OTA ppl. 46-7, Class III. Typically for the type slightly bent flan, otherwise, about extremely fine with a lovely old cabinet tone nicely contrasting with the yellowish hues from the minting.

Good very fine with a lovely olive green patina. Rarer heavy issue.

ΠΑ-ΤΡΑΟ-Υ Paeonian horseman, wearing crested helmet and full armor, galloping to right and spearing fallen enemy, who defends himself with a with a spear in his right hand and a shield ornamented with swastika on his left arm.
