Pertinax. AD 193. AR Denarius (18 mm, 2.71 g.). Rome mint. Laureate head right / Laetitia standing left, holding wreath and scepter. Minor flan flaw of reverse. NGC VF

MACEDON, Republican period. First Meris. Circa 167-149 BC. AR Tetradrachm (30 mm, 16.32 g, 1h). Amphipolis mint. Struck 2nd half of 2nd century BC. Diademed and draped bust of Artemis right, bow and quiver over shoulder, in the center of a Macedonian shield / Club; monogram above; all within oak wreath, thunderbolt to left.

25 SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Seleukos I Nikator, Second satrapy and kingship, 312-281 BC. AR Tetradrachm (25 mm, 16.09 g.). Seleukeia on the Tigris mint. Struck circa 296/5-281 BC. Laureate head of Zeus right / Athena, brandishing spear, shield on left arm, in quadriga of elephants right; above, AT monogram and Θ below anchor.



SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Antiochos II Theos. 261-246 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 16.63 g.). Seleukeia on the Tigris mint. Diademed head of Antiochus I right / Apollo Delphios seated left on omphalos, testing arrow, resting hand on bow; monograms to outer left and right.



**27** SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Antiochos III 'the Great'. 222-187 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 16.91 g.). Uncertain Mint 68, in northern Mesopotamia. Struck circa 192/0-187 BC. Diademed head right / Apollo, testing arrow and resting hand on grounded bow, seated left on omphalos; ΔI to outer left.



SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Antiochos VII Euergetes (Sidetes). 138-129 BC. AR Drachm (17 mm, 3.82 g.). Antioch on the Orontes mint. Diademed head right / Nike advancing left, holding wreath in extended right hand; monogram to outer left, monogram below right wing.



**29** SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Antiochos VII Euergetes (Sidetes). 138-129 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 16.64 g.). Antioch on the Orontes mint. Diademed head right / Athena Nikephoros standing left, resting hand on shield, and propping spear on her arm; to outer left, monogram above  $\Lambda$ ; all within wreath.



**30** SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Antiochos VII Euergetes (Sidetes). 138-129 BC. AR Tetradrachm (26 mm, 12.42 g.). Phoenician standard. Tyre mint. Dated SE 180 (133/2 BC). Diademed and draped bust right / Eagle standing left on prow; palm frond in background; to left, monogram above club surmounted by Tyre monogram; monogram above  $\Pi P$  (date) to right, monogram between legs. Dark toning. We could not make the determination if the toning is original or retoned.



In the name and types of Antiochos VII of Syria. KINGS of CAPPADOCIA. Circa 129-127 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 16.11). Diademed head of Antiochos VII right / Athena Nikephoros standing left; to outer left, monogram above A; all within laurel wreath.



32 SELEUKID KINGS OF SYRIA. Demetrios II Nikator. Second reign, 129-125 BC. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 15.52 g.). Damaskos mint. Dated SE 185 (128/7 BC). Diademed and bearded head right / Zeus Nikephoros seated left;  $\Xi\Delta$  monogram below throne;  $\Xi\Pi P$  (date) in exergue. A very rare issue with a intriguing history. Sold in 2009 by Spink (\$1,300), 2019 by Frank Robinson, and 2019 by Don Zauche a few weeks before his passing. It is our opinion that this coin has been smoothed and repatinated, although this was not mentioned in its previous sales. The work, though well executed is apparent on the obverse to the right of the nose and the reverse on the far left of the planchet.



SELEUKID EMPIRE. Philip I Philadelphos. Circa 95/4-76/5 BC. AR Tetradrachm (26 mm, 14.23 g.). Uncertain mint. Diademed head right / Zeus Nikephoros seated left, monogram below throne; all within laurel wreath.



Lucania, Poseidonia. Ca. 440-410 B.C. AR Nomos/Stater (18 mm, 7.70 g.). Poseidon standing right, preparing to cast trident, left arm extended / Bull standing left.



ATTICA, Athens. Circa 454-404 BC. AR Hemidrachm (12 mm, 1.99 g.). Helmeted head of Athena right, with frontal eye / Owl standing facing between olive branches.



CARIA, Mylasa. Circa 420-390 BC. AR Tetartemorion (6 mm, 0.25 g.). Forepart of lion right, head left / Bird standing left; two pellets in field; all within incuse square.

CILICIA, Uncertain. 4th century BC. AR Hemiobol (7 mm, 0.25 g.). Head of Hermes right, wearing winged petasos / Bearded head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin. Light porosity.



Achaemenid Empire (Persia). Artaxerxes II. Circa 360 BC. AR Hemibol (8 mm, 0.38.). Uncertain mint in Cilicia. Crowned and bearded head right (of Persian Great King?) / Forepart of Pegasus right.



CYPRUS, Kition. Baalmelek II. Circa 425/0-400 BC. AR Stater (20 mm, 10.82 g.). Herakles in fighting stance right, holding club and bow, lion skin draped from neck; ankh symbol to right / Lion attacking stag right; all within pellet border.



**44** MYSIA, Parion. 5th century BC. AR Drachm (15 mm, 3.89 g). Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue / Disorganized linear pattern within incuse square.



