In the 1990s, Dr. Hans Voegtli assumed responsibility for Ancient coins and Dr. Bernhard Schulte for Medieval and modern coins. In 1996, M&M Numismatics opened in Washington, DC with Lucien Birkler as managing director. In 1997, M&M Deutschland opened in Weil am Rein, Germany, with Joachim Stollhoff as managing director. Severin quotes Schubert and Chizhov as stating "Probably struck for Te Deum sung that day [January 10, 1702] in the Cathedral of the Assumption, celebrating Count Boris Sheremetiev's victory near Errastfer and Dorpat." On the 9th of January, 1702 (29 December 1701 by the Julian calendar), a Russian force of some 13,000 regulars and 6,000 irregulars under General Count Boris Petrovich Sheremetev defeated a much smaller Swedish force near the village of Erastfer in Livonia (present-day Erastvere, Estonia). It was Russia's first victory in the Great Northern War. Tsar Peter I received news of Sheremetev's victory the next day, January 10, 1702 (the date found in this Medallic 7 Ducat's legend).

A contemporary and diarist of these events, Ivan Afanasyevich Zhelyabuzhski recalls that "in token of such universal rejoicing [over the victory near Erastfer], Alexander Menshikov was sent on the 14th day of February in this present year of 1702 from Moscow to Pskov [where Sheremetev's headquarters was located at the time] to Lord Boris Petrovich Sheremetiev, with a gracious word and with gold pieces." On the next day, the colonels and the "Chieftains" who had taken part in the battle were given "gold pieces", while all ranks got a Rouble apiece (JRNS, Autumn 1986, p. 22).



Scion of a Baltic-German noble family, Krusenstern joined the Russian navy in 1787, serving in the war against Sweden. He then served in the British Royal Navy from 1793 to 1799. After publishing a paper underscoring the advantages of direct communication by sea between Russia and China by passing Cape Horn, Krusenstern was appointed by Tsar Alexander I to make a voyage to the Far East to carry out this project. Under the patronage of the Tsar, Count Nicholay Petrovich Rumyantsev and the Russian-American Company, he led the first Russian circumnavigation of the world from 1803 to 1806. Krusenstern was made full admiral in the Russian navy in 1841.





Tsarevich Nicholas first met Princess Alix of Hesse-Darmstadt, one of Queen Victoria's favorite granddaughters, in St. Petersburg at the wedding of her sister Princess Elisabeth to his uncle Grand Duke Sergei Alexandrovich in June 1884. He expressed interest in her to his parents, but the emperor and empress were opposed to the match. Over the next decade, Nicholas did not relent. As Tsar Alexander the Third's health began to fail, he obtained parental permission to propose to the Hessian princess while attending the April 19, 1894 wedding of Ernst Ludwig, Grand Duke of Hesse to their mutual cousin Victoria Melita of Saxe-Coburg-Gotha. Soon after arriving in Coburg, Nicholas proposed. Alix, a devout Lutheran, rejected his offer for she would have to convert to Russian Orthodoxy in order to marry the heir to the throne. Her cousin Kaiser Wilhelm II, however, interceded on Nicholas' behalf as did her sister Elizabeth. When Nicholas proposed a second time she accepted.

On November 1, 1894, Alexander III died at the smaller Livadia Palace in the Crimea, leaving the 26-year-old Nicholas as Tsar. The following day, Alix, who had arrived at Livadia days earlier in order to receive the dying tsar's blessing, was received into the Russian Orthodox faith as Grand Duchess Alexandra Feodorovna (she wanted the name Catherine, but chose Alexandra to please Nicholas). The couple had planned a lavish wedding for the spring of 1895, but Alexander's death ended that. Unwilling to wait until the official mourning had ended to marry, Nicholas decided to hold the wedding on his mother's birthday so that the court mourning would be somewhat relaxed. He also wanted to keep it a private family affair, but his uncles persuaded him to invite the diplomatic corps.

On the morning of the 26th of November, Nicholas departed the Anichkov Palace with his 16-year-old brother Grand Duke Michael in an open landau to the Winter Palace. His mother, Maria Feodorovna, meanwhile, brought Alexandra from the Sergeivsky Palace by closed coach to the Winter Palace.

Wearing a Honiton lace veil designed by her maternal grandfather Prince Albert, which was worn at the wedding of her mother, her wedding dress, imperial mantle, the Romanov Imperial Nuptial Crown, a 475-carat necklace, and the star and sash of the Order of St. Andrew, Alexandra accompanied her mother-in-law to be as she led the procession into the Great Church. Dressed in his Hussar uniform, Nicholas followed; then the Romanov Grand Dukes and Duchesses and their foreign royal relatives, including King Christian IX of Denmark, and King George and Queen Olga of Greece.

As the couple was pronounced man and wife, church bells across St. Petersburg rang as guns were fired from the Peter and Paul Fortress. With the court in mourning, there was no reception, nor honeymoon. The newlyweds went to reside with Nicholas' mother and brother in the Anichkov Palace, moving eventually to the Alexander Palace at Tsarskoye Selo. \$75,000






Леонид Васильевич Цинченко (род. в 1907 г.) – в годы Великой Отечественной войны командир партизанского отряда, партизанского полка, помощник уполномоченного партизанского движения на Северо-Западном фронте по оперативной работе, командир 8-й Ленинградской партизанской бригады.

Родился в Предмостной слободе города Киева. Был пастухом и рыбаком, работал по найму у кулаков, учился в фабрично-заводской школе и работал слесарем на киевском заводе «Арсенал». Потом служил на Черноморском флоте, занимался политической работой в первом отдельном дивизионе судов НКВД в городе Пскове. Здесь он работал начальником окружного отдела местной промышленности, пока не выдвинули на партийную работу в Славковичи. Перед началом войны занимал должность второго секретаря Славковского райкома партии.

С началом Великой Отечественной войны Цинченко находился в составе районного истребительного батальона, затем - комиссар и командир партизанского отряда «Пламя». После того как отряд влился в состав 2-й бригады, - командир роты отряда «Буденновец». В конце апреля 1942 г. был назначен командиром второго полка 2-й бригады. Получив тяжелое ранение в одном из боев по защите Партизанского края в конце лета 1942 г., он лечился в госпитале в советском тылу. Затем был назначен заместителем начальника оперативной группы по руководству партизанским движением на Северо-Западном фронте. В начале сентября 1943 г. вылетел на самолете под Новоржев в 3-ю бригаду, которая с большими потерями вышла из вражеского окружения и потеряла своего комбрига - А.В.Германа.

Здесь Л.В.Цинченко начал формировать новую партизанскую бригаду, которой был присвоен восьмой номер. Это соединение, действовавшее на территории Со-шихинского и Островского районов, значительно выросло численно, взяло под свой контроль многие населенные пункты и важнейшие дороги. Оно провело немало успешных боевых операций, нанеся оккупантам большой урон в живой силе и технике, спасло от угона в немецкое рабство тысячи мирных граждан.

В послевоенные годы Л.В.Цинченко работал первым секретарем Славковского, Дновского, Островского райкомов партии.



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
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
