1 Lower Danube Tribes. Uncertain tribe. 2nd-1st Century BC. AR Tetradrachm (22mm, 6,57 g.). 'Saddle-head type'. Stylised laureate head of Zeus right. Rev. Stylised horse left, with slight remnants of rider. Lanz 641; Göbl, OTA 300 var. About very fine with an excellent grade of the silver.



2 Eastern Celtic Tribes, imitating imitations of Philip II of Macedon, circa 2nd.-1st. Century BC. AR Drachm (15 mm, 2,25 g.) 'Kugelwange' type. Laureate head of Zeus to right. Rev. Stylized horse prancing left; above, wheel. Dembski 1110; Göbl, OTA 188; Slg. Flesche 612-614; Slg. Lanz 458-459. Both obverse and reverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, very fine with a solid grade of the metal.



3 Middle Danube Tribes, AR Obol (9 mm, 0,50g.). 'Kapostaler' type 2nd.-1st. Century. Celticized head of laureate Zeus to right. Rev. Horse galloping to left. Göbl, OTA pl 39, 506. Lanz 835. Struck from a worn obverse die, otherwise, very fine with excellent metal grade and nicely toned. Scarce.



4 Eastern Celtic Tribes, imitating Alexander the 'Great'. 3rd.-1st. Century BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 2,60 g.). Head of Herakles wearing lion-skin headdress to right. Rev. Zeus seated on throne to left holding long sceptre, eagle in outstretched hand to right. Struck from a very worn reverse die, otherwise, very fine with an old cabinet tone.



5 Thrace, an imitation of an issue from Maroneia, circa 398-348 BC. AE (14mm, 3,93 g.). Horse prancing right, monogram below. Rev. four bunches of grapes in linear square, monogram below. Prototype: Schönert-Geiss 723ff; BMC 65; SNG Copenhagen 632. About good very fine with a nice black patina. More likely to be a Thracian imitation, instead of the Celtic imitative issue. Very Rare.

6 Lucania, Velia, circa. 440/35-400 BC. AR Didrachm/ Nomos (19mm, 7.62g.). Head of Athena right, wearing crested Attic helmet decorated with a griffin; Φ behind neck guard. Rev. Lion attacking stag r. Williams 153; HNItaly 1270. Ex Bertolami Fine Arts E 63, lot 71. Graphito (ΠΠ) on the reverse, otherwise, good very fine with a nice old cabinet tone. Very rare variety.



7 Thrace, Kabyle, circa 250-204/183 BC. AE (15 mm, 2,45 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. Artemis Phosphoros standing facing, head left, holding two long torches; club to right, KABY to left. SNG Stancomb 55; Corpus Nummorum 6281; Draganov Cabyle, Autonomous type B, Pl. XV-XVI; HGC 3.2, 1467. About good very fine with a nice black patina. Rare.

8 Thrace, Mesambria. 4th Century BC. AR Obol (8 mm, 0,48 g.). Facing crested Corinthian helmet. Rev. M-E-T-A within wheel of four spokes. SNG Stancomb 218. SNG BM Black Sea 267. Very fine.



9 Thrace, Mesambria. 4th. Century BC. AE (10 mm, 1,55 g.). Head of Athena right, wearing Corinthian helmet. Rev. M - E - T - A. Four-spoked wheel. SNG BM Black Sea 278; HGC 3.2, 1580. About extremely fine and of a fine style and nice black patina.



10 Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, late 5th.-4th. Century BC. AR Drachm (12mm, 3,25 g.). Facing gorgoneion, with tongue protruding. Rev. Anchor; crayfish to left, A to right. SNG BM Black Sea 153; HGC 3.2, 1323. Good very fine with an excellent metal grade and of a fine style.

Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, late 5th.-4th. Century BC. AR 11 Diobol (10 mm, 1,25 g.). Facing gorgoneion. Rev. Upright anchor; crayfish to right, $\Sigma\Omega$ A to left. HGC 3.2, 1315. SNG BM Black Sea 167. Struck slightly off center, otherwise, nearly good very fine, nicely toned.

12 Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, circa 494-470 BC. AR Obol (6 mm, 0,39 g.). Anchor, pellet below. Rev. Swastika within incuse; crayfish claws in recessed segments. SNG Stancomb 32. About extremely fine, unusually well struck with an excellent grade of the silver. Rrare type without A in field.

13 Thrace, Alopekonnesos, circa 350-300 BC. AE (18 mm, 4,99 g.). Head of Dionysos to right, wearing wreath of ivy and fruit. Rev. A- Λ - Ω Kantharos; to left, grape. HGC 3, 1300. Very fine. Rare.

