Versteigerungsbedingungen

Die Versteigerung erfolgt im Auftrag und für die Rechnung der Eigentümer unter Einhaltung der sich aus der Versteigerungsordnung (BGBI I 1976,1346) ergebenden und für Kommissionäre geltenden gesetzlichen Bestimmungen des BGB und HGB gegen Barzahlung des Kaufpreises in Euro-Währung. Durch Abgabe eines Gebotes werden die Versteigerungsbedingungen anerkannt, dies gilt auch für schriftliche Gebote.

Der Zuschlagpreis bildet die Berechnungsgrundlage für das vom Käufer zu zahlende Aufgeld. Verbraucher aus EU-Ländern zahlen einheitlich ein Aufgeld von 23%, wobei im Gesamtbetrag die Differenzbesteuerung enthalten ist.

Käufern mit Wohnsitz außerhalb der EU wird ein Aufgeld von 20% auf den Zuschlagpreis berechnet. Wird die Ware vom Käufer selbst oder durch Dritte ausgeführt, wird die gesetzliche Umsatzsteuer berechnet, jedoch bei Vorlage der gesetzlich vorgeschriebenen Ausfuhrrnachweise erstattet. Führen wir die Ware selbst aus, wird die Umsatzsteuer nicht berechnet.

Im Ausland anfallende Steuern und Zölle trägt in jedem Fall der Käufer.

Sofern nichts anderes vereinbart wird, ist die Zahlung der Auktionsrechnung bei anwesenden Käufern sofort, bei schriftlichen Bietern spätestens 10 Tage nach Erhalt fällig. Bei Zahlungsverzug werden Zinsen von 1,5 % pro Monat berechnet.

Wird die Zahlung nicht sofort an den Versteigerer geleistet oder die Abnahme der zugeschlagenen Stücke verweigert, so findet die Übergabe der Sache an den Ersteigerer nicht statt. Der Ersteigerer verliert vielmehr seine Rechte an dem Zuschlag, und die Sache kann auf seine Kosten erneut versteigert werden. In diesem Fall haftet der Ersteigerer für den Ausfall, dagegen hat er auf Mehrerlös keinen Anspruch.

Der Zuschlag erfolgt nach dreimaligem Ausruf des höchsten Gebotes und verpflichtet zur Abnahme und Zahlung. Bei Meinungsverschiedenheiten über den Zuschlag wird die Nummer noch einmal ausgerufen. Der Versteigerer ist berechtigt, Nummern zu vereinen oder zu trennen. Eine Vorausnahme von Nummern erfolgt nicht. Der Zutritt zur Versteigerung ist nur Interessenten gestattet, die einen Katalog vom Versteigerer erhalten haben.

Schriftliche Aufträge werden von uns ohne Auftragsprovision gewissenhaft durchgeführt. Aufträge von uns unbekannten Sammlern oder Händlern können nur ausgeführt werden, wenn ein Depot hinterlegt wird oder Referenzen benannt werden. Schriftliche Aufträge bitten wir frühzeitig einzusenden. Im Bedarfsfall ist der Auktionator berechtigt, die Limits 3 - 5 % zu überschreiten. Bei mehreren gleichhohen Geboten erhält das zuerst eingegangene den Zuschlag. Unlimitierte Aufträge haben keinen Anspruch auf unbedingte Ausführung.

Der Versand geht zu Lasten und auf Risiko des Ersteigerers bzw. Empfängers. Das Auktionsgut bleibt bis zur vollständigen Bezahlung aller Forderungen aus Anlass der Versteigerung Eigentum des Verkäufers. Ist der Käufer Vollkaufmann, so ist Lörrach als Gerichtsstand vereinbart. Für das Mahnverfahren gilt die Zuständigkeit des Amtsgerichts Lörrach auch in allen anderen Fällen als vereinbart. Ansonsten ist es Lörrach nur, wenn nur die Firma Münzen und Medaillen GmbH ihrem allgemeinen Gerichtsstand in der BRD hat, oder wenn alle Ansprüche im Wege des Mahnverfahrens geltend gemacht werden, oder wenn die im Klageweg in Anspruch zu nehmende Vertragspartei nach Vertragsabschluss ihren gewöhnlichen Aufenthaltsort aus dem Geltungsbereich der BRD verlegt hat, oder ihr Wohnsitz oder gewöhnlicher Aufenthaltsort zum Zeitpunkt der Klage nicht bekannt ist.

