2 Thrace. Thracian Chersonese, circa 386-338 BC. AR Hemidrachm (12.5 mm, 2.42 g). Forepart of a lion right, head reverted. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square with alternating raised and sunken quarters; a pellet and a branch in opposite sunken quarters. McClean 4081; HGC 3.2, 1437. Good very fine.

3 Thrace. Dikaia, circa 480-450 BC. AR Triobol (11.3 mm, 1.77 g). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion's skin. Rev. Cock standing right in dotted square within shallow incuse square. BMC 3; HGC 3, 1452; May, Dikaia-by-Abdera, 23 (A20/P19); McClean 3986; Schönert-Geiss, 44 (V8/R5). Nice late Archaic style. The head of Herakles on the obverse is well centered. Very fine.

4 Thrace. Maroneia, circa 386-348/7 BC. Zenon, magistrate. AR Triobol (14.5 mm, 2.27 g.). M-A-PΩ, forepart of horse to left. Rev. EΠΙ ZΗΝΩΝΟΣ around, grape-bunch on vine within dotted square. Schönert-Geiss, 521-529. Lustrous, lightly toned. An insignificant tiny crack, otherwise, good very fine.

5 Thrace. Abdera, ca. 336-311 BC. Pythodoros, magistrate. AR Drachm (14.4 mm, 2.60 g.). ABΔH – PITE, griffin crouching left. Re EΠΙ ΠΥΘΟ-, laureate head of Apollo to right within linear square. May, Abdera, 553 (period IX). Good very fine, with a nice portrait of Apollo!



6 Thrace. Thasos, circa 500-478 BC. AR Stater (20.6 mm, 7.93 g.). Nude, ithyphallic satyr, with long beard and long hair, moving right in 'running-kneeling' position, holding a nymph in his arms, who raises her right hand in protest. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 6, 331; SNG Copenhagen 1009. Somewhat porous surface, otherwise on high relief, otherwise, very fine.



Thrace. Thasos, circa 500-463 BC. AR Drachm (15.7 mm, 4.32 g). Nude, ithyphallic and bearded satyr moving right in the archaic 'running-kneeling' position, holding a nymph in his arms, who wears thin robes and raises her right hand in protest. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 6, 331; Le Rider, Thasiennes 2; SNG Copenhagen 1008. Very fine.



Thrace. Thasos, circa 500-480 BC. AR Diobol (10.9 mm, 1.09 g.). Naked satyr running right in kneeling stance. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 4; HGC 6, 333. Good very fine.



9 Thrace. Thasos, 412-404 BC. AR Trihemiobol (12 mm, 0.86 g.). Naked satyr running to left holding kantharos. Rev. Amphora, $\Theta A \Sigma - I \Omega N$. Le Rider, Thasiennes 27; SNG Cop. 1032; HGC 6, 351. Porous. Good very fine.



Thrace. Thasos, circa 500-480 BC. AR Obol (8.8 mm, 0.57 g.). Two dolphins swimming in opposite directions, pellets around. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 9; HGC 6, 337; BMC 18-22. Nice toning. Good very fine.



11 Thrace. Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Hemiobol (8 mm, 0.42 g.). Head of satyr right, with full head of hair. Rev. Two dolphins swimming in opposite direction, ΘA- Σ I around; all within shallow incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 12; HGC 6, 340. Pierced. Very fine.



12 Thrace. Thasos, circa 100-75 BC. AR Tetradrachm (32.4 mm, 16.29 g). Wreathed head of young Dionysos to right. Rev. HPAKΛΕΟVΣ / ΣΩΤΗΡΟΣ / ΘΑΣΙΩΝ, Herakles standing facing, head left, holding club, lion skin draped over left arm; monogram MH to inner left. Le Rider, Thasos, 51; Prokopov, Silberprägung, Group XIX; HGC 6, 359. Good very fine.



Macedon. Neapolis, circa 500-480 BC. AR Fourée Stater (18.7 mm, 7.56 g). Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. AMNG III/2, 2; HGC 3, 582; SNG ANS 401. Lightly toned. Very fine.



