## Auktionsbedingungen

## Conditions of Sale

*The following terms and conditions are accepted by all persons participating in the auction:*

1. Auction bidding is conducted in Swiss Francs. The highest bidder who has been acknowledged by the auctioneer when the hammer falls after the third call, has legally bought the lot (for e-auctions there will be a virtual auctioneer). Bidding usually begins at 80% of the estimate, provided no higher offers have been submitted. Written bids have priority over telephone and electronic bids. The successful bidder has committed himself personally to the purchases made. He cannot claim to have acted on behalf of a third party.
2. Absentee bidders can send bids electronically until the start of the sale. Bidders wishing to send a written bid by email, fax or participate by telephone must send their bids no later than 24 hours before the start of the auction. All bids are final and binding. Telephone bidders must agree that calls may be recorded. The auction house does not take responsibility for bidding mandates made by telephone, electronically or in writing.
3. Bidders must show proof of identification before the auction, and subsequently register. The Auction House may require a bank reference and/or guarantee. The Auction House reserves the right to deny a person from participating in the auction.

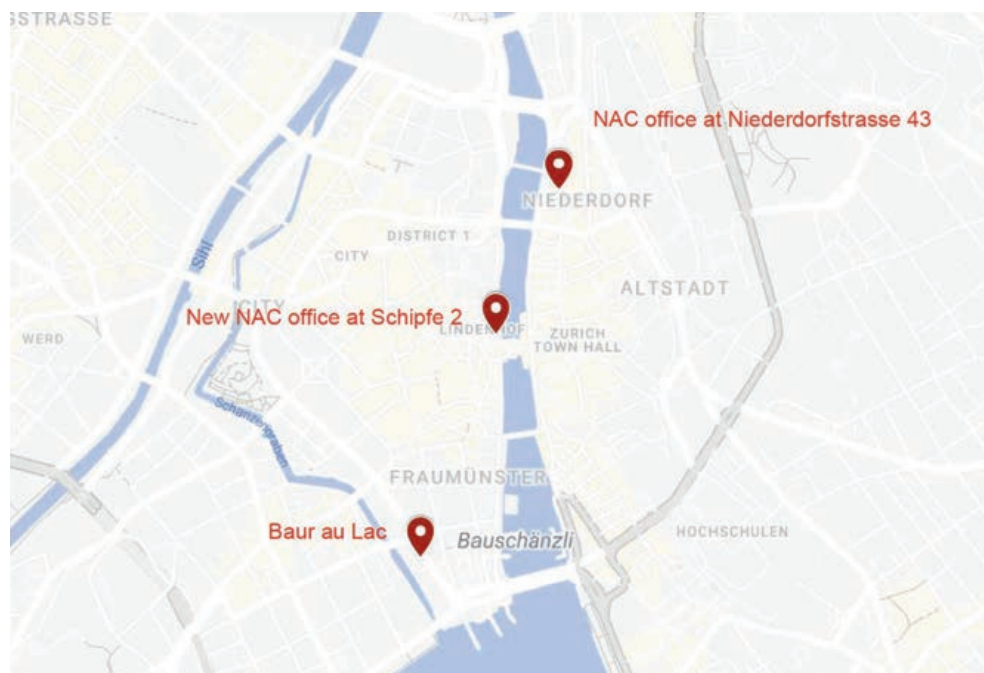

## Geoffrey Cope – A Good Friend

Geoffrey and I first met on eBay over twenty years ago when I found myself regularly outbid on decent coins by someone called 'fdcoinonly'. After the fifth or sixth occasion, a message landed in my inbox - 'Are you a copper collector?' - a rhetorical question given we had both just bid over twice book on an unusually nice and lustrous 1718 halfpenny (Part I, lot 1379)!

With contact established and clearly similar interests, our conversations in the first four or five years were irregular due to our workloads, but after that we routinely chatted three or four times a week, often way into the night, discussing the latest offerings and mulling over what was suitable for our collections, and perhaps more importantly, what was not. Very little eluded his critical eye, with potential purchases closely examined several times in case something was missed. He was also unrelenting in his searches for material. If it had good eye appeal, he was interested. If it also had a story to tell, he was even more enthusiastic, but quality was key with few exceptions.

His generosity in making pieces from his collection available for exhibitions and museums for public appreciation is well known, but he was also generous on a personal level, often drawing my attention to an item he thought would be of interest and sometimes buying it if I declined. One day in 2011 he acquired a coin in the US which, unbeknown to him, happened to be a significant gap in my own collection. That evening, without hesitating, he offered it to me at cost, which I accepted with gratitude. Very few collectors would do that.

In 2013 I was privileged to be invited to view the collection, list the contents, find those that needed upgrading and point out any gaps that needed to be filled. That was two or three weeks of pure pleasure as box after box of coins, medals and tokens were placed before me. The fruits of fifty years selective buying became apparent as many envelopes were opened with a murmur of 'Ooh, that's nice', and more than a few with 'Hmm, I wanted that one'! Needless to say, I only found a handful of pieces worth improving, and most of those were off limits for personal reasons.

We last met in person at the end of 2016 when he had flown in to visit his family, not knowing what the future would bring. As 2017 progressed, it became clear he was unwell, and although our conversations gradually tailed off in the final few months, his enthusiasm remained to the end. It was with great sadness that I received the news he had passed.

He always said that if he could inspire ten people to collect coins, he had done his bit for securing the future of the hobby. Whether he did will never be known, but it would be a fitting epitaph for a discerning collector and a good friend. Thank you, Geoffrey.