Die Beschreibung im Katalog ist gewissenhaft durchgeführt. Sie begründet jedoch keine Rechts- oder Sachmängelhaftung gemäß §§ 434,459f BGB. Die Angabe der Erhaltung ist streng nach den im deutschen Münzhandel üblichen Erhaltungseinstufungen vorgenommen und gilt als persönliche Beurteilung. Bei der Auktion anwesende Käufer kaufen grundsätzlich "wie besehen". Da durch Vorbesichtigung Gelegenheit gegeben ist, sich vom Erhaltungszustand des Versteigerungsgutes zu überzeugen, können nach erfolgtem Zuschlag Reklamationen nur bei irrtümlich übersehener Henkel- oder Fassungsspur oder gestopftem Loch berücksichtigt werden. Bei Losen mit mehreren Stücken sind die Stückzahlen nur Circa-Angaben, irrtümliche Zuschreibungen sind im

Einzelfall nicht ausgeschlossen. Diese Lose sind nach erfolgtem Zuschlag von jeder Reklamation ausgeschlossen. Der Versteigerer kann bei eventuellen Meinungsverschiedenheiten, bzw. Beanstandungen einen vereidigten Sachverständigen seiner Wahl (die Kosten trägt der unterliegende Teil) beauftragen. Eventuelle Beanstandungen können nur innerhalb 8 Tagen nach der Auktion, bzw. nach Erhalt der ersteigerten Stücke, berücksichtigt werden.

Die Echtheit der Stücke wird bis zur Höhe des Kaufpreises garantiert.

Die beigedruckten Preise sind Schätzpreise, die unter- oder überschritten werden können. Aufträge, die unter 80 % des Schätzpreises liegen, können nicht bearbeitet werden.

Ausländische Kunden kaufen nach den Devisen-, Zoll- und Steuerbestimmungen ihres Landes. Versandformalitäten werden vom Versteigerer erledigt.

Das Bieten per Telefon oder Internet geschieht ausschließlich auf Risiko des Bieters. Ausfälle des Systems z. B. aufgrund von Netzstörungen oder Hardwareausfällen können nicht ausgeschlossen werden, und der Versteigerer haftet nicht für die Folgen technischer Mängel oder von Verbindungsproblemen.

Terms and Conditions of Auction

The auction is conducted on behalf and for the account of the appropriate proprietors of the goods and is subject to the federal Auction Regulation (Versteigerungsordnung BGBl I 1976,1346) published in the Federal Law Gazette Vol. 1, 1976,1546 and the relevant provisions for factors in accordance with the German Civil Code (BGB) and Commercial Code (HGB). Payment of the hammer price has to be made in cash and in EURO. The submission of an offer implies the expressed acknowledgement of these Terms and Conditions of Auction ; the same applies to the submission of an offer in writing.

The hammer-price is the basis for the calculation of the buyer's surcharge. For buyers from EEC countries there is a surcharge of 23% which includes the relevant tax.

For buyers from countries outside the EEC there is a surcharge of 20%. If the goods are exported by the buyer or a third party the relevant VAT will be charged but refunded on presentation of the legal export certificate.

All foreign taxes and custom duties must be carried by the buyer.

Delivery will be made against payment in EURO with no bank charges to the auctioneer. Unless mutually agreed otherwise, payment of the auction bill from purchasers present at the auction is due immediately. From purchasers who have submitted a bid in writing, payment is due within 10 days after receipt of the goods. Defaulted payments shall bear an interest charge of 1,5 % per month.

