Dr. Stephen Album | Founder | Director of Islamic & Early Indian Numismatics

Steve has been serving the numismatic community since 1960. In 1976 he began dealing nearly exclusively in Islamic and Indian coins. He has authored several books including the 1977 saw the release of his complete rewrite of Marsden's *Numismata Orientalia Illustrata*, a guide to Islamic and Oriental coins with values. In 1993 he published *A Checklist of Islamic Coins*, now is in its third edition, is the standard for collectors of Islamic coins. Mr. Album is currently a senior fellow at the Worcester College, Oxford, England, and in this position has authored three of the ten volumes of the *Sylloge of Islamic Coins in the Ashmolean (Museum)* beginning in 1999. In 2003 he was recipient of the American Numismatic Society's Huntington Award, one of only three Islamists to have received this honor. He has twice been the recipient of the Samir-Shamma-prize for Islamic Numismatics, in 2000 and then in 2005. In May of 2004 the Eberhard-Karls-Universität Tübingen in Germany honored Mr. Album with a *philosophiae doctoris honoris causae*, an honorary doctoral degree in philosophy. Steve is among the world's leading experts on Islamic and Indian coins.



Joseph Lang | CEO | Director of East Asian & Later Indian Numismatics

Joe joined Stephen Album Rare Coins in 2001 and merged his company with Steve Album shortly thereafter. It was under his management of the firm that Stephen Album Rare Coins began operating their successful auctions in 2007. He now directs the firm as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO). Mr. Lang is a preeminent specialist in world coins with expertise in East Asian and Indian Numismatics. Joe serves on the International Association of Professional Numismatists (IAPN) Executive Committee and is chairman of the Anti-Forgery Committee. He has been a senior research fellow at Oxford University since 2001, having agreed to write five of the proposed ten volumes of the *Sylloge of the Islamic Coins in the Ashmolean*.

Miles and DeShazo have argued that this individual was the eunuch Nusayr al-Wasif, who served as chief of intelligence under the caliph al-Mahdi.

The two locations were on opposite sides of a small lake near the town of Shahdadpur, Pakistan.

Silver dammas in the name of the Sind governor I-Hakam b. 'Awana were also struck, with two distinct varieties (A-4501 & 4502).

This type was probably issued somewhere in southeastern Spain by local contenders opposed to the rising Kings of Murcia and the Almohades arriving from North Africa. The overall calligraphic style resembles some of the dinars minted in the early to mid 540s in and around the Spanish city of Jaén.

The gold coins of Muhammad Baha' al-Dawla are the only dated gold coins of North Africa or Spain struck between the demise of the Kings of Mursiya in AH567 and the arrival of the Sa'dians in Morocco in the AH950s (Ottoman slightly earlier, after 926), struck from AH644-648 with the date in the field, 649-659 with the date in the margin, always written out in words. The Hudids of Murcia arose during the demise of the Almohades in the 620s, agreed to a protectorate with Fernando III of Castile in 640/641 by the treaty of Alcaraz, briefly succeeded by the Nasrid Muhammad I, then ultimately surrendered to James I of Aragon in 1266 (AH664). Only 2 examples of this type are recorded on CoinArchives, dated 646 and 647, both of much lower quality than this example.

Ali Bey Al-Kabir was originally a Mamluk soldier. Born in the region of Abkhazia in Georgia, Ali Bey was kidnapped and brought to Cairo in 1743 where he was sold into slavery.

He was recruited into the Mamluk force in which he gradually rose in ranks and influence, winning the top office of sheikh al-balad (chief of the country) in 1760.

He rose to prominence in 1768 when he rebelled against his Ottoman rulers making Egypt independent. The insubordination of his most trusted general, Abu al-Dhahab, led to Ali Bey's exile then death outside the walls of Cairo.

We can find no other examples of this coin listed on Coin Archives, only this piece, which was sold by Spink in June 2007.

Ani had been the capital of the great Bagratid Armenian kingdom 961-1045, taken by the Byzantines in 1045, conquered by the Seljuqs in 1064, who then granted the city and its immediate surroundings to a branch of the Shaddadid dynasty, at first to Manuchiri b. Shawur, who ruled for there for 46 years. It was later periodically seized by the Christian kingdom of Georgia, then to the Mongols and their successors by 1236, and largely destroyed by an earthquake in 1319. The village was later part of the Safavid territory, then acquired by the Ottoman Empire in 1579, completely abandoned by the end of the 18th century. Now located in modern Turkey near the border with Armenia, it has become an interesting tourist site, and the remaining ruins were named a UNESCO World Heritage Site on 15 July 2016.