14 Thrace, Sestos, circa 300 BC. AE (13 mm, 2,14 g.). Head of Hermes left, wearing petasos. Rev. $\Sigma H\Sigma$ Kithara; Γ to left. Von Fritze, Sestos 16 var. SNG Copenhagen 936 var. Almost extremely fine.

15 Thrace, Lysimacheia, circa 309-281 BC. AE (18 mm. 3,67 g.). Circa 309-281 BC. Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion's skin headdress. Rev. AYXIMAXEON, Nike standing to left, holding wreath and palm branch; two monograms to left. SNG Cop. 914. Almost extremely fine, unusually clear and with a beautiful olive





20 Kings of Thrace, Kersebleptes, circa 359-340 BC. (11mm, 1,91g.). Kypsela. Female head right, wearing sphendone. K-E-P; two-handled cup, grain-ear below. SNG Copenhagen 1070-1. Unusually well centered with all letters perfectly readable, about good very fine with a nice dark patina. and high relief. Scarce.

BA Σ IAE $\Omega\Sigma$ PAI Σ KOY Π OPI Δ O Σ Nike advancing left, holding wreath in her right hand and palm frond in her left. RPC I 1702. Youroukova 153-156. About good very fine with a wonderful 'emerald' like natural patina. An attractive and rare type with a fine veristic portrait.



22 Islands off Thrace, Samothrace. 3rd-2nd Century BC. AE (20 mm, 5.23 g). Pytho-, magistrate. Helmeted head of Athena right. Rev. Kybele seated left, holding patera and scepter; $\Sigma AM\Omega$ to left, $\Pi Y\Theta O$ to right. Schönert-Geiss, Samothrake 13; HGC 6, 321. Nearly good very fine with a beautiful natural green patina. Scarce island issue.



23 Thrace, Abdera, circa 336-335 BC. AR Tetrobol (14 mm, 2,53 g.). AB Δ H/PITE Ω N, Griffin lying to left. Rev. [E Π I]/ AI Γ / IA Λ / [EO Σ]. Laureate head of Apollo right, within linear square border. May 530. About extremely fine with an excellent grade of the metal and of the finest style. Rare with this magistrate.

24 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa. 550-478 BC. AR Fourée Stater (21 mm. 7,70 g.). Ithyphallic satyr advancing right, carrying off protesting nymph, her hand showing thumb and one finger. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. SNG Cop 1008-1010; Dewing 1311-1317; HGC 6, 331; Svoronos HPM 2 and pl. X, 4; BMC 2-12. Only a few small spots where the silver surface is missing, otherwise, a pleasant example with a clear image with a lovely old cabinet tone.



25 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 500-480 BC. AR Obol (8 mm. 0,47 g). Two dolphins swimming in opposite directions, pellets around. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 9; HGC 6, 337; BMC 18-22. Very well centered with very clear image of both dolphins, perfectly visible details (eyes, fins and tails). Good Very Fine and perfectly centred.





26 Islands off Thrace, Thasos. Circa 412-404 BC. AR Tritartemorion (9 mm. 0,36 g). Bald and bearded head of satyr to right. Rev. $\Theta A\Sigma$ Two dolphins, one above the other, swimming left and right; all within shallow incuse. HGC 6, 340. Le Rider, Thasiennes 12. SNG Cop 1033-1034. Lightly toned, good very fine. With a lovely classical portrait of the satyr incredibly well centered giving a closer look (comparing to the staters or drachms where the satyr holdyng the protesting nymph) to the portrait from the classical period.



27 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Hemiobol (7 mm, 0.26 g.). Head of nymph to left. Rev. OA Dolphin swimming to left. HGC 6, 341. Le Rider, Thasiennes 13. SNG Copenhagen 1035. Good very fine.



28 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa. 168/7-148 BC. AR Tetradrachm (33 mm, 16,66 g.). Head of youthful Dionysos to right, wreathed with ivy. Rev. HPAK Λ EOY Σ $\Sigma\Omega$ THPO Σ Θ A Σ I Ω N, Herakles standing left, resting right hand on club set on ground and holding lion's skin draped over left arm; H to inner left. SNG Oxford 3699; ANS 1944.100.16781. Good very fine with a nice yellowish mint hues.

29 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 2nd Century BC. AE (17 mm, 3,60 g.). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin. Rev. Θ A Σ ION, above, amphora within bow; below, club above monogram. SNG Cop. 1054var (monogram). The obverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, very fine. Much rarer as a bronze as the Thassian mint struck mainly silver in all denominations.



30 Macedon, Neapolis, Circa 424-350 BC. AR Hemidrachm (13 mm, 1,74 g.). Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue. Rev. N-E / O- Π Head of the nymph of Neapolis to right, her hair coiled around her head and with a bun at the back, wearing a plain necklace with a pendant. SNG ANS 430-454. Perfectly centred and nicely toned, some short natural edge splits, otherwise, good very fine.