Should payment to the auctioneer not be made immediately or should the acceptance of the awarded item be refused, such item will not be handed over to the purchaser. Instead the purchaser shall forfeit all right and title in and to such item from the award and the item may again be put to auction at this buyer's cost. In this event the buyer shall be liable for any shortfall, while he shall have no right or claim towards any excess proceeds.

An item will be knocked down after the highest bid has been called three times. The award shall be a binding commitment and liability on the part of the bidder to take acceptance and delivery of the item or items so awarded. In the event of any dispute with regard to the award the lot will be put up again for bidding. The auctioneer reserves the right to combine and to separate lots. Lots will not be called out of sequence. Access to the auction will only be permitted to interested persons who received a catalogue from the auctioneer.

Orders submitted in writing will be carried out diligently and without charge of an extra commission. Orders from collectors unknown to the auctioneer can only be accepted and carried out if a deposit or references to the satisfaction of the auctioneer are given. Written bids should be submitted early. If necessary, the auctioneer is allowed to increase the bids by 3 - 5 %. Should several bids be obtained in writing bidding the same price or prices for a given lot, the bid first received shall be given the award. Unlimited bids shall not oblige the auctioneer to consider, accept or carry out such order.

Shipment of the goods shall be for the sole cost and risk of the purchaser or recipient. The auctioned goods remain the sole and exclusive property of the vendor until full payment of any and all dues and claims in connection with the auction has been made. In the event the purchaser is a merchant (in the sense of the German commercial laws) Lörrach shall be the agreed and exclusive place of jurisdiction. The competence of the District Court (Amtsgericht) of Lörrach is agreed in respect of summary proceedings for the collection of defaulted payments (Mahnverfahren) as well as in any and all other cases. Should the purchaser not be a merchant Lörrach shall be the place of jurisdiction with the District Court of Lörrach's competence, if only the auctioneer has his ordinary legal domicil in the Federal Republic of Germany or if claims are made by way of summary proceedings of collection (Mahnverfahren) or if the defendant has moved his ordinary legal domicil outside the jurisdiction of the Federal Republic of Germany or if the legal domicil of the defendant is unknown to the auctioneer at the time of filing a suit. To the exclusion of any other legislation German law, as in force at the time, shall be applied for the settlement of any and all legal or judicial matters.

The specifications and descriptions in the catalogue have been prepared diligently and in good faith. They do, however, not constitute the acceptance by the auctioneer of any warranty or liability in respect of defect in material or title. The state of preservation of items is strictly assessed in accordance with the grades accepted by the German coin trade and only represents an individual and personal assessment. Purchasers present at the auction acquire items strictly on the basis of "as is where is" and "as inspected". In view of the opportunity of prior inspection to ascertain the state and condition of the auction lots, complaints and objections made after the sale will only be considered, if by obvious error or mistake loop or traces of mountings, trimmings and settings, or the plugging of a hole have remained unnoticed. If and when auctioned in lots, the quantities of individual pieces given only represent an approximate figure. An error in the allocation of individual pieces to a certain lot cannot be excluded. Such lots are, therefore, excluded from any complaints or objections after the lot is knocked down. In the event of disputes or complaints as to the quality of an item the auctioneer may call upon a generally sworn expert of the trade, which the auctioneer may choose at his sole discretion. The costs of such expert shall be borne by the party losing the dispute according to the expert's decision. Complaints or objections, if justified, will only be considered if made and received by the auctioneer within 8 days after the auction or after receipt of the lots. The authenticity of the coins is warranted up to the total purchase price.

The prices set out in the catalogue are estimates only, which may be exceeded or undercut. Orders for less than 80 per cent of the estimated price cannot be accepted.

