Celtic Thrace, an imitation of an issue from Maroneia, circa 3 – 2 century BC. AE (12 mm, 1,78 g.). Horse prancing left. Rev. Four dots in linear square, blundered inscription around. Prototype: Schönert-Geiss 723 ff; BMC 65; SNG Copenhagen 632. Good very fine, with brown-green patina. More likely to be a Thracian imitation, instead of a Celtic imitative issue. Very rare.



Celtic Thrace, an imitation of an issue from Maroneia, circa 3 – 2 century BC. AE (15.6 mm, 4,27 g.). Horse prancing right. Rev. four stylized bunches of grapes in linear square. Prototype: Schönert-Geiss 723 ff; BMC 65; SNG Copenhagen 632. Good very fine, green patina. More likely to be a Thracian imitation, instead of a Celtic imitative issue. Very rare.



Bruttium, The Brettii, circa 214-211 BC. AE Half-Triobol (17 mm, 4.37 g). Obv: NIKA. Head of Nike left, wearing hair-band, small Γ behind neck. Rev. BPETTIΩN Zeus standing right, hurling thunderbolt. Pfeiler p. 22, 2; Historia Numorum Italy, 1943; HGC 1, 1371. Brown patina. About good very fine.



4 Thrace, Lysimacheia, circa 309-281 BC. AE (23.5 mm, 13,1 g.). Diademed head of king Lysimachos right. Rev. ΛΥΣΙ-ΜΑΧΕΩ[N], a lion leaping right; monogram AP below. BMC 1; SNG Copenhagen 899. Very fine, dark green patina. A rare variety!



5 Thrace, Thracian Chersonese, circa 386-338 BC. AR Hemidrachm (12.5 mm, 2.42 g.). Forepart of a lion right, head reverted. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square with alternating raised and sunken quarters; a pellet and a bunch of grape in opposite sunken quarters. McClean 4079; HGC 3.2, 1437. Very Fine.



6 Thrace, Thracian Chersonese, circa 386-338 BC. AR Hemidrachm (12.2 mm, 2.41 g). Forepart of a lion right, head reverted. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square with alternating raised and sunken quarters; a pellet and an ear of wheat in opposite sunken quarters. McClean 4081; HGC 3.2, 1437. Good Very Fine.



7 Thrace, Thracian Chersonese, circa 386-338 BC. AR Hemidrachm (12.9 mm, 2.39 g). Forepart of a lion right, head reverted. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square with alternating raised and sunken quarters; a pellet with monogram A Γ and a cicada in opposite sunken quarters. McClean 4096; HGC 3.2, 1437. Very Fine.



Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, 5th c. BC. AR Drachm (14 mm, 3.11 g.). Facing Gorgoneion. Rev. Upright anchor; in field, A to left and crayfish to right. BMC 6; SNG BM 153; HGC 3.2, 1323. Very fine.



Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, 5th – 4th c. BC. AR Drachm (14 mm, 3.29 g.). Facing Gorgoneion. Rev. Upright anchor; in field, A to left and crayfish to right. SNG Fitzwilliam 1534; SNG BM 160; HGC 3.2, 1323. Very fine.



Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, 5th c. BC. AR Drachm, irregular flan (14.2 mm, 3.20 g.). Facing Gorgoneion. Rev. Upright anchor; in field, crayfish to left and A to right. SNG Cop. 454; SNG Fitzwilliam 1531-1532; SNG BM 153; Very fine.



Thrace, Apollonia Pontika, 4th c. BC. AE Unit (9.4 mm, 1.48 g). Head of Apollo wearing laurel wreath right. Rev. Upright anchor; in field, A to left and crayfish to right. SNG Copenhagen 462; SNG Bulgaria 2, 430-437; HGC 3.2, 1342. Dark patina, good very fine. Rare. An attractive bronze!



Thrace, Kings. Odrysian. Seuthes III, circa 330/23-295 BC. Seuthopolis mint. AE (19 mm, 3.06 g.), overstruck. Laureate head of Zeus right. Rev. Seuthes seated on horse advancing right; star below. Peykov B3750; HGC 3, 1714. Overstruck on a Macedonian issue of Kassander. Dark green patina. Good very fine. An interesting example of an overstrike!



