. Rare.



X-A- $\Lambda/KI\Delta/E\Omega N$ Lyre with seven strings, and with a small tripod resting on the cross bar. Good very fine with a nice old cabinet tone. HGC 3, 498. Robinson & Clement, Group M. Of highest Classical style.

45 Chalkidian League. Olynthos. Circa 410-401 BC. AR Tetrobol (15 mm, 2.30 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. X-A-A-KIΔ-EΩN Lyre with seven strings; all within a shallow incuse square. SNG ANS 527. Good very fine. Of excellent style.

46 Macedon. Chalkidian League. Circa 425-420 BC. AR Obol (10mm, 1.07g.). Olynthos mint. Laureate head of Apollo right. Rev. Tripod. Unpublished in the standard references. Single known sold by CNG Electronic Auction 406, Lot Nr. 109. Slightly rough surface, evenly toned, very fine. Very Rare.

47 Macedon, Chalkidian League, Olynthos. Circa 432-348 BC. AR Trihemiobol (7 mm, 0,21 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to left. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square; in each quarter, saltire cross surrounded by four pellets. SNG ANS 1007 (as uncertain Macedon). Almost extremely fine. Rare issue, unusually well centered and preserved, evenly toned. Of a fine classical style.

48 Macedon, Chalkidian League. Circa 432-348 BC. AE (15 mm, 3,89g.). Minted in Olynthos. Laureate head of Apollo to left. Rev. XAΛKIΔEΩN Kithara with four strings. SNG ANS 551. Almost good very fine. With a bold and particularly artistic head of Apollo.

Good very fine. Rare.

Φ I/IIIIIIOY Young, nude rider holding palm branch and reins, riding horse to right; below raised foreleg, Λ . Another monogram with A within a square frame. SNG ANS 633-4. Le Rider pl. 45, 6. Good very fine. Unusually fine portrait for a posthmous issue. About good very fine.



52 Kings of Macedon. Philip II, 359-336 BC. AR 1/5 Tetradrachm (14 mm, 2.42 g.). Amphipolis, struck under Antipater, Polyperchon, or Kassander, circa 323/2-316/5 BC. Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. Φ I/IIIIIOY Youth on horseback to right; below, AN. Le Rider pl. 45, 29. SNG ANS 622-4. Very fine. With a fine classical portrait.



53 Kings of Macedon, Philip II 359-336 BC. AE (20mm, 7,05g.). Uncertain mint in Macedon, Diademed male head to left. Rev. Youth on horseback to right; Φ I/AIIITIOY above, lion's head below. SNG ANS 872-4 ; HGC 3.1, 885. Reverse slightly struck off center, otherwise, good very fine. Rarer issue with head to left and rider galloping to left.