Purchasers from abroad will have to observe all applicable laws and regulations in respect of foreign exchange, customs duties and taxation of their country. The auctioneer will only discharge such formalities, which have to be observed, in the Federal Republic of Germany in connection with the export of the purchased item(s). Unless stipulated otherwise herein, the general rules and regulations for auctions applicable in Germany shall govern any transaction in respect of the auction; German law shall also be applicable in relation to purchasers from abroad. Only the German text has legal force.



Erich Wäckerlin

20th December 1947- 8th January 2018



Erich Wäckerlin was born on 20th December 1947 in Frauenfeld (Thurgau) in Switzerland. He went to school in Wollerau (Schwyz) and Zurich. After his Matura exam in 1966 he decided to study biology at the University of Zurich, which led him to obtain a *Lizenziat* and doctorate in Physical Chemistry. Between 1978 and 1980 he and his young family lived in Bern, where he worked as a patent controller in the patent office of the Eidgenössisches Amt für Geistiges Eigentum. After that he transferred to the European Patent Office in Munich, where he held the positions of patent controller, director, and member of the complaints department. Even after his retirement he continued to work part-time as a judge in the patent office in St. Gallen. He also instructed and prepared prospective patent lawyers for the European examination until a short time before his death.

Erich Wäckerlin was a knowledgeable, painstaking and enthusiastic collector. He bought his first Crusader coin in 1971, and his last in winter 2017, shortly before his death.

His interests became broader over time: as well as coins from Edessa, Tripolis and the Kingdom of Jerusalem he added Byzantium, Achaia, Armenia, Rhodes, Cyprus and the Islamic rulers to his collection. Alongside the numismatic identification and classification of his coins, he also took an interest in the political and historical background of the Crusades: the motives and beliefs of those who took part, the development of states and kingdoms, the acquisition and loss of power. He was also knowledgeable on economic history, metallurgy and coin minting techniques, and he taught himself to read the Armenian and Arabic inscriptions.

What was it about the Crusaders that he found so fascinating? A vibrant mix of powers and cultures met in the Eastern Mediterranean, leaving their mark as they came into conflict, or mingled with one another. The ideology behind the Crusades was more than simply the acquisition of political power. The aim was to reconquer Jerusalem, a centre of immense religious significance. Through this act the crusaders expected to gain their personal salvation- a doctrine which led popes, saints and sultans to issue calls to arms in the name of God. The coins of the Crusader states do not only represent the ideology of leadership, but were also intended for daily transactions: this ambivalence between conflict and cooperation fascinated Erich Wäckerlin.

THE CRUSADER STATES

It was the main aim of the crusades to conquer Jerusalem, make it a Christian city, and to make pilgrimages there possible again. But beside this there could be other motives for participating in a crusade. Baldwin de Boulogne, younger brother of Godfrey of Boulogne, apparently went on the First Crusade to conquer some land for himself. He parted from the army, took some small fortresses west of the Euphrates, and was invited by the unpopular Armenian Toros of Edessa to come and help him. Toros adopted Baldwin, made him his successor, and died shortly afterwards under suspicious circumstances. Baldwin established the **County of Edessa**, the first crusader state, in 1098. In 1144 the Seljuk Zengi conquered the town and fortress of Edessa. The first crusader state to be founded was the first, too, to be lost.

In 1099 the Norman Bohemond of Taranto founded the **Principality of Antioch** after a siege which lasted eight months. The walls of Antioch, built mainly during Byzantine rule, withstood all attempts to storm them. The city fell through treachery.

In 1268 Antioch was captured by the Mamluk sultan Baibars from Egypt.

The army of the First Crusade took Jerusalem in 1099. According to contemporary reports the bloodshed afterwards must have been enormous. All inhabitants, Muslims, Jews, and Christians alike, were killed. Godfrey of Boulogne (= Gottfried von Bouillon) was elected to be ruler. He called himself "Advocate of the Holy Sepulchre". He died in 1100, and his successor, his brother Baldwin I of Edessa, was crowned King of Jerusalem. In the middle of the twelfth century the **Kingdom of Jerusalem** stretched from the sea to east of the river Jordan and from south Syria to the Sinai. The land was divided and granted to several barons of the kingdom, so the **Lordship of Tyre**, the **County of Jaffa**, the **Lordship of Beirut**, and the **Lordship of Sidon**.