13 Thrace, Abdera, ca. 365/60-350/45 BC. Aigialeos magistrate. AR Tetrobol (14.5 mm, 2.53 g). ABΔH–[PITEΩN], griffin seated to left. Rev. EΠI / AIΓ / IAΛ / EΩΣ, Laureate head of Apollo right within a linear square. May, Abdera, Period IX, plate 24, 530. About extremely fine with an excellent grade of the metal.



14 Thrace, Abdera, circa 311-280 BC. AE Unit (12.7 mm, 2.36 g.), uncertain magistrate. Griffin seated to right, on club right. Rev: ABΔ-HPI-TE- Ω N, Head of Apollo right within linear square border. HGC 3.2, 1241. Very fine.



15 Islands off Thrace, Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Hemiobol (7.85 mm, 0.36 g.). Head of bald and bearded Silenos to right. Rev. Θ -A- Σ , Two dolphins, one above the other, swimming left and right; all within shallow incuse. HGC 6, 340; Le Rider, Thasiennes 12. Very fine.



Macedon, Kings. Philip II of Macedon, 356-336 BC. Uncertain mint in Macedonia. AE (17.6 mm, 6.10 g.). Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ, Youth on horseback to right, uncertain monogram or symbol below. SNG ANS 908. Very fine, weak reverse strike. Fine classical portrait of young Apollo became emblematic for the bronze coinage of Philip II.



17 Macedon, Philippi, circa 356-345 BC. AE (15.5 mm, 6.90 g.). Head of Herakles left, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΩΝ Tripod, in field to right, bunch of grapes. Bellinger, Philippi, group II; HGC 3.1, 632 var. Nice dark patina, about good very fine. Very rare and apparently unrecorded with bunch of grapes, known as a symbol only on staters.

18 Macedon, Kings. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. Struck under Kassander, circa 315-294 BC. AR Tetradrachm (25.5 mm, 17.10 g). Amphipolis mint. Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion skin headdress. Rev. AAE Ξ AN Δ POY, Zeus Aëtophoros seated left on low throne, holding long sceptre in his left hand and eagle standing right with closed wings in his right; to left, Λ above torch; below throne - a fly. Price 453. Nearly extremely fine.

25 Thrace, Lysimacheia, circa 261-220 BC, overstruck on Seleucid issue of Antiochus II Theos. AE (16.6 mm, 2.87 g). Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin. Rev. ΛΥΣΙΜΑ–ΧΕΩΝ around, uncertain linear object, Nike standing left(?). HGC 3.2, 1500; SNG Copenhagen 914-917. Nice green patina, good very fine. Cf. similar overstrike coin in CNG E-Auction 504 (17 November 2021), 22. A rare Hellenistic overstrike! Historically important coin.

27 Macedon, Kings. Philip V, 221-179 BC. Pella or Amphipolis mint, struck ca. 200/197-179 BC. AE (18.1 mm, 3.50 g.). Laureate, bearded head of Zeus right. Rev. B-A, Athena Alkidemos advancing right, preparing to throw a javelin and holding spear, thunderbolt to lower right. Mamroth, Bronzemünzen 11a; Touratsoglou, Macedonia 8; HGC 3, 1076. Dark green patina. Very fine.

28 Macedon, Kings. Philip V, 221-179 BC. Pella or Amphipolis mint, struck circa 200/197-179 BC. AE (22.9 mm, 7.55 g.). Helmeted head of Perseus right; harpa over shoulder. Rev. B-A, Eagle standing left, head right, with wings spread, on plow right; monogram to left. Touratsoglou, Macedonia 18; HGC 3, 1070. Very fine with a lovely green patina. Rarer issue of Philip V and a common type for his successor – his son king Perseus.



29 Macedon, Kings. Time of Philip V and Perseus, Pella or Amphipolis mint, circa 187-168 BC. AR Tetrobol (13.6 mm, 2.07 g). Head of a Maenad with a wreath, earring and necklace to right. Rev. MAKE- Δ ON Ω N, Prow of galley to right, in the right field - Π. SNG Copenhagen 1290-1292; SNG Ashmolean 3287; HGC 3, 236. Porous, serrated edges and with light corrosion. Very fine.

30 Macedonia, Roman Protectorate. Thessalonika, 167-165 BC. Praetor D. Iunius Silanus. AE (21.7 mm, 9.58 g). Facing mask of Silenos. Rev. Wreath around MAKE- Δ ON Ω N, above D(ecreto). AMNG 212; SNG Copenhagen 1324-1326; Touratsoglou, Macedonia 25; HGC 3, 1117 corr. Nice green patina. About good very fine.

