THRACE.Apollonia Pontica. Drachm (AR, 14 mm, 2.49 g), late 5th–4th century BC. Upright anchor, crayfish to right / Gorgoneion facing. SNG BMC Black Sea 157 var. (no A). Rare variant without 'A'. Very fine.



3 THRACE.Byzantion. Alliance coinage with Kalchedon. AE (25 mm, 10.59 g), late 3rd–2nd century BC. Wreathed and veiled head of Demeter right / BYZANTI – KAΛXA Δ O Poseidon seated right on rock, holding aphlaston in his right hand and trident in his left hand; Δ A in inner right field. Schönert-Geiss 1257–1262. SNG BM Black Sea 82. Of unusually fine style and with a beautiful dark patina. Minor areas of corrosion, otherwise extremely fine.



THRACE.Chersonesos. Hemidrachm (AR, 14 mm, 2.55 g), c. 386–338 BC. Forepart of lion right, head reverted / Quadripartite incuse square, pellet and facing bull's head in opposite quarters. McClean –; SNG Copenhagen –. Minor earthen deposits. Good very fine.



5 KINGS OF MACEDON.Alexander III 'the Great' (336–323 BC). Tetradrachm (AR, 27 mm, 17.21 g), Arados mint, struck under Menes or Laomedon, 324/3–320 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin / BAΣIΛΕΩΣ – AΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ Zeus seated left on throne, holding long sceptre in his left hand and eagle standing right with closed wings in his right hand; kerykeion in the left field, AP monogram below throne. Price 3332. Nicely toned and very fine style and detail. Good very fine.

Cista mystica with half-open lid from which a serpent issues to the left; ivy wreath with fruits around / Two serpents coiled around a bow case; IΓ (date) above EΦE in the left field; torch in the right field; kerykeion between serpents' heads; C AT – IN – C F below. Kleiner, Ephesus 19. Very rare! Minor pitting. Good very fine. The earliest cistophoric tetradrachm bearing the name of a Roman magistrate. C. Atinius Labeo was praetor and is known for trying to have the censor Q. Caecilius Metellus Macedonicus thrown off the Tarpeian Rock for expelling him from the Senate (Livy, Per. LIX.10).

SC 2061.4d. Nicely toned. Good very fine.



PERSIA.Achaemenid Empire. Time of Artaxerxes II to Darios III (c. 400–332 BC). Tetartemorion (AR, 6 mm, 0.24 g), Kolophon(?) mint. Persian king or hero in kneeling/running stance right, holding dagger in his left hand and bow in his right hand / Helmeted head of Athena left. Corfù Type 1.1. Toned. Rough surface. Very fine.



PERSIA.Achaemenid Empire. Time of Xerxes II to Artaxerxes II (c. 420–375 BC). Siglos (AR, 14 mm, 5.48 g), Sardes or subsidiary mint; Lydo-Milesian standard.