In 1187 after the battle of Hattin against Saladin, Sultan of Egypt, the city of Jerusalem was lost, and the kingdom was reduced to a strip of land along the Syrian coastline. Acre, the last stronghold, fell in 1291, as did Tyre, Sidon and Beirut. The title of "King of Jerusalem" was then assumed by the kings of Cyprus.

The **County of Tripoli** in Lebanon controlled the narrow coastal plain between the Principality of Antioch and the Kingdom of Jerusalem. In theory the counts owed allegiance to the king of Jerusalem. Bertrand, son of Raymond de St. Gilles, became the first count in 1109. The port of Tripoli was important for the trade between Europe and Asia. It was one of the ports from which goods which had come along the Silk Road by caravans were shipped to Italian ports. In 1289 Tripoli was captured by the Mamluks.

In 1191 Richard Coeur de Lion, on his way to the crusade, seized Cyprus from Isaac Ducas Comnenus, a Great-nephew of the Byzantine Emperor Manuel I, after some of his sailors had been taken prisoner. Richard sold the island then to the Knights Templar, and in 1192 it was passed on to the French Lusignan family. In 1197 the Emperor Henry VI recognized Aimery de Lusignan as King of Cyprus. When in 1291 Acre was taken by the Mamluks many refugees came to Cyprus which was the last foothold in the East. For long periods the **Kingdom of Cyprus** was ruled by child kings under the regency of members of the Ibelin family, whereas the actual power lay in the hands of the Genoese and the Venetian merchants who struggled for precedence. In 1373 a Genoese shareholding company, a Mahona, occupied Cyprus and extorted large sums of money from the Cypriots.

In 1489 the last Queen, Catherine Cornaro, daughter of a Venetian nobleman, who had married the last King, James II., sold the island to Venice. Cyprus remained a colony of the Republic of Venice until 1571 when it was taken by the Ottoman Empire.

The **Latin Empire of Constantinople** was the result of the Fourth Crusade (1202-1204). The intention was to attack Egypt first and then Jerusalem. The Republic of Venice agreed to build transport vessels and galleys for 35 000 crusaders, to man the ships, and to take the soldiers to their destination. The crusaders, however, could not raise the sum for payment on which they had agreed. Alexios IV Angelos, a Byzantine prince, promised the crusaders the help of a Byzantine army and financial support if the crusaders dethroned Alexios III and helped Alexios IV to become emperor instead. So the army went to Constantinople. But Alexios IV was not popular in Constantinople. He was strangled, and there was no hope for the crusaders to get the promised Byzantine support. So in April 1204 they plundered the city. In May 1204 Baldwin IX, Count of Flanders, was crowned Baldwin I, Emperor of the Latin Empire of Constantinople. The Byzantine territory was then divided into several crusader states, e. g. the **Kingdom of Thessalonica** (1205-1224), the **Principality of Achaea** (1205-1432), and the **Duchy of Athens** (1205-1458). Constant wars with the Bulgarians and the empire of Nicaea weakened the empire until finally Michael VIII Palaiologos, Co-Emperor of Nicaea, re-conquered Constantinople in 1261.

Venice took possession of several islands, e. g. **Crete**, **Euboea (Negroponte)** and the **Ionian Islands**. The Order of the Knights Hospitaller of Saint John occupied the island of **Rhodes** from 1310 to 1522 when the Ottomans forced them to move to Malta.



