Eukratides' portrait style influenced later eastern and Roman coinage, underscoring the enduring impact of Hellenistic cultural symbols.

Negotiated on Pheasant Island, a small neutral territory in the Bidasoa River between the two nations, the treaty symbolized a decisive shift in European power dynamics. It ceded Roussillon and northern Cerdanya to France, consolidating French control over parts of modern-day southern France, and parts of Artois, Hainaut, and other territories in the Low Countries. Spain retained control of the Southern Netherlands, but the loss of these territories significantly weakened its influence. The treaty also included a marriage agreement between Louis XIV of France and Maria Theresa of Spain, aimed at cementing peace. However, the dowry disputes arising from this marriage later became one of the factors leading to the War of Devolution (1667-1668). The Treaty of the Pyrenees is a critical moment in European history, as it signaled the decline of Spanish dominance and the rise of France as a major power under Cardinal Mazarin and Louis XIV, laying the groundwork for the later "Age of Absolutism." The study demonstrated that this defect only appears on starless coins. If the hypothesis is confirmed, it would provide an effective method for detecting authentic coins. A New 20 Franc Coin Bearing the Effigy of King Leopold III (1934) Following the accidental death of King Albert on February 17, 1934, the effigy of the late sovereign, which appeared on the silver 20 franc coins that had been issued the previous year, had to be replaced by that of his son, King Leopold III. On March 1, 1934, the Director of the Royal Mint, Hector Verhaeghe, proposed to the Minister of Finance either to commission Godefroid Devreese, the creator of King Albert's effigy, to design a new model, or to invite all Belgian artists to create an effigy of the new sovereign and a new reverse for the silver 20 franc coin. By March 3, 1934, the Minister had already chosen the latter option, and most newspapers published a call for entries for this design competition on March 15, 1934. This call invited participating artists to submit a plaster model along with a sketch or photo of their project by April 15, 1934. A prize of 1,000 francs was promised for the five best designs, with a reward of 10,000 francs for the artist whose model would be selected. Despite strong protests from artists regarding the short execution deadlines, 35 artists still participated in the competition. Unfortunately, the Mint archives do not contain illustrations of all the submitted projects, and it is also difficult to confirm if all candidates indeed submitted their work. Since the projects were later exhibited in the Mint Museum, some artists may have requested to retrieve their entries. We can confirm that the following artists participated in the competition: Georges Adelaere, Achiel Bentos, Auguste Bija, Armand Bonnetain, Jean Canneel, Marc Colmant, Eugène De Bremaecker, Pierre De Soete, Donatien De Zeine, Louis Dupont, Auguste Guaisnet, P. Libert, Alfons Mauquoy, Herman Pick, J.B. Ponsard, Marcel Rau, Leon Sarteel, Pierre Theunis, Jules Van de Veegaete. On April 27, 1934, a jury chaired by Viscount Alois Van de Vyvere selected four projects: those by Alfons Mauquoy, Armand Bonnetain, Pierre Theunis, and Marcel Rau. These artists were then asked to finalize their designs according to the instructions from the jury and the Royal Court. On October 1, 1934, the jury met again and unanimously chose Marcel Rau's project, although he was required to make some adjustments to his design. In addition to the promised prize of 1,000 francs, Bonnetain and Theunis each received an additional remuneration of 1,000 francs, while Mauquoy received an additional 2,500 francs. Marcel Rau received a total of 11,000 francs. On December 24, 1934, the first new coins were struck in

The company was founded by French entrepreneurs, including Gomen and Digeon, and was primarily focused on trade and the exploitation of natural resources in New Caledonia, a French territory in the Pacific Ocean. One of the company's notable contributions was its role in the nickel mining industry, which became a cornerstone of New Caledonia's economy in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The company, through its various ventures, helped pave the way for the exploitation of the island's rich mineral resources.

During the American Revolutionary War (1775-1783), many enslaved Africans fought alongside the British in exchange for promises of freedom. These individuals were known as Black Loyalists. At the end of the war, the British transported thousands of Black Loyalists, as well as other African Americans who had escaped slavery, to Nova Scotia in Canada. Furthermore, it is now theorized that there are two distinct types from Tobago; Type I, crude elongated and slanted crenations (Stack's Bowers Galleries, January 2023 NYINC Auction, Lot 21468) and the Type II, with neat nearly vertical crenations (Stack's Bowers Galleries, January 2023 NYINC Auction, Lot 21377). Plug removal by piercing the center of the coin consisting of 14 or 15 crenation's. Pridmore collection not including 5-1/2 bits (Half dollar) coins, and the Byrne collection mentioned an example attributed to Dominica (Ray Byrne collection, Jess Peters, Sale 78 June 1975, Lot 1214). The 4 reales coin was pierce from the obverse and should be distinct as Type II from Tobago. PCGS founded their opinion based on the Ray Byrne's 4 Reales example from Dominica (which should be considered as "Type II" from Tobago), and denied to certified this coin, which we believe to be an earlier type "Type I" as it has been pierced from the obverse, with crude elongated and slanted crenations (as for the 8 Reales).