Macedon. Neapolis, circa 424-350 BC. AR Hemidrachm (13.8 mm, 1.81 g.). Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue. Rev. [N-E] / O-Π, head of the nymph of Neapolis to right, her hair coiled around her head and with a bun at the back, wearing a plain necklace with a pendant. SNG ANS 430-454; HGC 3.1, 588. Well centered. Good very fine.



Macedon. Neapolis, circa 525-450 BC. AR Trihemiobol (10.1 mm, 0.86 g.), Milesian standard. Facing gorgoneion with protruding tongue. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. SNG Cop. 224; SNG ANS 423. Irregular flan. Very fine.



Macedon. Eion, circa 480-470 BC. AR Diobol (9.3 mm, 1.12 g.). Goose standing to right, head turned to left, two pellets to front. Rev. Rough incuse square. Rosen 95; SNG ANS 272; HGC 3.1, 519. Nicely toned, good very fine.



17 Thraco-Macedonian tribes. The Mygdones or Krestones, circa 480-470 BC. AR Diobol (10.3 mm, 1.00 g). Goat kneeling right, head turned back to left, around two pellets; below horizontal line. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Rosen 89; SNG ANS 60 (Akanthos); HGC 3.1, 368 ("Aigai"); Lorber, Goats, Issue 15. Good very fine.



Macedon. Akanthos, circa 480-470 BC. AR Tetrobol (15.7 mm, 2.58 g.). Forepart of a lion to right, pellet above. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. AMNG III/2, 14 var (head to right). Very fine. Rare.



19 Macedon. Akanthos, ca. 430-390 BC. AR Tetrobol (15.1 mm, 2.30 g.). Light 'Thraco-Macedonian' standard. Forepart of bull to left, head right; ΠΕ above. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square with granulated recesses. AMNG III/2, 34-35; HGC 3, 392; McClean 3140. Nicely toned. Good very fine.



20 Akanthos. Circa 500-478 BC. AR Obol (8 mm, 0.46 g). Head of a bull to right. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 3.1, 394. Klein 146. SNG ANS 51. SNG Copenhagen 9. Somewhat rough surface, otherwise, about very fine.



Macedon, kings. Alexander I, 498-454 BC. Aigai mint. AR Tetrobol (14.4 mm, 2.24 g.). Circa 476-460 AD. Horse stepping right. Rev. Male head to right, wearing crested Attic helmet; all within incuse square. SNG ANS 29. Raymond 85b. Wonderful old cabinet tone, about good very fine.



22 Macedon, kings. Amyntas III, 393-370/369 BC. AE (15.7 mm, 3.52 g.). Aigai or Pella mint. Head of Herakles with the Ilion's skin scalp to right. Rev. [A]MYNTA, Eagle standing right, devouring serpent held in its talons. SNG ANS 100-9; HGC 3, 831. Brown and black patina. Nearly good very fine.



23 Macedon, kings. Lysimachos, as Satrap, 323-305 BC. AR Tetrobol (13 mm, 2.50 g). In the name and types of Philip II of Macedon. Amphipolis mint. Struck under Kassander, circa 315-305 BC. Head of Apollo to right, wearing tainia. Rev. Φ I/ Λ I Π I Π OY, youth rider on horseback to right; below, Λ in circle. SNG ANS 583. An insignificant thin crack, otherwise, about good very fine.



Macedon. Philip II, 356-336 BC. AE (16.3 mm, 5.62 g.). Uncertain mint in Macedon. Head of Apollo to right, wearing tainia. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ, youth rider with petasos on horseback to right; club below. SNG ANS 902; SNG Alpha Bank 351-3. Dark green patina. Very fine.



25 Macedon. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (25.7 mm, 17.23 g.). Babylon mint. Struck under Stamenes or Archon, circa 324/3 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin headdress, paws tied before neck. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟ[Υ], Zeus Aëtophoros seated left on throne; holding long scepter in his left hand and eagle standing right with closed wings in his right; below throne, monogram above strut, M below; [trident in exergue]. Price 3656; Waggoner, Issue II. Nicely toned with a lovely yellowish highlights. Good very fine.