31 Macedonia, Roman Protectorate, 168-167 BC. Time of Aemilius Paullus, C. Publilius, quaestor. AE (22.5 mm, 11.99 g.). Helmeted head of Roma to right, wearing winged Phrygian helmet. Rev. TAMIOY ΓΑΙΟΥ / ΠΟΠΛΙΛΙΟΥ, Oak wreath within. AMNG p. 66, 203; SNG Copenhagen 1318; HGC 3, 1114. Green patina, very fine. A rare variant without MAKEΔΟΝΩΝ in the legend.

34 Paeonia, Kings of. Patraos, circa 335-315 BC. Astibos or Damastion mint. AR Tetrobol (14 mm, 2.29 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΠΑΤΡΑ-ΟΥ, eagle with closed wings standing to right, thunderbolt (fulmen) in right field. Obverse struck slightly off center, otherwise, about good very fine with excellent metal. HCG 3, 150 var. Extremely rare and apparently unpublished with this symbol and the legend behind of the eagle. Of the finest classical style of the portrait!

AΠΟΛ ΕΠΙ ΚΑΔΟΥ, double stellate pattern. Ceka 3; BMC 15. Almost extremely fine, well centred with an entire reverse legend readable with an excellent grade of the silver.

The ancient city of Histiaia, located on the northern coast of the island of Euboea in Greece, is well-known for its distinctive and beautiful coinage, particularly from the Classical period. The civic late tetrobols were produced under Macedonian influence.



38 Euboea. Histiaia, ca. 181-141 BC. AR Tetrobol (12 mm, 1.61 g.). Wreathed head of the nymph Histiaia to right. Rev. [IΣΤΙ]–AIΕ Ω N, Nymph seated right on stern of galley; symbol wing on prow left. HGC 4, 1525. Good very fine.

39 Attica. Athens, circa 470-454 BC. AR Tetradrachm (24 mm, 17.01 g). Helmeted head of Athena to right, with frontal eye. Rev. BAΣIΛΕΩΣ – ΠΡΟΥΣΙΟΥ, Turtle lyre with six strings to front. MHP monogram in the middle above. Waddington, Recueil Géneral 21.2; SNG Ashmolean 447-8; HGC 7, 628. Green patina. Very fine. Interesting countermarks!



46 Bithynia. Kings. Prusias II, 180-149 BC. AE (16.5 mm, 3.52 g.), Head of king Prusias to right, with a winged diadem. Rev. BAΣIΛΕΩΣ - ΠΡΟΥΣΙΟΥ, Heracles standing left, holding club set on ground in his right hand and lion skin in his left, monogram in right field. Waddington, Recueil Géneral 25 (monogram 3); HGC 7, 634. Near extremely fine.



Pontos. Amisos, 95-90 BC or 80-70 BC, time of Mithridates VI. AE (21.5 mm, 8.99 g.). Laureate head of Zeus right. Rev. AMIΣΟΥ below, Eagle standing over thunderbolt, monogram to left. SNG Copenhagen 134; SNG von Aulock 56; HGC 7, 245. Dark brown glossy patina. Good Very Fine.



48 Pontos. Amisos, 85-65 BC, time of Mithridates VI. AE (19 mm, 7.62 g.). Aegis with Gorgon facing. Rev. [A]MI-ΣΟΥ Nike advancing right, holding palm over her left shoulder; to left and right, two monograms. SNG BM Black Sea 1777-1191; HGC 7, 242. Nice dark patina, good very fine.



49 Pontos. Amisos, 95-90 BC. AE (18.6 mm, 8.75 g.). Helmeted head of Ares to right. Rev. AMI– Σ OY Sword in sheath; star-increscent and IB across upper field, two monograms in lower field. Malloy 32d; HGC 7, 241. Good very fine, natural green patina.



50 Troas. Skepsis, circa 400-310 BC. AE (9.6 mm, 1.36 g.). Rhyton with forepart of Pegasos to left. Rev. Palm tree flanked by Σ -K, all within linear box. SNG Copenhagen 477; SNG von Aulock 7650. Very fine.



Troas. Kebren, circa 400-310 BC. AE (20 mm, 6.69 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right, E below. Rev. Head of ram to right; K below. BMC 23-27; SNG Copenhagen 263-264. Good very fine, earthen deposits, nice patina. Rarer in the larger denomination!



