Middle Danube Tribes "Kugelwange" type. AR Drachm (15 mm, 1,97 g.). Imitating the types of Philip II of Macedon. 3rd. Century BC. Celticized laureate head of Zeus. Rev. Celticized horse prancing left. Lanz 507. About good very fine, nicely toned. Reverse perfectly centered and clear horse in very abstractive style. Very Fine

Nearly good very fine of a fine style with a beautiful portrait of Dionysos and attractive light green and brown patina.

Scarce.



20 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, Circa 463-449 BC. AR Stater (21 mm, 8,15 g.). Group Ic. Ithyphallic satyr advancing right, carrying off protesting nymph, her hand showing all five fingers. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. SNG Ashmolean 3660; SNG Copenhagen 1010, Le Rider, Thasiennes 5. SNG Delpierre 822. About extremely fine, struck on a high relief with an excellent grade of the silver. Rarer example from the group Ic perfectly displaying the transitions in style between the typically archaic of the group Ib and the high classical of group II. Instead of Vshaped hand are clearly visible five fingers of the both hands which is even rarer (there are examples where the protesting hand is with five fingers but the second hand is still v-shaped). Very well proportioned bodies with fine portrait of the Satyr full of determination and slightly advanced hair-style according to the clearly archaic type, the Nymph still posses a hair-style near to the archaic, formed by a series of dots. The Satyr is of particulary fascinating and defined muscular body, an impressive biceps and clearly defined breast where even the nipples are perfectly visible over the leg and the stomach of the tightly grabbed Nymph.

Scarcer smaller denomination series, comparing to the classical but common Apollo- Rider type.

Price 2899; DCA 312; SNG München 668. An attractive example with an impressive portrait of Herakles, nicely lustrous surfaces and an excellent grade of the silver. A fascinating image of semi-naked seated Zeus obviously from a very skillful engraver of both dies. Extremely fine.