31 Macedon, Eion, circa 480-470 BC. AR Diobol (7 mm, 0,93 g.). Goose standing to right, head turned to left. Rev. Rough incuse square. SNG ANS 272. Very fine. With thick flan, high relief and Archaic style.



32 Macedon, Akanthos, circa 430-390 BC. AR Diobol (16mm, 0,94 g.). Head of Athena to right, wearing crested Attic helmet. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square; A-K-A-N in quadrants. SNG ANS 50; SNG Ashmolean 2218; HGC 3.1, 393. Very fine, a pleasing, toned coin with a lovely portrait of Athena and very detailed helmet with entire crested element. Scarce.



33 Macedon, Chalkidian League, Olynthos, circa 400 BC. Trihemiobol (9 mm, 0,42 g.), Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. T-P/I-E Laurel branch within a plain square linear border; all within a shallow incuse square. Psoma, Monnaies, p. 103. SNG ANS -. SNG Copenhagen 822-3 (Trieros in Macedon). SNG Lockett 1208 (Trieros). Very fine. This coin is commonly ascribed to a city named Trieros, or a tribe called the Trieres. Scarce.

Quadripartite incuse square, divided diagonally. SNG ANS 924. Struck with somewhat worn obverse die, otherwise, about very fine. Very rare and with a nice old cabinet tone.



35 Kings of Macedon, Amyntas III 393 - 370/69 BC. AE (16 mm, 3,56 g.). Aigai or Pella, circa 381-369 BC. Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin. Rev. Eagle standing right, devouring serpent held in its talons. Westermark, Remarks, type 1; SNG ANS 100-9. Almost extremely fine fine with a very clear and defined images struck on a high relief.



36 Kings of Macedon, Perdikkas III ,365-359 BC. AE (16mm, 3,49 g.). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. Lion standing to right, breaking javelin with its jaws; ΠΕΡΔΙΚ-ΚΑ above and below. Westermark, Remarks 2; SNG ANS 114-9; HGC 3.1, 840. Very fine.



37 Kings of Macedon, Philip II, 359-336 BC. AE (18 mm, 6,40 g.), uncertain Macedonian mint, possibly Amphipolis. Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. Φ I Λ I Π Π OY Rider to left; below horse, E. SNG ANS 935. Brownish glossy patina, about good very fine.



38 Kings of Macedon, Alexander III the 'Great' 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (25 mm, 16,83 g.). Babylon, struck under Seleukos I Nikator, circa 311-305 BC. Head of Alexander in lion's skin head-dress right. Rev. BA Σ I/ Σ E Ω Σ A/ Σ EAN Δ POY Zeus seated left, holding eagle and sceptre; monogram in wreath at left, MI under throne. Price 3746; Müller 734. Good very fine. Very rare with an inscription on the obverse.

46 Kings of Macedon, Demetrios I Poliorketes, 306-283 BC. AE (15mm, 4,22 g.). Pella. Macedonian shield with monogram of Demetrios in central boss. Rev. BA Σ I Macedonian helmet. Newell 132; SNG Alpha Bank 969. Nearly extremely fine, very well centred with a clear and very well defined image.



47 Kings of Macedon, Philip V, 221-179 BC. AE (20 mm, 6,19 g.). Uncertain mint in Macedon, 183/182-179 BC. Bearded head of Herakles to right, wearing lion's skin headdress. Rev. BAΣIΛΕΩΣ ΦIΛΙΠΠΟΥ Harpa; above, ΔI; all within wreath. Mamroth, Bronzemünzen 25a. SNG Alpha Bank 1116-9. SNG München 1186-1189. Good very fine. An attractive example of a fine style and pleasant dark brown natural patina.

BA ΠΕΡ Eagle standing left, head right, on thunderbolt. AMNG III/2, -; HGC 3, 1098; SNG München 1224-7. About extremely fine. Wonderful green patina, well struck, an attractive coin of a fine style from the series of the bigger bronze nominals.



Macedon, as Roman protectorate. Praetor D. Junius Silanus 49 Manlianus, circa 148-147 BC. AE (22 mm, 9,59 g.). Facing mask of Silenos, wearing ivy wreath. Rev. D/MAKE/ΔΟΝΩN in three lines, within ivy wreath. AMNG 212. SNG Copenhagen 1324-6. SNG Kikpe 460. Touratsoglou Macedonia, 25. Good very fine with a lovely dark green and light green natural patina. An attractive and desirable type. Rare.