The purpose of this astounding issue remains unclear, but it undoubtedly is related to the influence of the Great Mongols during the regency of Töregene and the opposing Qarlughids, who ruled AH621-658 in Sind, and at some point towards the end of his reign struck base-metal jitals at Kurraman (Tye-344), as well as silver tankas without mint name, thought to have been struck at Ghazna, Kurraman, or Sind, with the latest known date AH636. A similar calligraphic style is known for a tanka of the Delhi sultan Iltutmish, undated but presumably before the end of his reign in AH633 (Goron-D38). The denomination seems likely to be indeed 10 dirhams, as the 3 known examples follow the weight of 10 dirhams of Töregene, and cannot be the equivalent of 2½ tankas of the Qarlughids or the Delhi Sultanate, which should weight about 27.2q, far lighter than the three known pieces.

This is the third reported example of this type, Kurraman 641, all from the same pair of dies, and this example is in much better condition than the other two, and without any flaws. The two other examples appeared in the Numismatic Genevensis Auction 8, Lot 289 (28.10g), in 2014 and in the Triton Auction XXII, Lot 1234 (28.66g), in January 2019.

This is only the second example offered for public sale that we are aware of and likely the finest known example!



The League of Red Cross Societies was founded in 1919, the year after the end of World War I. The initiative came from Henry P. Davison, President of the American Red Cross. Experience from the war showed that the national Red Cross Societies ought to cooperate more closely also in peacetime. The Red Cross Societies of the USA, Great Britain, France, Italy and Japan were the first members of the League, known today as the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC). The Iranian Red Lion and Sun Society was founded in 1922, it became affiliated with the IFRC in 1924.

These types were used extensively in the French possessions in North America; La Louisiane and Nouvelle-France. John Law had purchased the right to produce coins for his Compagnie des Indes (also known as the Mississippi Company) from the French government. He also produced paper money and bonds in ever-increasing numbers in the 1720-1 period. Wild inflation came about, and a financial collapse was the result, known today as the Mississippi Bubble.

These "Double Sols" or "Sous Marqués" were issued from 1738 to 1764. In the earliest years, all of the French mints produced Double Sols; in later years, only the Paris and Strasbourg facilities were used. Although billon is already an alloy with a low percentage of silver, many of the later issues were debased even further. In extreme cases, the only silver in the coins was a thin plating applied over the surfaces.

Between 1568 and 1648, the Seventeen Provinces (modern Benelux) revolted against Philip II of Spain, who had received the territories as part of the inheritance of his father, the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V. Very quickly the revolt became an opportunity for outside interests, particularly England, to become involved as a way of indirectly attacking Spain. The iconic obverse die-crack is represented here in its very first stage, indicative of a very early striking and thus rare. This is the first crown to be produced with a lettered edge. With additional PNG certificate number 2102 issued 11 January 1973 and issued to renowned numismatist Catherine E. Bullowa.

This type is the first of the machine-struck portrait crowns. Often classified as a pattern, it should be considered as regular coinage as many of the coins did see circulation. The piece shows Cromwell as a Roman Emperor, draped and laureated. This piece is noted for the presence of a die crack across the lower obverse. It is always there to some degree, but early die state coins do command a premium.

In 1862, the Shogunate government sent students to the Netherlands to study naval technology. Enomoto Takeaki, Nishi Amane and Tsuda Mamichi were sent and studied shipbuilding, navigation, medicine, law and other fields. After the Meiji Restoration, Nishi and Tsuda became pioneers in the introduction of philosophy, law and other fields. In addition, a delegation sent from the Shogunate government to Europe also visited the Netherlands the same year and were exuberantly welcomed. It was very significant for many Japanese, including Fukuchi Gen'ichiro (Fukuchi Ochi) and Fukuzawa Yukichi, to see the things and systems in European countries. The date 1609 refers to first official Dutch VOC delegation to Japan. Restrikes struck in 2009 exist, but can be distingusihed by the presence of two privy marks at 06:00 on reverse rather than one.





These are usually assigned to Western Liao dynasty, and are not found in China, but in Central Asia, this example reportedly from Kazakhstan.