26 Macedon. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (32.6 mm, 16.70 g.). Uncertain eastern mint, ca. 200 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin headdress, paws tied before neck. Rev. A Λ E Ξ AN Δ POY, Zeus Aëtophoros seated left on throne; holding long scepter in his left hand and eagle standing right with closed wings in his right; in left field: Σ A Γ A; bull's head below throne. Countermark on obverse: Seleucid anchor within incuse rectangular. Price-. Some minor areas of flatness, otherwise, good very fine struck on a very broad flan with a particular style of the Herakles portrait. Rare.



Macedon. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (29.7 mm, 16.85 g.). Ephesos, circa 200-190 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion skin headdress, paws tied before neck. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus seated left on backless throne, right leg drawn back, feet on ground line, eagle in outstretched right hand, grounded scepter in left; bow case and monogram in left field. Price cf. 1886. About extremely fine. Extremely rare.

About good very fine.

ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus seated left on low throne, holding long scepter in his left hand and eagle standing right with closed wings in his right; to left, crescent above head of a lion; below throne: Π. Price 1812; Müller 338. Toned. Very fine.

BA Σ I Λ E Ω Σ - Λ Y Σ IMAXOY, Athena Nikephoros seated left, arm resting on shield, transverse spear in background; to inner left, monogram above crescent. Thompson 61 var.; Müller 392; HGC 3, 1750b; SNG BN 2545. Good very fine.



32 Macedon, kings. Antigonos III Doson, 229-221 BC. In the name and types of Antigonos II Gonatas. AR Fourée Tetradrachm (30 mm, 13.99 g.). Horned head of Pan to left, lagobolon over shoulder, on boss of a Macedonian shield. Rev. Athena Alkidemos standing to left, wielding thunderbolt and shield; BAΣIΛΕΩΣ to right, ANTIΓONOY to left, crested Macedonian helmet to inner left, monogram to inner right. TEA, Period III, Group 9, 50 (O10/R48); HGC 3.1, 1042. Silver plating over copper core. Entire silver surface very well preserved, only a minor spots of corrosion, as a fourée, about good very fine.



Macedon, kings. Antigonos II Gonatas, 277/6-239 BC. AE (15.8 mm, 3.94 g.). Head of Athena to right, wearing Corinthian helmet. Rev. Pan standing right, erecting trophy, monogram of AΓ; to left. HGC 3.1, 1049. SNG Alpha Bank 1016. Very fine. Countermark on Athenas helmet, attractive olive green glossy patina.



34 Macedon. Uranopolis, circa 300-290 BC. AE (15 mm, 3.55 g.) Star of eight rays, all within border of dots. Rev. OYPANIΔΩ-ΠΟΛΕΩΣ, Aphrodite Urania seated left on globe, holding sceptre. AMNG III, 2; SNG ANS 914-917. Lovely olive green patina. Very fine.



35 Paeonia. Damastion, circa 380-365/0 BC. AR Tetrobol (14.1 mm, 2.25 g.). Female head to left. Rev. Δ AMA Σ TI[Ω N], Ingot with a handle. SNG Ashmolean 3339. Good very fine. Rare!

36 Illyria. Apollonia, circa 150-80 BC. AR Drachm (19 mm, 3.33 g.). Xenokles and Chairenos, magistrates. $\Xi ENOK \Lambda H \Sigma$ above, cow standing left, suckling calf. Rev. A Π O Λ / XAI / PH / NO Σ around. Double stellate pattern within slightly curved double linear square. BMC 39; SNG Copenhagen 394; Ceka 91. Good very fine.

