

Suisse de 8.1% sur les monnaies et les médailles d'argent et de bronze. Tous droits et taxes dus à l'étranger sont à la charge de l'acheteur. Le paiement est dû immédiatement après l'adjudication. 1% d'intérêt sera facturé en cas de retard. Le transfert de propriété n'est effectif qu'après le paiement intégral. A montant égal, les ordres d'achat écrits sont prioritaires.

#### Conditions of Sale

The auction sales are in Swiss Francs with the addition of buyer's premium of 20% on the hammer price. For all lots delivered in Switzerland there is an additional Swiss VAT of 8.1% due on the hammer price and on the buyer's premium for silver and bronze coins, and for medals. The purchaser is responsible for all taxes and fees due for delivery of lots outside of Switzerland. Payment is due immediately following conclusion of the sale. Full title to purchases is only obtained upon full payment. A charge of 1% per month will be assessed for delayed payments. Written bids take preference over room bids.

Buyers are personally responsible for their own purchases and cannot claim to act on the account or instructions of a third party. Adjudication occurs on the fall of the hammer and commits the bidder to acceptance of the lot.

The lot descriptions, including the degree of preservation, are opinions and made in good faith. The authenticity of all coins is guaranteed. Justified complaints can only be considered if made within eight days of receipt of the pieces. Third party grading services certification (e.g. NGC, PCGS, ANACS, etc.) is not sufficient cause for any return of purchased items. The opinion of the International Bureau for the Suppression of Counterfeit Coins (IBSCC) of the International Association of Professional Numismatists (IAPN) will be deemed definitive for issues of authenticity. Upon receipt of full payment, shipment of lots will be arranged for the purchaser athis expense and risk. In general, the usual conditions applied to auctions held in Zürich applyhere.

Shipping to the Russian Federation will only be made at the recipient's own risk.

Exclusive jurisdiction for any legal proceedings shall be Zürich I. Although the Conditions of Sale are provided in English, French and German, only the German text is legally valid. The bidder accepts these conditions of sale by the submission of a bid, whether verbal or written.

#### Foreword

A little more than a year ago, on 5 November 2023, in our Auction 29, we presented the second part (lots 55I-940) of the Collection sans Pareille of Ancient Greek Fractions. The first part, lots I-550, had been sold in our Auction 26, which took place on 26 May of the same year. Now we have the honour to present the final part of this fabulous collection as lots 94I-I692 in our specially dedicated eSale, Obolos 35. As before, thanks to DG's photographic skill, all the coins look their enlarged best, no matter their condition. In addition, unlike the first two sales, this one includes a few bronzes, which were acquired for study purposes.

The sale begins with a pleasing lot of 5 coins of the Coriosolites (94I – which the owner must have acquired because of the totally un-Greek stylistic exuberance!) and then moves on to Massalia (942–953), Magna Graecia (954–1032), Sicily (1033–1119), the Black Sea area, Thrace and Macedon (1120–1240). Lots 124I–1358 cover Classical Greece, extending from Herakleia Trachineia in Thessaly to Koressos on the Cycladic island of Keos. Then we are off to Asia Minor with lots 1359–1661; beginning with a group of coins from uncertain mints (1359–1376) we proceed from Paphlagonia (1360) through Cilicia (1607–1661). Finally, the last 30 lots, 1662 to 1692 range from Cyprus to Cyrene.

Frankly, there are so many really interesting coins in this group that if we started singling them out we would have to fill pages and pages! And there are numerous coins that have intriguing pedigrees – and those are only the ones we found, further research may turn up even more. To sum up, this last portion of a special and unique collection proves just how remarkable that collection was. Filled with 'tiny' coins that were beautiful and plain, known and unknown, simple and mysterious, unusually fine and worn, there will never be another collection like this! We wish the best of luck to all those bidding in this sale.

While Vlasto 1437 and 1439 both are included within D'Andrea, Miglioli, Tafuri and Vonghia's Diobols, Series G, Type 218 (with EYΦ between the legs of Herakles), Vlasto 1438 is part of the much rarer Type 219 (no letters between the legs). Ravel most probably missed this differentiating element when compiling his catalogue and, thus, mixed up the order of the coins.

What an unusual fractional issue from Tarentum! Here the obverse sports two crescents surround by three pellets (as opposed to the usual two or four, cf. Vlasto 1756 ff), while the reverse has the type of an early trias (Vlasto 1189 ff). HN notes under the heading for the fractional issues struck c. 450-380 that some of the fractions are probably later, and since the double crescent fractions fall within the series dated to the third century, we have followed the later dating here. The question, however, is what exactly is this? It is certainly not a mule, so it seems that it is most probably some sort of trial issue, perhaps a late trias.

Unfortunately for the Samians, in the spirit of the times some five years later Anaxilas threw them out, replaced them with Peloponnesian colonists, and renamed the city Messana in honour of his own native city, Messene in Messinia.

The superb quality of the obverse of this coin makes it exceptional, even for Syracuse! The city took great pride in its coinage, hiring some of the finest engravers of the age to produce the dies used to make the various denominations its mint produced. This often included what seem to be special issues of fractions, struck from especially finely engraved dies. Apparently this was a Sicilian tradition: what seems to have happened is that wealthy individuals paid for the issuance of litrai as donatives to be given to their fellow citizens; and as a way of marking them out they commissioned the best engravers to produce the dies used to mint them. This is certainly one of those special issues.

This extremely rare coin seems important for settling a long-running attribution dispute concerning similarly rare, but anepigraphic hemiobols featuring a facing gorgoneion and a left-facing Chalkidian helmet (LHS 100, 2007, 197 = Nomos 29, 2023, 677 and CNG e358, 2015, 29 = CNG 78, 2008, 305). These have been attributed variously to Maroneia based on the gorgoneion type and to an agnostic Thraco-Macedonian mint based on the absence of the usual grape vine reverse of Maroneia. The present piece, however, has a partial legend that would suggest that it and the anepigraphic hemiobols actually originated at the mint of Neapolis-a city that also employed gorgoneion types, though often of a much fiercer character. An identical arrangement of the legend occurs on hemidrachms of Neapolis (see SNG ANS 433-434).



Although the obverse type of this coin has always been described as a lion, close inspection reveals that the creature on the obverse is really the mythical Chimaira-a monster composed of parts of a lion, a goat, and a serpent that was slain by the hero Bellerophon and frequently appears as a type on Sikyonian coinage. Traces of the goat's head remain visible here above the lion's shoulder while the tail has a slight protuberance at its tip, representing the tongue of the serpent. The serpentine tail is much clearer on the example sold in Nomos 9, 2014, 132, where the head of the goat seems to have been fully erased.

It is also worth noting that these coins of Prokles bear some of the earliest portraits of a living person.

The gorgoneion was an apotropaic artistic device used throughout the Greek world that was thought to ward off evil. Thus it is often found in mosaics near the front door of houses, on the exteriors of buildings, on amulets and weapons, and especially on coins were it served as a protector of the city issuing the coin. In fact, one of the earliest representations of a gorgoneion comes from an electrum stater discovered during excavations at Parion (see A. A. Potts, The World's Eye, 1982, pp. 26-8). Gorgoneia became so ubiquitous on coinage that they appear as the principal type on coins from no less than thirty-seven cities across the Greek world, from Etruria to the Black Sea region and beyond.
