Celts in Eastern Europe. Imitation of late Thasos type, 2nd – 1st century BC. AR Tetradrachm (31.8 mm, 17.07 g.). Celticized head of Dionysos to right, wearing wreath of ivy and fruit. Rev. Stylised Herakles standing front, head to left, holding club in his right hand and lion skin in his left; around, imitative pointless legend. Göbl, OTA, pl. 47, Klass III/A; Lanz 979. Toned. Extremely fine.



4 Calabria. Tarentum, circa 275-240 BC. AR Nomos or Didrachm (18.5 mm, 6.57 g.). Aristokles, magistrate. Nude warrior on horse prancing to right, holding reins, shield and two spears in left hand and striking with spear in right; ΔI to left, APIΣΤΟ-ΚΛ-ΗΣ in two lines below. Rev. Taras astride dolphin to left, holding kantharos and trident; to right, head of nymph to left, TAPA[Σ] below. Vlasto 877-81; HN Italy 1033. Lightly toned. Good very fine.



Lucania. Metapontion, circa 400-340 BC. AR Nomos or Didrachm (20.5 mm, 7.33 g.). Head of Demeter to right, her hair bound in a sakkos. Rev. META, Barley ear with leaf to left; above leaf. HN Italy 1538; Noe 511. About good very fine.



Lucania. Metapontion, circa 350-275 BC. AR Diobol (12 mm, 1.21 g.). Head of Athena right, wearing Corinthian helmet. Rev. META, Ear of barley; in right field, cornucopiae. SNG ANS 531; HN Italy 1596 corr. Extremely fine with a wonderful toning.



7 Lucania. Sybaris, circa 550-510 BC. AR Hemiobol (10.7 mm, 0.33 g). Bull standing left on dotted ground line, his head turned back to right; in exergue, VM; all within border of dots. Rev. Lightly toned. Very fine. Rare!

ISTPIH, sea eagle standing left on dolphin, below, monogram of A Π . AMNG I, 417; HGC 3.2, 1807; SNG BM Black Sea 258; Dima Group IV, Subgroup IV, 1. Iridescent toning. Good very fine.



9 Moesia. Istros, circa 313-280 BC. AR Drachm (18.9 mm, 6.16 g.). Two facing male heads side by side, one upright and the other inverted. Rev. I Σ TPIH, sea eagle standing left on dolphin. HGC 3.2, 1802; Dima Group IV, Subgroup IV, 4. Nicely toned. Good very fine.

HGC 3.2, 1697 (head to right); Topalov 94 (same); Peykov B0460. Nicely toned, good very fine. This early issue appears to be very rare (only three specimens on Coinarchives)! This is even rarer variety with an abbreviated name.

About extremely fine with an excellent grade of the metal. Of the finest style.



Thrace. Abdera, circa 500-475 BC. AR Obol (8.4 mm, 0.57 g.). Griffin seated left, raising forepaw. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. May, Abdera, Period II, 57-59; HGC 3.2, 1153. Unevenly toned. Granular surfaces. Very fine.



22 Islands off Ionia, Chios, circa 490-435 BC. AR Stater (14.2 mm, 7.07 g.) Sphynx seated to left; in left field, amphora. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Mavrogordato 16; SNG Kayhan 617; Baldwin, Chios, pl. I, 24. Large test-cut on obverse. Some deposits. Toned. Very fine.



23 Thrace. Thasos, circa 500-478 BC. AR Stater (19.3 mm, 9.00 g.). Nude, ithyphallic satyr, with long beard and long hair, moving right in 'running-kneeling' position, holding a nymph in his arms, who raises her right hand in protest. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 6, 331; SNG Copenhagen 1009. Roughness on the surface, otherwise, Very fine.

Lightly toned. Very fine. Scarce type!



Macedon, kings. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (25.2 mm, 17.15 g.). Pella mint ?, lifetime-early posthumous issue, ca. 325-315 BC. Head of Heracles right, wearing lion skin headdress, paws tied before neck. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus Aëtophoros seated left on backless throne, holding an eagle in his extended right hand and long scepter in his left; in left field, grasshopper. Apparently unpublished in the standart literature, the single known example was from: Numismatik Naumann (formerly Gitbud & Naumann), Auction 80, lot 86. Of a fine style with a lovely yellowish hues from the minting. Good very fine. Very Rare and undoubtedly the best known.



Macedon, kings. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (31.4 mm, 16.74 g.). Miletos mint, ca. 210-190 BC. Head of Heracles right, wearing lion skin headdress, paws tied before neck. Rev. An exquisite style wonderful portrait of Heracles of extreme beauty and very proportionally engraved body of Zeus.