MAKE Δ ON Ω N TETAPTH Σ Club to right; above and below, monogram; around, oak wreath with ties to left. AMNG III/1, 188. HGC 3.1, 1109. Slightly off-center and some minor weakness, otherwise, very fine. Rare.

51 Macedon under Roman rule. First Meris. AR Tetradrachm (33 mm, 16,56 g.) Amphipolis, circa. 167-149 BC. Diademed and draped bust of Artemis right, bow and quiver at shoulder; all within tondo of Macedonian shield. Rev. MAKE Δ ON Ω N Π P Ω TH Σ , horizontal club, monograms above and below; all within oak wreath tied at left; thunderbolt in outer left field. AMNG III/1, 171. Often described as a celtic imitation but according to us just struck from a worn obverse die and also probably from a series with less beautiful style of the portrait but alsolutely superb reverse with sharply struck oak wreath, perfectly centered, well detailed club and fine style of the inscription with lovely greek caligraphy which actually is a perfect sign for the greek origin instead of the celtic. Struck from a rusty obverse die, somewhat overcleand, otherwise, about good very fine.



52 Kings of Paeonia, Patraos, circa 335-315 BC. AR Tetrobol (14 mm, 2,29 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. IIATPAOY behind an Eagle with closed wings standig right, inverted torch in right field. Obverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, about good very fine with an excellent grade of the metal. Extremely rare and apparently unpublished with this symbol and the legend behind the back of the eagle. Of the finest classical style of the portrait.



53 Dardania, Damastion, circa 380-365/0 BC. AR Tetrobol, circa 380-360 BC. Female head left. Rev. ΔΑΜΑΣΤΙΩΝ Ingot with handle, SNG Ashmolean 3339. Good very fine. Rare.



Illyria, Apollonia, circa 80/70-48 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 3,27g.). Struck under magistrates Ariston and Ainea(s) APIΣTΩN Cow standing to left, looking back and suckling calf standing to right beneath her. Rev. AΠOΛ AI-NE-A Divided double square containing two stellate designs. Ceka 24. Maier 12. P&G 66. Good Very Fine.



55 Thessaly, Larissa, circa 462/1-460 BC. AR Obol (11 mm, 0.89 g.). Bull's head and neck, as last but, behind, half figure of hero to left, grasping bull by the horns; above, lotus flower. Rev. AA Head of bridled horse to right; all within incuse square. BCD1103 var. Nicely toned, about good very fine. Rare early type.



56 Thessaly, Larissa, circa 400-380 BC. AR Drachm (19 mm, 6,08 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa three-quarter facing, turned slightly to left, wearing hair band. Rev. AAPI Horse with straight legs standing right, feeding on pile of hay. Lorber, 41 var. A fascinating obverse with a stunning portrait of the Nymph Larissa struck on a high relief with a perfectly defined details. An excellent grade of the metal giving a beauty only on the obverse. Struck from a rusty reverse die which obviously obstructs the visibility of the details on it. About good very fine. Rare type, especially with this magnificent style of the portrait, masterfully made from a very skillful ancient engraver.



57 Thessaly, Larissa, circa 344-337 BC. AR Trihemiobol (11 mm, 1,12 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa facing, turned slightly to the left, wearing ampyx, pendant earring, and simple necklace. Rev. AAPI // [Σ AI Ω N] Thessalian cavalryman, wearing petasos and chlamys holding whip, riding horse right. BCD Thessaly II 327; HGC 4, 475. Nicely toned, nearly good very fine. Rare denomination.



58 Thessaly, Larissa, circa 4th-3rd Century BC. AE (17,5 mm, 6,37 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa facing, slightly to left. Rev. Λ API/ Σ AI Ω N Cavalryman wearing Boiotian helmet on horseback to right, M monogram below. BCD 1171 var. (monogram). About extremely fine with a lovely black natural patina and beautiful style and perfectly defined image.

TP - IK - K - A Forepart of bridled horse to right; all within very shallow incuse circle. BCD 775.3/5 var. About extremely fine with an excellent toning with lovely yellowish hues.



Thessaly, Pelinna, first quarter of the 4th Century BC. AE Chalkous (14 mm, 2,73 g.). Helmeted warrior on horse prancing right, his chlamys flapping behind him, border of dots. Rev. ΠΕΛΙΝ warrior, wearing petasos and dressed in short tunic, in fighting attitude left, carrying shield with his left and spear with his right. SNG Cop. 186 corr. Good very fine. Rarer type withoul a hoplite on the ground below the horseman on this obverse die.



Thessaly, Pharsalos, early 4th Century BC. AE Dichalkon (15 mm, 3,16 g.). Head of Athena to left, wearing crested Attic helmet decorated with Skylla on the bowl. Rev. 