**45** PAMPHYLIA, Aspendos. Circa 420-410 BC. AR Stater (20 mm, 10.90 g.). Two wrestlers, nude, grappling / Slinger in throwing stance right; triskeles to left; to right, Athena standing right, holding spear and shield; all in dotted square border within incuse square. Struck from worn dies.



Circa 333-305 BC. AR Drachm (20 mm, 3.89 g.). Uncertain mint. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin; c/m: prow of ship right, ΠY above, within incuse circle / Zeus Aëtophoros seated left; uncertain control marks.



**47** TROAS, Abydos. Circa 480-450 BC. AR Hemitartemorion (6 mm, 0.10 g.). Eagle standing left / Gorgoneion facing within incuse square.



**48** TROAS, Neandria. 4th century BC. AR Hemiobol (7 mm, 0.36 g.). Laureate head of Apollo right / Ram standing right within incuse square.



BAKTRIA, Greco-Baktrian Kingdom. Eukratides I Megas. Circa 170-145 BC. AR Obol (11 mm, .53 g.). Helmeted, diademed, draped, and cuirassed bust right / Caps of the Dioskouroi, each with palm frond.



BAKTRIA, Greco-Baktrian Kingdom. Eukratides I Megas. Circa 170-145 BC. AR Obol (10 mm, 0.49 g.). Diademed, draped, and cuirassed bust right, wearing crested helmet covered with pelt of scales and adorned with wing / Herakles standing facing, crowning himself, and holding club and lion skin.



BAKTRIA, INDO-SCYTHIAN KINGS. Vonones, with Spalahores. Early First Century AD. AR Tetradrachm (27 mm, 9.73 g.). King on horseback, holding lance / Zeus standing facing, holding thunderbolt and sceptre; monogram to right.



**52** SASANIAN KINGS. Ardaxšīr (Ardashir) I. AD 223/4-240. AR Drachm (25 mm, 4.12 g.). Mint C (Ctesiphon"). Bust right, wearing diadem and close-fitting headdress with korymbos and no earflaps / Fire altar with diadems; pellet to right of altar shaft.



**53** SASANIAN KINGS. Ardaxšīr (Ardashir) I. AD 223/4-240. AR Drachm (25 mm, 3.96 g.). Mint C (Ctesiphon"). Bust right, wearing diadem and close-fitting headdress with korymbos and no earflaps / Fire altar with diadems; pellet to right of altar shaft.



**54** SASANIAN KINGS. Shapur I. AD 241-272. AR Obol (14 mm, 0.77 g.). Mint I ("Ctesiphon"). Bust of Shapur I right, wearing diadem and mural crown with korymbos / Fire altar; flanked by two attendants wearing mural crowns and one with, and the other without, diadems; symbol on altar shaft, letter above left attendant.

**71** AEOLIS, Larissa Phrikonis. Circa 400-300 BC. Æ (9 mm, 1.14 g.). Horned female head of river god facing slightly right /  $\Lambda$ -A, laureate head of Apollo right.



ATTICA, Athens. 87/6 BC. Æ Chalkous (16 mm, 8.78 g.). Struck under Mithradates VI of Pontos and Aristion, Tyrant of Athens. Helmeted head of Athena right / Zeus striding right, preparing to cast thunderbolt; to right, star within two crescents.



BAKTRIA, Indo-Greek Kingdom. Archebios. Circa 75-65 BC. Æ (20 mm, 8.60 g.). Square module. Diademed and draped bust of Zeus right, scepter over shoulder / Palms and pileoi of the Dioskouroi; monogram below.



BOSPOROS, CIMMERIAN, Pantikapaion. Circa 340-325 BC. Æ (17 mm, 2.44 g.). Wreathed head of Pan left / Bow and arrow.



**75** BRUTTIUM, Terina. Circa 350-275 BC. Æ Diobol (21 mm, 16.63 g.). Head of nymph right / Crab.



**76** CAMPANIA, Cales. Circa 265-240 BC. Æ (18 mm, 6.20 g.). Helmeted head of Athena left / Cock standing right; star to upper left.



77 Cilicia, Tarsos, Æ ( 20 mm, 7.94 g.), after 164 BC. Turreted and veiled head of the Tyche of Tarsos to right; countermarked with the head Helios within a circular indent / Sandan standing right on horned, winged animal within a pyramidal monument surmounted by an eagle; to left letters  $A\Lambda/HI/\Omega$ .



EUBOIA, Histiaia. 4th-3rd centuries BC. Æ (17 mm, 5.31 g.). Wreathed head of nymph Histiaia right / Cow advancing right; grape vine behind; bipennis to right.



IONIA, Magnesia ad Maeandrum. Circa 400-350 BC. Æ (15 mm, 1.98 g.). Laureate head of Apollo(?) left / Forepart of bull butting right.



IONIA, Herakleia ad Latmon. Mid 2nd-1st century BC. Æ (21 mm, 4.88 g.). Helmeted head of Athena right / Owl standing right, head facing; monogram to left, club to right, IE in exergue; all within laurel wreath.



KOLCHIS, Dioskourias. Circa 105-90 BC. Æ (17 mm, 5.58 g.). Two pilei surmounted by stars / Thyrsos.



LUCANIA, Metapontion. Circa 225-200(?) BC. Æ (16 mm, 5.90 g.). Helmeted head of Leukippos right / Demeter standing facing, head right, holding long cross-torch. Ex: Mars Numismatics






