5 Kimmerian Bosporos. Pantikapaion, ca. 310-304/3 BC. AE (20.4 mm, 6.99 g). Head of bearded Pan to right. Rev. Π – A – N, forepart of griffin left, sturgeon left below. MacDonald 69; Anokhin 1023; SNG BM Black Sea 869-871. Brown-reddish patina. Nearly good very fine. Dramatic and dynamic portrait of Pan rendered in high style.

Nicely toned. Good very fine. Rarer variety with additional letter A!

Quadripartite incuse square with alternating raised and sunken quarters; AΓ monogram and grain ear in opposite sunken quarters. McClean 4089; HGC 3.2, 1437. Lightly toned. Good very fine.

11 Thrace. Abdera, circa 375-365 BC. AR Tetrobol (14.7 mm, 2.57 g.). Hipponaktos, magistrate. Griffin springing to left, ABΔH–[PITEΩN]. Rev. [ΕΠΙ ΙΠ-ΠΩ]NA-ΚΤΟΣ, laureate head of Apollo to right within a linear square. May, Abdera Group CXXXV, 544. Good very fine with an excellent grade of the metal and surfaces. Of the finest style.

Nude, ithyphallic satyr, with long beard and long hair, moving right in 'running-kneeling' position, holding a nymph in his arms, who raises her right hand in protest. Rev. 14 Thraco-Macedonian Region. Berge (previously Lete or Siris). Circa 525-480 BC. AR Trihemiobol or 1/8 Stater (13 mm, 0,89 g.). Satyr crouching to right; in fields, pellets. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square divided diagonally. HGC 3, 536. Peykov A0110. Smith Group 7. Svoronos, HPM p. 82, 19, pl. VIII, 12; SNG ANS 973 (as 'Lete'). The tiny edge behind the head of the satyr skillfully restored and rounded, the main image of the well centered satyr is impressively defined with an attractive archaic style.Good very fine with a wonderful toning. Rare.



Thrace. Thasos, circa 500-480 BC. AR Obol (8.1 mm, 0.43 g.). Two dolphins swimming in opposite directions, pellets around. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 9; HGC 6, 337; BMC 18-22. Lightly toned. Very fine.



16 Thrace. Thasos, circa 412-404 BC. AR Tritartemorion (8.5 mm, 0.39 g). Head of a bold and bearded satyr to right. Rev. Θ – A – Σ – I around, two dolphins within shallow incuse square. Le Rider, Thasiennes 12; HGC 6, 340. Porous. Lightly toned.



17 Thrace. Thasos, circa 100-75 BC. AR Tetradrachm (30.5 mm, 16.78 g). "Imitative" series. Wreathed head of young Dionysos to right. Rev. HPAKΛΕΟVΣ / $\Sigma\Omega$ THPOΣ / ΘΑΣΙ Ω N, Herakles standing facing, head left, holding club, lion skin draped over left arm; monogram MH to inner left. Le Rider, Thasos, 51; Prokopov, Silberprägung, Group XIX; HGC 6, 359. Some deposits. Good very fine.



18 Thrace. Thasos, circa 168-100 BC. AR Tetradrachm (34.4 mm, 16.58 g). Wreathed head of young Dionysos to right. Rev. [HPAKΛΕΟVΣ] / $\Sigma\Omega$ THPOΣ / ΘΑΣΙΩΝ, Herakles standing facing, head left, holding club, lion skin draped over left arm; monogram M to inner left. Le Rider, Thasos, 51; SNG Copenhagen 1039; HGC 6, 359. Some areas of flatness on the reverse, otherwise very fine. With a particulary fine late Hellenistic style.



Macedon. Eion, circa 480-460 BC. AR Trihemiobol (10.5 mm, 0.87 g.). Goose standing to right, head turned back to left. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. HGC 3.1, 521; SNG ANS 271-272. Very fine.



20 Thraco-Macedonian Tribes. The Mygdones or Krestones, circa 480-470 BC. AR Diobol or 1/8 Stater (11.9 mm, 1.00 g). Goat kneeling right, head turned back to left, around two pellets; below short horizontal line. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Rosen 89; SNG ANS 60 ("Akanthos"); HGC 3.1, 368 ("Aigai"); Lorber, Goats, Issue 15. Very fine.



Macedon. Argilos. Circa 470-460 BC. AR Hemiobol (7.5 mm, 0.25 g). Forepart of Pegasos flying to right; border of dots. Rev. Quadripartite incuse square. Liampi 112-114; SNG ANS 763 ("Thermai"); HGC 3.1, 481. Very fine.



22 Macedon, kings. Philip II, 356-336 BC. AR Tetradrachm (23.9 mm, 14.01 g.). Pella mint, circa 336-328 BC. Laureate head of Zeus to right. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠ - ΠΟΥ, youth on horseback right, holding reins and long palm branch; grape bunch on vine below. Le Rider 421a; SNG ANS 425; HCG 3.1, 863. Test-cut on reverse. Very fine.



Macedon, kings. Philip II of Macedon, 356-336 BC. Uncertain mint in Macedonia. AE (15.9 mm, 6.01 g.). Diademed head of Apollo to right. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΟΥ, Youth on horseback to right, monogram AN below. SNG ANS 894; HGC 3.1, 882. Natural green patina. Good very fine. Fine classical portrait of young Apollo became emblematic for the bronze coinage of Philip II.



Macedon. Philippi, circa 356-345 BC. AE (17 mm, 6.00 g.). Head of Herakles to right, wearing lion's skin headdress. Rev. ΦΙΛΙΠΠΩΝ downwards to right, tripod. Bellinger, Philippi, Group II; SNG ANS 668-9; HGC 3, 633. Dark green patina. Very fine. Rarer variety with head to right.



25 Macedon. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (25.6 mm, 17.22 g.). Posthumous issue, Arados mint, under Ptolemy I Soter, 305-282 BC. Head of Herakles right, wearing lion's skin headdress. Rev. ΑΛΕΞΑΝΔΡΟΥ, Zeus Aëtophoros seated left on backless throne, holding eagle and sceptre; AP monogram in left field. Price 3426 ('Byblos'). Lightly toned. Good very fine.



Macedon. Alexander III 'the Great', 336-323 BC. AR Tetradrachm (23.6 mm, 17.16 g.). Posthumous issue, Babylon mint, struck under Stamenes or Archon, circa 325/4 BC.
