Flavius Eugenius was a Roman usurper who briefly ruled as emperor in the Western Roman Empire. He was a teacher of rhetoric and grammar before becoming involved in politics. Eugenius was elevated to the position of emperor in 392 AD by Arbogast, a powerful Frankish general who had effectively controlled the Western Roman Empire after the death of Emperor Valentinian II. Eugenius's reign was marked by his attempts to restore pagan practices and reverse the Christianization of the empire, which had been advancing under previous Christian emperors. This brought him into conflict with the Eastern Roman Emperor Theodosius I, who was a devout Christian. In January 393, Theodosius promoted his eight-year-old son Honorius to the rank of Augustus of the West, indicating he considered Eugenius' elevation illegitimate. Following the news of Honorius' elevation to Augustus, Eugenius and Arbogast marched their army, stripped from the Rhine frontier, into Italy in the spring of 393. Theodosius then moved from Constantinople with his army, and met Eugenius and Arbogast at the Battle of the Frigidus in the Vipava Valley, on 6 September 394. The bloody battle lasted two days, and was marked by unusually strong winds, and ended with a victory for Theodosius' forces. Eugenius was captured and executed, and his head was displayed in Theodosius' camp. Arbogast committed suicide the next day. His defeat marked the end of significant pagan resistance to Christianity in the Roman Empire and solidified Theodosius's control over both the Eastern and Western Roman Empires, albeit briefly, as the empire was permanently divided after his death in 395 AD.

Alas, there was little concord between Paula and Elagabalus once the wedding was over and the marriage started. Their marriage was short-lived, as Elagabalus divorced her in 220 AD. Julia Paula was one of the few Roman empresses who voluntarily left imperial life rather than being executed or exiled.

However, at that time, an outbreak of the Bubonic Plague ravaged the army, causing numerous deaths and severely weakening the Roman forces. Following this weakening, Valerian suffered a crushing defeat against Shapur I at the Battle of Edessa. After the battle, Valerian was captured by Shapur I and subjected to immense humiliation—he was allegedly used as a human footstool when Shapur mounted his horse. Additionally, Shapur commissioned a relief depicting Valerian kneeling before him.

Aulus Vitellius Germanicus (24 September 15 - 20 December 69 AD.) was Roman emperor for eight months, from 19 April to 20 December AD 69. Vitellius became emperor following the quick succession of the previous emperors Galba and Otho, in a year of civil war known as the Year of the Four Emperors. Vitellius added the honorific Germanicus to his name instead of Caesar upon his accession. Like his predecessor, Otho, Vitellius attempted to rally public support to his cause by honoring and imitating Nero who remained popular in the empire. He is known as a gluttonous and obese person, free from intrigue and ambition, lazy, at peace with himself, and fond of eating and drinking, indulging in four feasts a day. Sources state that a single feast included 2,000 fish and 4,000 birds, and that his favorite dishes were crane liver, pheasant brain, and flamingo tongue. It is also mentioned that he sent the Roman Navy to obtain rare ingredients. It is said that his own mother died of starvation. Suetonius; Cassius Dio's account is that Vitellius was beheaded and his head paraded around Rome, and his wife attended to his burial. His brother and son were also killed.

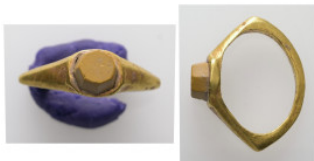

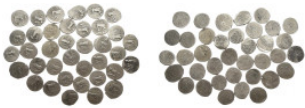