Emperor Kuang Hsu (i.e. Guangxu, which means "Glorious Succession") was the 11th emperor of the Qing dynasty. His reign period lasted from 1875 to 1908, but effectively he lost his power in 1898. The real power was with the Empress Dowager Cixi, and he was under her influence during his reign. His attempt to launch the "Hundred Days' Reform" was tharted by a coup, presumably led by the Empress, and after that time he was placed on house arrest until his death ten years later.

Formerly it was assumed that these tangkas were distributed to monks on behalf of the 14th Dalai Lama in the late 1940s. The Tibetans referred to this Tangka as Tangka dkarpo sa rpa ("new white tangka") in order to distinguish it from the normal gaden tangkas. This coin circulated for some time at the value of 5 srang which shows the high inflation rate which was prevailing in Tibet in the 20th Century. In the 19th Century 6½ tangkas were equivalent to 1 srang which corresponded to slightly more than 37 grams of silver. Taking the circulating value of this "Monk" tangka as a base, 1 srang was equal to about 33½ tangkas in 1953-54.

This is an absolutely fantastic example of this rare Tibetan pattern silver type. This is the finest graded by either NGC or PCGS!



There are just two examples on CoinArchives, both from the same dies as this piece. Interestingly, the reverse die for this piece is the same reverse die as Göbl-41, the bust above the clouds type! This substantiates the rarity of the Athsho quarter dinars of Kanishka I (and most other quarter dinars of this ruler).

Surprisingly, the cross-legged portrait above the clouds is common for the copper coins of Huvishka, which are also frequently with blundered obverse text.

The trident to the left dates this piece in the latter years of his reign. Extremely delightful example of this moderately rare type, seldom found in this magnificent quality.

This type, without the bull, is much rarer than the Siva & bull type, and this is an unusually well-struck example.

The coinage of Tipu Sultan (1782-1799) is one of most complex and fascinating series struck in India during the 18th century. Local South India coinage had been struck in the area that became Mysore since ancient times, with the first gold coinage introduced about the 11th century (the elephant pagoda), and other pagodas continuing through the following centuries. These pagoda were always in the South Indian style until the reign of Haidar Ali (1761-1782), who added pagodas with Persian legends, plus a few very rare gold mohurs and silver rupees, always in the name of the Mughal emporer Shah Alam II plus the Arabic letter "h" as the first letter of his name. His successor, Tipu Sultan, continued to issue pagodas, mohurs and rupees, with legends that were completely new. As for copper, the new large paisa was commenced by Haidar Ali in AH1195, two years before his death, with the elephant on the obverse, the mint on the reverse, and was continued throughout the reign of Tipu Sultan, who added other denominations.

Tipu Sultan introduced a set of new Persian names for the various denominations, which appear on all of the gold and silver coins and on some of the copper. Faruqi for the pagoda (Umar al-Faruq, the third caliph) -- Sadîqi for the double-pagoda (Abu Bakr al-Sadiq, the second caliph) -- Ahmadi for the four-pagoda ("most praised", one of the name of the Prophet Muhammad).

It is conceivable that this nickel 1945 rupee was a trial struck before the dies for 1946/1947 were ready, perhaps just to be sure the presses would be capable of producing rupees in nickel.

The Leeds firm of Greenwood & Batley, founded in 1856, supplied coining presses and associated machinery to a number of foreign mints. In February 1905 their agents in India, Duncan, Stratton & Co. of Bombay, ordered six coining presses at £275 each on behalf of H.H. The Nizam of Hyderabad's mint. These were delivered in February 1906. The proving pieces struck from the new machinery were ostensibly to the size and weight of the rupee, half, quarter and eighth-rupee denominations.

Major-General Sir Herbert Benjamin Edwardes KCB KCSI DCL (1819-1868) was a British administrator, soldier, and statesman active in the Punjab region of British India. He is best known as the "Hero of Multan" for his pivotal role in securing British victory in the Second Anglo-Sikh War. Sir Henry Lawrence praised Edwardes' pivotal role in the war, stating that "Since the days of Clive no man had done as Edwardes." All had been achieved by personal initiative, without formal military training. He was commended by Gough and the Government, promoted brevet major in September 1848 and made a Companion of the Order of the Bath (CB), in October 1849. The East India Company awarded him a specially struck unique gold medal for his services in the Punjab.