37 Illyria. Apollonia, circa 150-80 BC. AR Drachm (17.3 mm, 3.38 g.). A Γ IA Σ (Agias) and KA Δ O Σ (Kados), magistrates. A Γ IA Σ above, cow standing left, head reverted, suckling calf. Rev. E Π I KA- Δ OY around. Double stellate pattern within slightly curved double linear square. BMC 15-16; SNG Copenhagen 383; Ceka 3. Almost extremely fine, well centered.

38 Epeiros. Ambrakia, circa 426-404 BC. AR Stater (19.2 mm, 8.23 g). Pegasos flying left; A below. Rev. Helmeted head of Athena left; ivy branch behind; all within incuse square. Pegasi 45; HGC 3, 201. Good very fine.

39 Illyria. Dyrrhachion or Akarnania. Leukas?, circa 275-270 BC. AR Hemidrachm(?) (14.9 mm, 1.85 g). Head of Herakles right, wearing lion's skin. Rev. Pegasos flying right, below: ΛΕ. SNG Copenhagen 433–6. Obverse slightly off-center. Good very fine. The only similar example known very similar to the example sold by Numismatik Naumann (formerly Gitbud & Naumann)- Auction 101, lot 147, respectively Dorotheum, November 2015 Auction, lot 686. Although attributed to the city of Dyrrhachion, according to the type with the same iconography but with clearly different letters this example could have been minted in Leukas therefore a very rare specimen.



40 Akarnania. Alyzeia, circa 420-380 BC. AR Obol (11.9 mm, 0.71 g.). Bearded head of Herakles in lion skin headdress to left. Rev. ΔIO (counterclockwise) around kantharos. BCD Akarnania 410 var. (head of Herakles right, legend clockwise); HGC 4, 747 var. (same). Cf. Numisfitz 3 (3 December 2023), 198. Somewhat porous surface, otherwise, very fine. Very rare, the second recorded specimen!

41 Akarnania. Federal Coinage (Akarnanian Confederacy). Stratos, circa 420 BC. AR Hemidrachm (14.2 mm, 1.72 g). Horned and bearded head of the river god Achelöos to right; below, crescent downwards. Rev. F (retrograde) in a shallow incuse square. BCD Akarnania 3.1; Imhoof-Blumer, p. 145, 1; Babelon, Traité II, IV, p. 15, 7, pl. CCLXXI, 7; HGC 4, -. Typically worn. About very fine. Very rare!

Thessalos striding to left, naked but for chlamys over his shoulders, his petasos attached to a cord around his neck and flying in the air behind him, holding a band with both hands around the forehead of a bull leaping left. Rev. ΛΑΡΙ-Σ-ΑΙ, bridled horse with trailing rein prancing right; all within shallow incuse square. BCD Thessaly II 370.3; Cf. HGC 4, 420; Lorber, Thessalian, pl. 43, 60. Good very fine.

Lorber, "Thessalian Hoards and the Coinage of Larissa", AJN 20, 2008, pl. 46, 112; Lorber, SNR 79, 2000, phase L-III, 64-6; SNG Berry 541; BCD Thessaly II, 306; Boston 895. Slightly rough surface, otherwise, about good very fine. Rarer type and denomination.



Thessaly. Larissa, circa 356-342 BC. AR Drachm (17.5 mm, 6.19 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa facing three-quarters to left, wearing ampyx, turned slightly to right. Rev. ΛΑΡΙ, bridled horse with straight legs grazing to right. BCD Thessaly I, 1140; Lorber, Early, 41.2; cf. Nomos 4, 1140. Lightly toned. About extremely fine.



45 Thessaly. Larissa, circa 356-342 BC. AR Drachm (19.5 mm, 6.21 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa facing, turned slightly to left, wearing ampyx, pendant earrings, and necklace with central bead. Rev. ΛΑΡΙΣΑΙ, bridled horse grazing to left. Lorber 1992, 25.1; Lorber, Early; BCD Thessaly I, 1142 var. Good very fine. Rare variety!



46 Thessaly. Larissa, circa 356-342 BC. AR Obol (11 mm, 0.90 g.). Head of the nymph Larissa facing slightly left, hair in ampyx, wearing plain necklace. Rev. ΛΑΡΙΣ - ΑΙΩΝ, bridled horse grazing to right. BCD Thessaly II 328. Slight porosity on the surfaces, otherwise, very fine. Rare.