THE CRUSADERS: TIMETABLE

326	Constantine I's mother Helena visits Jerusalem and makes it the main centre of Christian pilgrimages.
380	In the Edict of Thessalonika Emperor Theodosius orders Christianity to be the state religion of the Roman empire.
622	The Muslim conquests begin.
637	Jerusalem is taken from the Byzantine empire by the Arabs, but Christians and Jews are tolerated. Christians can still make their pilgrimages to Jerusalem.
1071	Battle of Manzikert: The Byzantine Empire loses most of Asia Minor to the Seljuk Turks.
1095	Pope Urban II preaches a crusade in aid of the Christian Byzantine empire which is oppressed by the Turks migrating from Central Asia to Anatolia and threatening the access to the Holy Land.
1098	The County of Edessa is founded as the first crusader state.
1098	The Principality of Antioch is founded.
1099	Jerusalem is captured by the Christian crusaders. The inhabitants are massacred. Godfrey of Bouillon is made <i>Advocatus Sancti Sepulchri</i> , and the Kingdom of Jerusalem is established.
1109	The County of Tripoli (Lebanon) is founded.
1144	The fall of Edessa.
1187	Jerusalem is taken by Saladin.
1191	Richard the Lionheart conquers Rhodes on his way to the Holy Land.
1204	Constantinople is conquered and plundered by crusaders and Venetians. The Latin Empire is constituted which lasts to 1261 ("Latin" as opposed to "Greek", i. e. the Byzantine Empire).
1204	Crete, Euboea, and the Ionian Islands come under the rule of Venice.
1205	Several Frankish states are founded on former Byzantine territory: The Kingdom of Thessalonica (1205-1224), the Principality of Achaea (the Peloponnese, 1205-1432), the Lordship of Argos and Nauplia (1205-1388), the Duchy of Athens (1205–1458) etc.
1229	Frederick II of Hohenstaufen negotiates a treaty with the Sultan of Egypt which returns Jerusalem to the Christians.
After 1243	The Mongol invasion of Anatolia leads to a loss of stability and the establishment of a number of small Turkish emirates or beyliks.
1268	Antioch is taken by the Mamluks of Egypt.
1289	Tripoli falls to the Mamluks.
1291	Acre, the main port of the Kingdom of Jerusalem and fortress of the Knights Hospitallers, is destroyed by the Mamluks.
1310	The Knights Hospitaller of Saint John occupy Rhodes (until 1522).
1346	The Maona, a chartered company of Genoese merchants, invades the island of Chios and the town of Phocaea in Asia Minor in order to exploit the island and to share the profit among the shareholders.
1453	Constantinople is taken by the Ottoman Turks.
1489	Queen Catherine Cornaro sells Cyprus to Venice.
1522	The Knights Hospitaller of Saint John move from Rhodes to Malta.
1571	Cyprus is conquered by the Ottoman Turks.

In numbering the quarters of a cross we follow the heraldic usage which describes the quarters like the fields in a coat of arms. So the upper left quarter is the first quarter, the upper right quarter is the second quarter, the lower left quarter is the third quarter, and the lower right quarter is the fourth quarter.

No attempt was made to reproduce the forms of the letters of the coin legends. The legends are given in Latin capitals as faithfully as we could read.

Metcalf is not certain about the attribution to Tripoli: "Unattributed copper coin, possibly Tripolitan". He takes the image to be an "M", an annulet above, a cross below. And so the coin is depicted on Metcalf plate 21. I think that is wrong. The image of the obverse in Metcalf is upside down. The note in Malloy/Preston/Seltman, too, "this uncertain late type also exists with cross below and annulet above" seems to rest on an error. So far no clearly legible example of this type has been found, and therefore, of course, the coin can be positioned both ways. Schlumberger read on the two examples in his collection remnants of the word TRIPOLIS (in both cases on both sides). To me there seems to be no reasonable possible doubt that the coin belongs to Tripoli. Schlumberger takes the image on the obverse to be a degenerated châtel tournois which reminds him of the Genoese castle. However, there is hardly any resemblance to the châtel tournois. Much more probable is the interpretation as a stylized rendering of the three towers of Tripolis. The low weight is probably the reason for the late dating (the Schlumberger coin: 0.65 g; Metcalf 560: 0.47 g; this coin: 0.49 g). In Malloy/Preston/Seltman's Price Guide is written, "AE Pougeoise, anonymous, after 1266". But the name for the nominal is probably speculative.