Mysia. Parion, 4th century BC. AR Hemidrachm (12.7 mm, 2.22 g.). ΠΑ-PI, Cow standing left, head right; uncertain symbol below. Rev. Gorgoneion facing. SNG BN 1368; SNG Copenhagen 263. Some corrosion, very fine.



Mysia. Lampsakos, circa 3rd – 1st century BC. AE (20 mm, 8.29 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΛΑΜ to right; Kithara (Lyre); in left field, forepart of Pegasos to left. Plankenhorn, Mysien, p. 96, 40; SNG Paris 1234; SNG Tübingen 2307. Nice green patina, nearly extremely fine. Interesting overstrike!



Mysia. Lampsakos, circa 3rd – 1st century BC. AE (23.9 mm, 10.28 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΛAM to right; Kithara (Lyre); in left field, forepart of Pegasos to left. Plankenhorn, Mysien, p. 96, 40; SNG Paris 1234; SNG Tübingen 2307. Nice green patina, extremely fine. Interesting overstrike!



55 Aiolis, Elaia, circa 450-400 BC. AR Diobol (9.3 mm, 1.31 g.). Helmeted head of Athena to left. Rev. Laurel wreath; E-Λ-A-[I] in four corners; all within incuse square. SNG München 382; SNG Copenhagen 166. Very fine, some corrosion and an insignificant scratch.



Ionia. Miletos, circa 360-330 BC. AR Drachm (16 mm, 3.56 g). Aristagoras, magistrate. Laureate head of Apollo to left. Rev. [A]PIΣΤΑΓΟΡΑΣ, Lion walking left, head turned back to right towards eight-rayed star above; civic monogram MI in left field. Deppert-Lipitz 221 (V18/R21); Marcellesi 3. About extremely fine.



57 Ionia. Erythrai, ca. 325-315 BC. AR Drachm (16 mm, 3.61 g.). Rhodian standard. Asclepiades and Demados magistrates. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin. Rev. EPY – [A]ΣΚΛΗΠΙΑΔΗΣ / [Δ]ΗΜΑΔΟΣ, Club and quiver in bowcase; to left, owl standing left, head facing. Kinns, Period III, Group IB, 76; SNG Copenhagen 632. Good very fine, slightly off center with an excellent metal.



Ionia, Kolophon, circa 420-400 BC. AR Tetartemorion (6.3 mm, 0.28 g.). Laureate head of Apollo to right. Rev. Rev. Large TE as a mark of value (abbreviated denomination) within shallow incuse square. Milne 34-35; SNG von Aulock 2021. Toned. Very fine.



Ionia. Phokaia, ca. 521-478 BC. AR 1/12 Stater (9.3 mm, 1.30 g.). Head of Nymph to left, wearing helmet or close fitting cap. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. SNG Kayhan 522; SNG von Aulock 1813; SNG München 796; Rosen 596. Porous surface. Very fine. Rare.



60 Lydia. Mostene, 2nd century BC. AE (19.4 mm, 8.36 g.). Laureate head of Zeus to right. Rev. $\Lambda V \Delta \Omega N$ / MOΣTHN[ΩN]; Youth rider on horseback to right, holding labrys; EP to left, monogram to right. BMC p. 161, 1-2; SNG Tübingen 3729; SNG Copenhagen 284. Earthen deposits. Good very fine. A rare issue!



61 Ionia. Phokaia, ca. 530-500 BC. AR Triobol (9.7 mm, 1.79 g.). Head of griffin to left. Rev. Quadripartite incuse punch. BMC Ionia, p. 215, 82; SNG Kayhan 514. Very fine.



Phrygia. Kibyra, ca. 166-84 BC. AR Drachm (15.8 mm, 2.35 g.). Helmeted head to the right. Reverse: KIBYPATΩN below, warrior galloping on horseback right in full armour and with a long spear; palm frond to the upper left, IO under the horse. SNG Copenhagen 266; SNG von Aulock 3709; HGC 7, 707. Very fine, weak obverse strike. Cf. Eid Mar Auctions 4 (17 September 2024), no. 170.



Caria, Kasolaba. Circa 450-400 BC. AR Hemiobol Milesian standard (7 mm, 0,43 g.). Head of ram to right. Rev. Youthful male head to right; Karian letters flanking. Konuk, Kasolaba 5; Konuk, Coin M15-M17 (uncertain issue); Troxell 9A; SNG Keckman 866-882; HNO 945. Very fine.