Thessaly. Gyrton, early - mid 4th century BC. AE Dichalkon (16.4 mm, 4.33 g.). Bare head of the hero Gyrton right; to right, head and neck of bridled horse right. Rev. ΓΥΡΤΩ[NIΩN]. Head of the nymph Gyrtone right. BCD Thessaly 1051; HGC 4, 369. Nice brown patina. Very fine.



48 Thessaly. Trikka, circa 440-400 BC. AR Hemidrachm (16.9 mm, 2.78 g). Hero, nude and with petasos and chlamys flying behind his back, running right and holding a band with both his hands passing around the head of a bull's forepart to right. All within border of dots. Rev. TPI-KK-AI- Ω N, Forepart of a horse to right; all within incuse square. HGC 4, 312. BMC Thessaly II 781. Good very fine.



49 Thessaly. Halos, 3rd century BC. AE (16.3 mm, 2.83 g.). Diademed head of Zeus to right. Rev. AΛΕΩ-N, Phrixos riding ram right; monogram AX to upper left. Reinders, Series 7; Rogers 242; BCD Thessaly II 86.2 (this coin); HGC 4, 8. Dark green patina. Good very fine.

50 Thessaly. Pharsalos, circa 424-404 BC. AR Drachm (18 mm, 5.99 g.), signed by the engraver Telephantos, with his initials on the obverse. Helmeted head of Athena right; small TH between crest and neck guard. Rev: Φ -A-P-[Σ], Thessalian cavalryman on horse prancing right, wearing petasos, chlamys and short chiton, holding a lagobolon over his right houlder. Lavva 100 c; BCD Thessaly II 639. Phocis, Phokian League, circa 357-354 BC. Federal coinage. AR Triobol (15 mm, 2.67 g.). Frontal bull's head. Rev. Laureate head of Apollo to right, behind, a lyre. BCD Phokis-Lokris 277; SNG Cop. 121-122. Old cabinet tone. Good very fine.



55 Boeotia. Thebes, ca. 395-338 BC. AR Stater (21.6 mm, 11.27 g.). Klees-, magistrate, struck 379-368 BC. Boeotian shield. Rev. Amphora, wreath above, $K\Lambda$ – $EE[\Sigma]$ across fields. Hepworth 67 (same rev. die); BCD Boiotia 506 (same rev. die). Unusually perfectly centered. Almost good very fine.



56 Islands off Attica. Aegina, circa 510-490 BC. AR Obol (9.2 mm, 0.70 g.). Sea turtle, head in profile. Rev. Incuse square with 'Union Jack' pattern. Wartenberg, 'A Hoard of Archaic Obols of Aegina (Coin Hoards VIII.20),' Aleksanderia (2021), Obol Group IV, 30. Irregular flan. About good very fine. Rare.



57 Euboea. Chalkis, circa 338-308 BC. AR Drachm (17.1 mm, 3.65 g.). Head of the nymph Chalkis to right, wearing single-pendant earring, and necklace. Rev. XAΛ above, eagle with spread wings, grappling with serpent; caduceus to right. SNG Cop. 438; Picard Emission 3; BCD Euboia 124. Nicely toned. Good very fine.



Euboea. Histiaia, circa 350-300 BC. AR Drachm (16 mm, 3.23 g.). Wreathed head of the nymph Histiaia to right. Rev. IΣTI, bull standing right before grape vine, to right, monogram AΓ. BCD Euboia 375; SNG Cop. 516. Some porosity. Very fine.



59 Euboea. Histiaia, ca. 181-141 BC. AR Tetrobol (12 mm, 1.61 g.). Wreathed head of the nymph Histiaia to right. Rev. [IΣΤΙ]–AIΕ Ω N, Nymph seated right on stern of galley; symbol wing on prow left. HGC 4, 1525. Good very fine.