Metcalf and catalog "Wisconsin" of the "History of the Crusades" (University of Wisconsin) think Bohemond IV, 1201-1232, is more probable. The denomination, too, has been discussed. Schlumberger calls the coin a denier. MPS speak of a fractional denier, Metcalf of a fractional coinage, and he says on p. 145, "a semi-quantitative analysis by XRF of the Ashmolean specimen established that it contained no silver." Therefore it cannot be described as "billon denier". Metcalf goes on, "The extreme scarcity of the type (2 at Antioch) suggests a short-lived issue or perhaps even some sort of ceremonial piece." For the pedigree of this coin: According to the CNG ticket the coin comes from the Alistair Lilburn Collection. The auction catalogue of the Lilburn Collection (Baldwin, London, Auction 49, Sept. 25th, 2006), however, does not mention this coin. But possibly CNG bought part of the collection outside the auction sale. With certainty this coin was in the collection of Dimitri Dolivo, Lausanne, see Münzen und Medaillen AG Basel, Auktion 30, 5. 11. 1965, Nr. 790. In the auction catalogue on p. 61 the following description can be found: "790 ... De toute rareté, probablement unique. Proviens de la collection du prince de Furstenberg, vente A. E. Cahn 75, 30 mai 1932, n° 1881 ("inédit"), anciennement collection F. de Saulcy." Indeed, this coin is in the Adolph E. Cahn auction catalogue 75, ... Das Fürstlich Fürstenbergische Münzkabinett zu Donaueschingen, Teil 1, Nr. 1881, and is illustrated on plate 37. In the prologue it says on p. 93, "The former collection of Herr F. de Saulcy which served as a basis for his work "Numismatique des croisades" was acquired for the Fürstenberg cabinet through Freiherr (Franz Simon) von Pfaffenhausen in 1846. On p. 94 of the catalogue the coin is described as "Billondenar von Boemund V., 1233-1251" and "Schl. - . Unedited". However, this is not quite correct as Schlumberger on p. 53 of his work "Numismatique de l'Orient Latin" described the coin: "La collection Fürstenberg possède une variété de ce denier (Schlumb. pl. III, 4), sans le différent de la légende du revers; en autre, l'H est remplacé par un N, ce qui donne: ANTIOCΝΙΑ." F. de Saulcy is the famous French orientalist Louis-Félicien-Joseph Caignart de Saulcy, 1807-1880. In his work Numismatique des croisades, Paris 1847, the coin is not mentioned, not even in the supplement, possibly through an error.

On the other hand, not to mention the name of the Islamic prophet in a coinage controlled by Christians was one of two demands formulated by the papal legate Eudes de Châteauroux in his search for a reason why God had punished the Catholic Christianity through the lost battle of al-Mansûra in Egypt which had cost the lives of thousands of knights and brought captivity to the king of France. The demand to abolish such sins was formulated by 1250 and sent to Rome, while a formal interdict by the pope followed only in 1251. Subsequently in 1251 new Christian types were introduced and therefore the short period 1250-1251 would correspond well with the existence of a transitional type as Bates type III, and the rarity of these dirhams could be explained by the brevity of the period. In this case the Hijri date should not be regarded as the date of striking, but either as the last date of mutual support of the kingdom of Jerusalem and Damascus or as a date of an unknown contract which enabled the free circulation of such coins in some of the Ayyubid states.

ARMENIA

The principality and later kingdom of Cilician Armenia was founded around 1080 on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea by Armenian refugees when the lands of the Kingdom of Armenia south of the Kaukasus mountains were overrun by Seljuk Turk tribes from Central Asia. In 1199 Levon I was crowned king. He received his kingship as a vassal of the German emperor. 




